### LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995

#### *SHIRE OF BUSSELTON*

#### BUSSELTON CEMETERIES LOCAL LAW 1994

Under the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1986* and all other powers the Council of the Shire of Busselton resolved on 8 August, 2001 (C018/390) to amend the Busselton Cemeteries Local Law by repealing the current clause 39 and replacing it with a new clause 39 as follows—

“39. Vaults and Mausoleums

- (i) a person other than the Council shall not construct a brick grave, crypt, vault or mausoleum within a Cemetery;
- (ii) the Council may, upon receipt of an application in writing by any person and upon payment of the set fee, construct a vault or mausoleum within a Cemetery which vault or mausoleum shall at all times remain the property of the Board;
- (iii) a mausoleum must be—
  - (a) constructed of brick, stone, concrete or similar durable material, and
  - (b) adequately ventilated and drained; and
  - (c) vermin proof; and
  - (d) capable of being secured against entry by vandals or other unauthorised persons.
- (iv) a person shall not place a dead body in a mausoleum except—
  - (a) in a closed coffin; and
  - (b) in a soundly constructed chamber; and
  - (c) in accordance with sub clause (v)
- (v) the number of burials in a chamber must not exceed the number for which the changer was designed;
- (vi) the Council shall ensure that as soon as possible after a dead body is placed in a mausoleum, the front of the chamber is sealed with a slab of impervious material and faced with a substantial stone, slate or other material approved by the Council.”

**Division 3: Variations**

The standard specified in Division 2 is varied by deleting Clauses 1,2,4,7 and 10.

**Division 4: Antique and Collectable Cots**

The supply of antique and collectable cots which do not comply with the mandatory standard is permitted subject to the following—

- (i) the cot is accompanied by a certificate from the supplier to the consumer stating that it is safe to place a child in the antique or collectable cot; and
- (ii) two clearly visible warning statements (one external, one internal) must be permanently attached to the cot by means of gluing and mechanical fixing (nails or screws) of a metal plaque displayed on the upper half of the side or end of the cot. The lettering must be in sharp contrast with the background and contain the following warning, with upper case letters no less than 5 mm in height and lower case letters no less than 2.5 mm in height—

**“WARNING: this cot does not meet the mandatory safety standard.**

**For display purposes only. It is dangerous to place a child in this cot.”**

(Upper case lettering and underlining must appear as shown.)

**NOTICE TO ALL OWNERS AND/OR OCCUPIERS OF LAND IN THE SHIRE OF DENMARK  
FIREBREAKS AND CLEARING OF FLAMMABLE MATERIAL  
TO BE IN PLACE BY 1ST DECEMBER 2001**

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 1st December 2001 to and including the 22nd May 2002 to have a firebreak, clear of flammable material to comply with.

**Please Note**

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not more than \$1,000 and a person in default is also liable whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice, if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice you may apply to Council or its duly authorised officer no later than the 15th November 2001, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. If permission is not granted by Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

**Fire Fighting Equipment**

Council encourages landowner/occupiers of land greater than 2 hectares in area to have on that land or immediate access to an engine powered pumping unit and a tank with not less than 200 litres of water. It is anticipated that permits to burn during the restricted burning period will require such a unit on site.

## 1. GENERAL

### (a) Building Protection Zone—definition

*Building protection zones vary in size depending on slope. Zones must be a minimum of 20 metres wide on flat land. The width of the zone must be increased by 10 metres for every 10 degrees of increase in slope.*

The building protection zone is a low fuel area immediately surrounding a building. It must fulfil the following conditions—

- Bush fire fuels must be maintained below 10cm in height.
- Trees and branches which may fall onto a house must be removed.
- Lower branches of the remaining trees must be trimmed.

Features such as driveways, vegetable patches, lawn, or landscaped gardens (including deciduous trees) may form part of building protection zones. Isolated shrubs and trees may be retained within building protection zones.

