That portion of the local government district of Murray coloured yellow on Department of Land Administration Statutory Services Plan 31153 is constituted as the Dwellingup Fire District.



BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

Shire of Esperance

BUSH FIRE BRIGADES LOCAL LAW

Under the powers conferred by the Bush Fires Act 1954 and under all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Esperance resolved on 27th August 2002 to make the following local law.

The Bush Fire Brigades Local Law of the Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes published in the *Government Gazette* of 20 October 2000, is adopted as a local law of the Shire of Esperance with the modifications which follow—

1. Preliminary

- 1.1 Wherever the "Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes" is mentioned in the local law substitute with "Shire of Esperance".
- 1.2 In clause 1.2 delete the definition of "Bush Fire Management Committee".
- 1.3 Wherever "Bush Fire Management Committee" or "Management Committee" are mentioned in the local law substitute "Bush Fire Advisory Committee" and "Advisory Committee" respectively.

2. Clause 1.3—Repeal

Delete clause 1.3 and substitute—

"The Local Laws relating to Bush Fire Brigades published in the Government Gazette of 6th May 1988 are repealed".

3. First Schedule—Rules Governing The Operation of Bush Fire Brigades

3.1 Clause 2.4—Applications for membership

Delete "of that in Appendix 1" and substitute "determined by the local government from time to time".

3.2 Clause 2.9—Existing liabilities to continue

In subclause (1) delete "2.6" and substitute "2.7".

3.3 Delete Appendices I and II.

Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act 1960

Totalisator Agency Board (Betting) Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2002

Made by the deputy of the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Totalisator Agency Board* (Betting) Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2002.

2. The regulations amended

The amendments in these regulations are to the *Totalisator Agency Board (Betting) Regulations 1988**.

[* Reprinted as at 20 August 1999. For amendments to 19 August 2002 see 2001 Index to Legislation of Western Australia, Table 4, p. 337, and Gazette 22 March 2002.]

3. Regulation 16 amended

After regulation 16(2) the following subregulation is inserted —

(2a) Despite subregulation (2), on days designated as "major race days" by the Betting Control Board, a person who has made a bet in person at a TAB agency may cancel the bet prior to the close of betting on the race to which the bet relates, and receive a refund of the bet if the amount of the bet was less than \$200.

4. Regulation 19 amended

- (1) Regulation 19(2) is amended as follows:
 - (a) at the end of paragraph (b) by deleting "and";
 - (b) at the end of paragraph (c) by deleting the full stop and inserting instead —

; and

- (d) quaddie bets, where a race nominated as part of that quaddie has already been successfully run or remains to be run.
- (2) Regulation 19(4) is amended after "41(2)" by inserting —

 ", 44A(4), 44A(10) ".

5. Regulation 35 amended

Regulation 35(2) is amended after "numbers bet" by inserting —

", a quaddie bet ".

6. Regulation 38 amended

- (1) Regulation 38(1) is amended as follows:
 - (a) at the end of paragraph (h) by deleting "and";
 - (b) at the end of paragraph (i) by deleting the comma and inserting instead —

; and

(j) quaddie bets,

.

(a) at the end of

(2) After regulation 38(10) the following subregulation is inserted —

"

(11) In a quaddie bet, the person making the bet selects 4 runners, one from each of 4 races nominated by the TAB at a race meeting, on the chance that all 4 runners win their races.

"

7. Regulation 40 amended

(1) Regulation 40(2) is amended after "numbers bet" by inserting —

", quaddie bet ".

(2) Regulation 40(3) is amended after "numbers bet" by inserting —

", quaddie bet ".

8. Regulation 43 amended

Regulation 43(1) is repealed and the following subregulation is inserted instead —

"

- (1) For the purposes of regulations 41, 42 and 44A, where a runner starts in a race it is deemed to be the off-course favourite for the race if there has been invested on that runner by way of win bets a greater amount than is so invested on any other runner starting in that race, the amounts of the respective investments being determined
 - (a) in respect of "stand alone" pools
 - (i) where the data processing facilities of the TAB are linked to the on-course totalisator — by reference to the total amount of win bets recorded;
 - (ii) in any other case by reference to the win bets accepted by the TAB;

and

(b) in respect of combined pools — in accordance with the rules governing the determination of the off-course favourite or substitute which apply to the body corporate, prescribed under section 27 of the Act, with whose pool the pool has been combined.

