Plant Diseases Amendment Regulations (No. 4) 2001

Made by the Lieutenant-Governor and deputy of the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Plant Diseases Amendment Regulations (No. 4) 2001*.

2. Schedule 1 amended

Schedule 1 to the *Plant Diseases Regulations 1989** is amended in Part B, item 4B, paragraph (b) by deleting subparagraph (i) and inserting the following subparagraph instead —

(i) having been sprayed after harvest with 400 mg/L of fenthion at a rate of 0.6 L/m² per minute for at least 10 seconds, after the fruit has been completely wetted;

Liquor Licensing Act 1988

Liquor Licensing Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2001

Made by the Lieutenant-Governor and deputy of the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Liquor Licensing Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2001*.

2. Regulation 9A amended and transitional

- (1) Regulation 9A(1)(h) of the *Liquor Licensing Regulations 1989** is amended by deleting subparagraph (i) and "or" after it and inserting instead
 - (i) an attraction for tourists; or
- (2) Regulation 9A(2) of the *Liquor Licensing Regulations 1989** is amended as follows:
 - (a) by deleting the full stop at the end of the subregulation and substituting a semicolon;
 - (b) by inserting after the definition of "specified" the following definition —

"tourist" means a person who is —

- (a) staying at a place that is at least40 kilometres from his or her usual place of residence for a period of at least one night;
- (b) intending to stay away from his or her usual place of residence for a period of less than 12 months:
- (c) not in the course of travelling on a regular journey between his or her usual place of residence and his or her place of work or education; and
- (d) travelling in the course of a holiday or for leisure, business, to visit friends or relatives or for any other reason.

".

- (3) Subject to subregulation (4), the *Liquor Licensing*Regulations 1989 as amended by this regulation apply to and in respect of any application for a special facility licence
 - (a) made, but not finally determined, before the coming into operation of this regulation; or
 - (b) made on or after the coming into operation of this regulation.
- (4) Nothing in these regulations affects
 - (a) an application for review under section 25 of a decision in respect of a special facility licence; or
 - (b) an appeal under section 28 in respect of a special facility licence.

RULES OF HARNESS RACING 1999

Notice of Amendment

Notice is hereby given that the Committee of the Western Australian Trotting Association at Gloucester Park, East Perth, on the 21st June 2001 resolved by majority of members of the Committee that the Rules of Harness Racing 1999 be amended as follows—

- 1. Rule 90(5) be amended by replacing the existing Rule 90(5) with—
 - (5) A licence may be suspended or cancelled—
 - (a) by the Controlling Body or by the Stewards for breach of a term or condition of the licence; or
 - (b) by the Controlling Body where the Controlling Body is satisfied that the person holding the licence is not a fit and proper person to be associated with harness racing
- 2. Amend Rule 168 by inserting "incompetent," after "reckless,"—
 - 168. Careless driving-
 - (1) A person shall not before, during or after a race drive in a manner which in the opinion of the stewards is careless, reckless, incompetent, intimidatory, foul or likely to endanger persons or horses.
 - (2) A person who fails to comply with sub rule (1) is guilty of an offence.
- 3. Repeal Rule 169
- 4. Repeal Local Rule 285(9)

AQWEST BUNBURY WATER BOARD

Memorandum of Imposing Rates

At the Special Meeting of the Bunbury Water Board held on 13 June 2001, it was resolved that the Rates and Charges specified hereunder should be imposed on all rateable properties within the District of the Bunbury Water Board in accordance with the Water Board's Act 1904 for the financial year 1 July 2001 to 30 June 2002.

Rates/Consumption Schedule of Charges—

- (a) An annual Supply Fee of \$82.00 will apply to all residential properties.
- (b) 3.05 cents in the dollar to be levied on the G R V of all commercial category properties.
- (c) 2.40 cents in the dollar to be levied on the G R V of all industrial category properties.
- (d) 3.20 cents in the dollar to be levied on the G R V of all rural category properties.
- (e) 3.00 cents in the dollar to be levied on the GRV of all public facility category properties.
- (f) 5.20 cents in the dollar levied on the G R V of all residential category vacant land.
- (g) The charge for non rateable properties under Section 57 of the Water Board's Act to be \$309.00 per annum.
- (h) The charge (per kl) for water consumed at residential zoned properties to be-

- (i) Registered pensioners to receive 50% rebate of the total amount of water rates payable and 50% rebate of the amount payable for water consumption up to 350 kl.
- (j) Registered Seniors who also hold the Commonwealth Seniors Health card to receive 50% rates rebate and 50% rebate of the amount payable for water consumption up to 150kl.
- (k) Registered seniors to receive 25% rates rebate and 50% rebate of the amount payable for water consumption up to 150 kl.
- (l) A rebate of 1 kl to be allowed for 67 cents of rates paid on non-residential category properties and the excess water to be at the rate of 67 cents per kl.