### (b) *Building Protection zones must be established surrounding all buildings erected within the Shire of Denmark. Please refer to the Development Provisions relative to your property, or if still unsure, contact Council's Planning Department or Ranger/Fire Control Officer for further information.*

## 2. URBAN LAND (LAND THAT IS ZONED RESIDENTIAL)

- (a) On land which is 0.25ha or less, remove flammable material from the whole of the land.
- (b) On land which exceeds 0.25ha, establish Building Protection Zones (Refer Section 1a) around all buildings situated on the land, parkland clear the remainder of the property having grass or natural vegetation maintained to a height of not more than 100mm.
- (c) On Weedon Hill all land is required to be parkland cleared having grass or natural vegetation maintained to a height of not more than 100mm and establish Building Protection Zone (Refer Section 1a) immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

*No dry materials should be left on the property. Branches of trees must be removed so they do not overhang the roofs of buildings.*

NB: For the purpose of this notice, flammable material does not include live standing trees, cultivated plants or a maintained garden. However, all cut material should be removed from the land, so that a greater hazard is not created.

## 3. SPECIAL RESIDENTIAL/RURAL & TOURIST ZONED LAND

- (a) Open pasture/grassed areas must be maintained to a height of not more than 100mm. Maintenance may include slashing, or where permitted by the Development Provisions relative to your property, grazing by stock.
- (b) Grazing may require the fencing of all native/remnant vegetation such as "Tree Preservation" and "Tree Planting Areas" as identified on the estate's Subdivision Guide Plan. (For queries please refer to Council's Planning Department.)

## 4. RURAL LAND

On open pasture where animal grazing does not occur, areas of high grass fuel levels must be slashed to a height of 100mm and to the satisfaction of the local Fire Control Officer.

## 6. HOMESTEADS, BUILDINGS, HAYSTACKS, BULK FUEL, DRUMS AND LIQUID PETROLEUM

From the 1st of December 2001, to and including the 22nd May 2002, you shall install a 4 metre firebreak clear of flammable material around the whole of any or all the above items.

- (a) All private access tracks to be 6 metres wide with a 4 metre trafficable surface and 4 metre vertical clearance to allow entry and exit of a heavy duty fire unit.
- (b) Sufficient room to be provided to turn a heavy duty fire unit at the end of all access tracks; i.e. a cul-de-sac or ring road to be provided.

## 7. STRATEGIC FIRE ACCESS TRACKS

- (a) Strategic Fire Access Tracks apply to all land, and appropriate subdivisions.
- (b) All Strategic Fire Access Tracks are to be a minimum of 6 metres wide with a 4 metre trafficable surface and 4 metre vertical clearance. Variations may only be carried out where approved by the Shire/local Bush Fire Control Officer.
- (c) Where a Strategic Fire Access Track is located on your property you will be required to install and maintain it to the satisfaction of your Local Bush Fire Brigade by the 1st December 2001, to the 22nd May 2002.

NB: Contact your Local Bush Fire Brigade or Shire for locations of Strategic Fire Access Tracks.

## 8. HARD WOOD/SOFT WOOD PLANTATIONS LESS THAN 3 HA

- (a) A 6 metres wide firebreak with a 4 metre trafficable surface and 4 metre vertical clearance shall be provided around all boundaries of the plantations.
- (b) Where Western Power lines pass over plantation areas, the firebreak must be in accordance with Western Power specifications. (Refer Western Power).

## 9. FIRE PROTECTION OF HARDWOOD/SOFTWOOD PLANTATIONS GREATER THAN 3HA

### (a) Minimum Firebreak Standards

- (i) Boundary Breaks—15 metre firebreak with a 5 metre trafficable surface and 5 metre vertical clearance constructed on all boundaries of plantations, and where plantations adjoin public roads or on such alternative locations as may be agreed between the Shire and the plantation owner.
- (ii) Compartment Breaks  
A 10 metre wide firebreak with a 4 metre trafficable surface and 4 metre vertical clearance constructed between compartments greater than 30ha.  
A 6 metre wide firebreak with a 4 metre trafficable surface and 4 metre vertical clearance should surround compartments 30 hectares or less.
- (iii) Sign Posting  
Sign posting must be established to indicate—
  - Compartment Boundaries, Water Supplies, Emergency access/egress, Structures
  - Significant features (creek crossing, dead ends, etc).
- (iv) Where Western Power lines pass over plantation areas, firebreaks must be in accordance with Western Power specifications.
- (v) Where the plantation owner is a member of the Plantation Fire Advisory Agreement and contributes toward the provision of Brigade fire fighting equipment, an exemption will be granted for fire units within their plantations. If not a member of Plantation Fire Advisory Agreement, the plantation owner must comply with the minimum plantation fire guidelines. (Refer to Plantation Fire Manual.)

### THE FOLLOWING IS TO BE READ IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE FIREBREAK ORDER

NO fires to be lit during the prohibited burning period from the 1st January 2002, to the 28th February 2002.

