LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995

CITY OF GOSNELLS

REPEAL OF OUTDATED LOCAL LAWS LAW (No. 2) 2000

PREAMBLE

Pursuant to the powers conferred on it by the Local Government Act 1995 and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the City of Gosnells hereby records having resolved on 13 February 2001 to make the following Local Law.

PART 1—INTRODUCTORY MATTERS

Title

1.1. This law may be cited as the City of Gosnells Repeal of Local Laws Law (No. 2) 2000.

Commencement

1.2 This Local Law comes into operation on the 14th day after the day on which it is published in the *Gazette*.

Content and intent

1.3 (1) This local law—

- (a) provides for the repeal of outdated local laws;
- (b) identifies the outdated local laws by giving their names and the date they were first printed in the *Gazette*;

(2) This local law is intended to result in—

- (a) more efficient and effective local government by removing outdated local laws from the public record.

PART 2—SUBSTANCE OF THIS LAW

2.1 Repeal

The following local laws are hereby repealed—

- (1) Relating to Albany Highway Building Line published in the *Government Gazette* on 21 May 1954.
- (2) Relating to Mills Road Building Line published in the *Government Gazette* on 28 January 1960.
- (3) Relating to Fremantle Road Building Line published in the *Government Gazette* on 7 November 1980.
- (4) Relating to Parking of Commercial Vehicles on Street Verges published in the *Government Gazette* on 7 September 1971 and subsequent amendment dated 21 January 1977.
- (5) Relating to Pest Plants published in the *Government Gazette* on 5 February 1988 and subsequent amendment dated 6 August 1993.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995

TOWN OF VINCENT

LOCAL LAW RELATING TO DISPLAY OF ITEMS ON A FOOTPATH

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the above mentioned Act, and all other powers enabling it, the Local Government of the Town of Vincent hereby records having resolved on the 13th day of February 2001 to amend Local Law Relating to Display of Items on a Footpath as gazetted on 14 June 2000 by—

- (1) deleting the words “affixed to the sign or display frame” and replacing them with the word “displayed” in clause 4(a).
- (2) deleting the whole of clause 7 and replacing it with the following new clause 7—
 “A person who fails or refuses to prominently display the approved registration number, commits an offence.”
- (3) adding the words “or accurate sketch” immediately after the word “plan” in clause 13(a)(i).
- (4) deleting the words “within 30 metres” and replacing them with the words “approximately 10 metres” in clause 13(a)(ii).
- (5) deleting the words “on a scale of 1:500” and replacing them with the words “on an approximate scale of 1:500” in clause 13(a)(ii).
- (6) deleting the words “or photographs” and replacing them with the words “or accurate sketch” in clause 13(a)(iii).
- (7) deleting the existing Third Schedule and replacing it with the following new Schedule—

- (a) I am the proprietor of the Shop/Business Premises described in Item 1 above;
- (b) the display referred to in Item 3 above complies with the requirements of the Local Law Relating to and the Council Policy on the Display of Items on a Footpath;
- (c) the display referred to in Item 3 above will be maintained for the whole period of the licence, in a safe condition in accordance with the provisions of the Local Law Relating to and the Council Policy on such displays;
- (d) a public liability insurance policy, to the value of \$5,000,000 will be maintained throughout the whole of the period for which the licence has been granted;
- (e) a minimum distance of 1.5 metres will be maintained at all times between the outer edge of the display and the edge of the adjacent carriageway; and
- (f) I will ensure that the display is removed to allow for the footpath to be swept or any other authorised work to be carried out.

The following are attached—

- (a) A plan or accurate sketch of the proposed area, showing—
 - (i) the exact location and dimensions of the display;
 - (ii) the location of any street furniture, be-tidy bins, light poles, parking restriction signs, traffic lights or any other impediment to pedestrian traffic;
- (b) A plan and specification of the proposed area and the area incorporated within approximately 10 metres on either side of boundaries of the premises referred to in Item 1 above, on an approximate scale of 1:500, showing the location of all carriageways, footpaths, public facilities, public places, streets and street alignments; and
- (c) A colour photograph or accurate sketch of the signs or display structures intended to be in the proposed area.

Adequate Public Liability insurance arrangements are required for the display area to the value of \$5,000,000 (\$5 Million). Any licence issued under the Town of Vincent Local Law Relating to Display of Items on a Footpath will be conditional upon the licensee having an acceptable public indemnity policy with an Underwriter acceptable to the Council for the whole of the period of this licence. Proof of insurance arrangements will be required to be presented to the Town for the issue of a licence

The annual fees will be decided annually and will be advertised by the Council from time to time.

HEALTH ACT 1911

SHIRE OF QUAIRADING HEALTH LOCAL LAWS 2000

Made by the Council of the Shire of Quairading under section 342 of the *Health Act 1911* in accordance with subdivision 2 of Division 2 of Part 3 of the *Local Government Act 1995*.

Citation

1. These Local Laws may be cited as the "*Shire of Quairading Health Local Laws 2000*".

Incorporation by Reference

- 2. (i) In these Local Laws, "*The Shire of Leonora Health Local Laws 1999*";
 - (a) means *The Shire of Leonora Health Local Laws 1999* published in the *Government Gazette*, special edition number 56, on the 9 April 1999; and
 - (b) does not include any amendments that might be made to those Local Laws
- (ii) Subject to the modifications set out in the Schedule, *The Shire of Leonora Health Local Laws 1999* are incorporated with and form part of these Local Laws.

Repeal

- 3. (1) The Health Local Laws adopted by the Shire of Quairading and published in the *Government Gazette* on 13 April 1933 and amended from time to time, are repealed;
- (2) The Health Local Laws adopted by the Shire of Quairading on 11 May 1954 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 24 September 1954 and amended from time to time, are repealed;
- (3) The Health Local Laws adopted by the Shire of Quairading on 11 October 1956 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 8 March 1957 and amended from time to time, are repealed; and
- (4) The Health Local Laws adopted by the Shire of Quairading on 9 June 1966 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 22 July 1966 and amended from time to time, are repealed.