NO fires may be lit during the restricted burning periods from 19th November 2001, to 31 December 2001, and the 1st March 2002, to 12th April 2002, without first obtaining a permit from a Fire Control Officer.

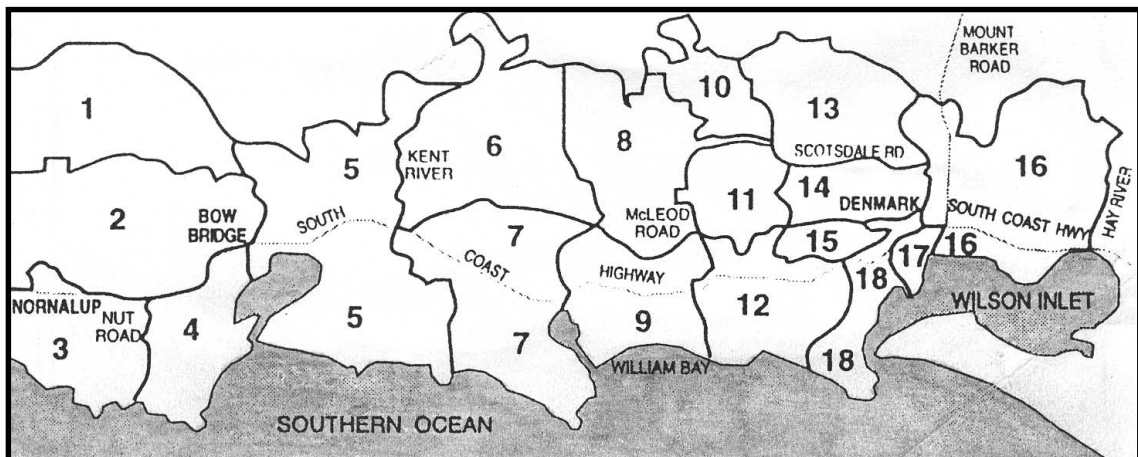

- b) Subdivision shall generally be in accordance with the Subdivision Guide Plan. The Western Australian Planning Commission may consider minor variations to the Subdivision Guide Plan however the further breakdown of lots will be contrary to the Scheme.
- ii) a) All buildings shall be set back a minimum of—
- 10m from the front boundary.
  - 10m from the rear boundary.

- e) Subject to Provision c)ii)d), Council may request the Commission to impose a condition at the time of subdivision for the compaction of house pads within the identified “Dwelling Areas”. Such house pads shall be certified as capable of accommodating a two storey double brick & tile dwelling and provide for the collocation of an amended soil effluent disposal system within the “Dwelling Area”.
- f) No development shall be permitted within the Development Exclusion Area as shown on the Subdivision Guide Plan.
- iii) a) Council may request the Commission to impose a condition at the time of subdivision for the provision of Strategic Fire Breaks and other fire safety facilities. Such facilities shall be provided to the satisfaction of Council and the Fire & Emergency Services Authority.
- b) Council shall require that individual landowners are responsible for the maintenance of any strategic firebreaks crossing individual lots.
- c) The clearing of firebreaks other than for strategic firebreak purposes will not be permitted unless for safety reasons to comply with Council and Fire Emergency Services Authority requirements.

- clearing to comply with the requirements of the Bush Fires Act 1954 (as amended);

  - clearing to gain vehicular access to an approved dwelling or any other clearing which may be approved by the Council.

- b) Buildings shall be constructed with roof and external wall materials and colours comprising natural earth or olive green colours. Other roof and external wall materials which would, in the opinion of Council, prejudice the landscape amenity of the area, will not be permitted.
- c) All buildings shall be sited to maximise the natural screening effect of vegetation and topography.
- d) All buildings shall be single storey except where it can be proven to Council that a variation to the height restriction would not adversely affect the visual amenity of surrounding lots as well as the locality.

- b) Any water tanks shall be coloured an appropriate natural shade of brown or green and shall be suitably screened with vegetation in keeping with the amenity of the area to the satisfaction of Council.

- d) In the event that such action is not undertaken, Council may carry out such works as are deemed necessary, with all costs being borne by the landowner.
- ix) a) Council may request the Commission to impose a condition at the time of subdivision to require the preparation of a Geotechnical Investigation which details soil profiles to a depth of at least 2.0 metres, permeability, winter water table levels and the topography of the land.