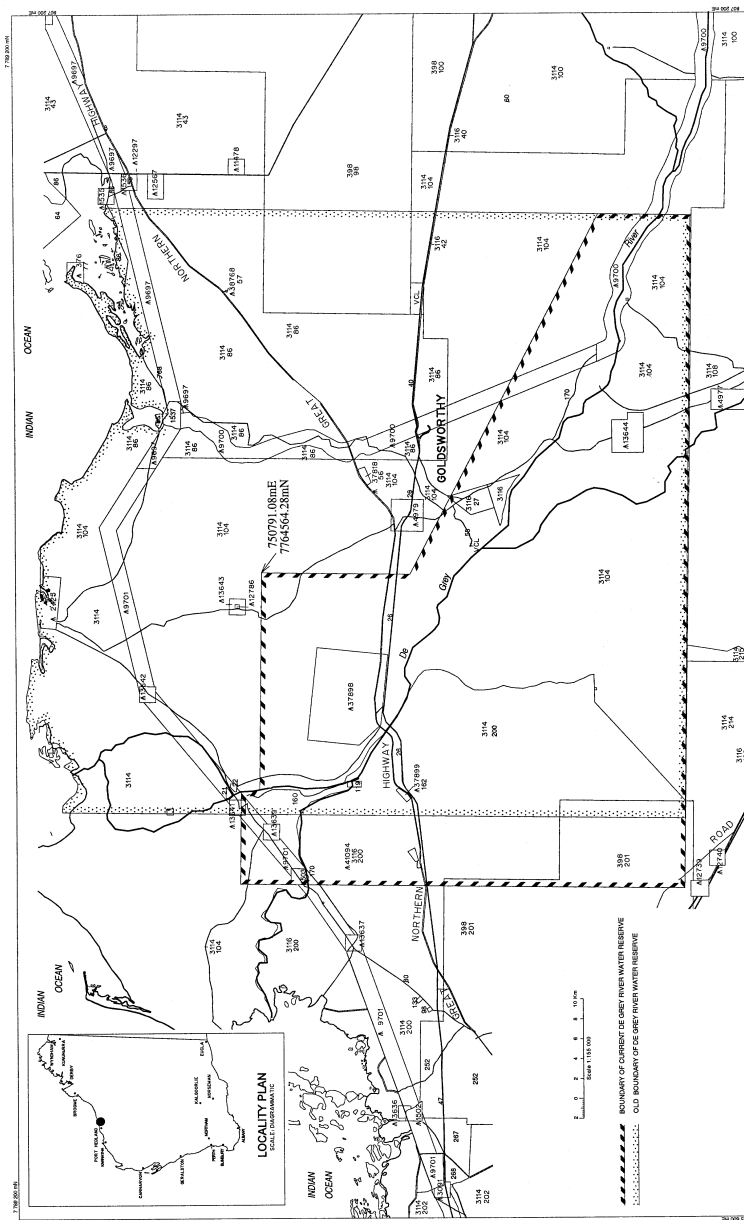

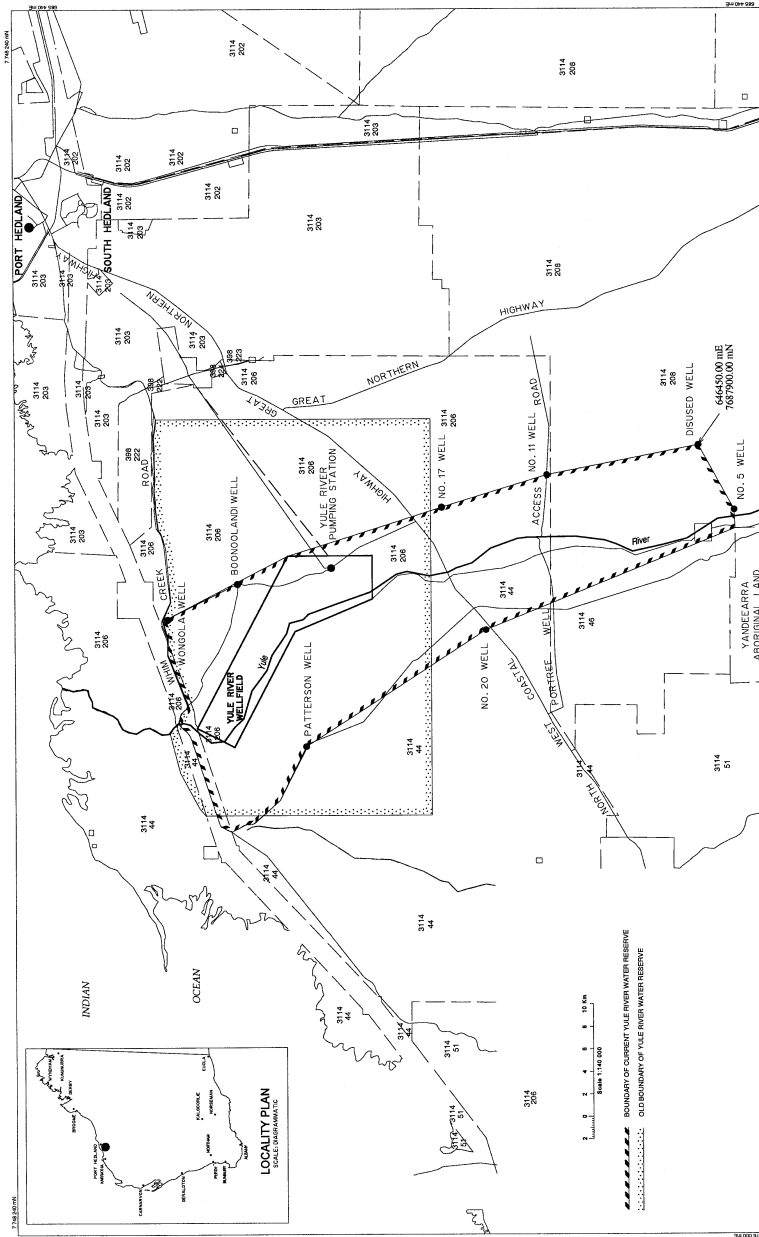

DR GEORGE KUBACZ DOB: 4/3/1934

By Order of the Medical Board of Western Australia.