"

9. Regulation 44A inserted

After regulation 44 the following regulation is inserted in Part 5 —

"

44A. Quaddie bets

- (1) The TAB is to
 - (a) nominate the races at that race meeting (if any) on which it intends to offer quaddie bets; and
 - (b) announce the proposed method of alternate payment it intends to employ under subregulation (9), should it be necessary.
- (2) If a runner selected by a person as part of a quaddie bet fails to start, the off-course favourite (determined under regulation 43) will be substituted for the non-starting runner in relation to that quaddie bet.
- (3) Subject to subregulation (4), where a race nominated as being a race on which a quaddie bet is offered is
 - (a) cancelled;
 - (b) postponed so that it takes place in other than the order of the races as nominated by the TAB;
 - (c) abandoned; or
 - (d) declared a "no race",

all selections in that race in a quaddie bet are winners for that particular race.

- (4) Where all 4 races nominated as being races at a particular race meeting on which a quaddie bet is offered are
 - (a) cancelled;
 - (b) postponed from one day to another;
 - (c) abandoned:
 - (d) declared a "no race"; or
 - (e) any combination of paragraphs (a) to (d),

all quaddie bets on that group of races are to be refunded to the ticketholders.

- (5) Before a dividend is calculated or declared on a totalisator pool for a group of races nominated as being the 4 races on which quaddie bets are taken, the TAB shall deduct the prescribed commission from the gross takings of the totalisator pool.
- (6) After deducting the prescribed commission, the TAB shall (subject to this regulation), divide the number of winning betting units into the amount of the resulting pool balance and, subject to regulation 40(1), declare and pay that dividend in respect of each winning unit to the holder of each winning ticket.

- (7) If 2 or more runners place first in a nominated race due to a dead heat, the TAB shall determine the winning quaddie combinations using each of the first placed runners, divide the number of winning betting units into the amount of the pool balance and, subject to regulation 40(1), declare and pay that dividend in respect of each winning unit to the holder of each winning ticket.
- (8) If a combination of dead heats, or triple heats, occurs, and the number of winning quaddie combinations for a nominated group of races could be 8 or more, the first race with the result that giving rise to 8 or more combinations, and any subsequent race in that nominated group, is be disregarded when calculating the winning quaddie combinations for that race meeting.
- (9) If there are no winning bets on a particular group of races nominated as being the 4 races on which quaddie bets are taken, the TAB is to deduct the prescribed commission from the totalisator prize pool, and may—
 - (a) carry the remaining balance of that pool forward and add it to a totalisator pool conducted for a quaddie bet either on the same day, or a subsequent day; or
 - (b) pay that balance out to an alternate winning combination (calculated in accordance with subregulation (10)),

as the TAB determines from time to time.

- (10) Alternate winning quaddie combinations must be worked out using the following progression of winning runners, (and taking into account any dead heats) until the TAB is able to declare and pay a dividend
 - (a) first, the winning runners in the first 3 races, and the second placed runner in the fourth race;
 - (b) second, the winning runners in the first 3 races, and the third placed runner in the fourth race;
 - (c) third, the winning runners in the first 3 races, and any runner in the fourth race;
 - (d) fourth, the winning runners in the first 2 races, the second placed runner in the third race and any runner in the fourth race;
 - (e) fifth, the winning runners in the first 2 races, the third placed runner in the third race and any runner in the fourth race,

but if none of those combinations results in a winning bet, the TAB shall replace the prescribed commission into the totalisator prize pool, and refund all quaddie bets made in respect of that particular group of 4 nominated races.

BUSH FIRE ACT 1954

Shire of Jerramungup

NOTICE TO ALL OWNERS AND OCCUPIERS OF LAND IN THE SHIRE OF JERRAMUNGUP Fire Break Order

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 31st day of October 2002 to clear inflammable material firebreaks as stated hereunder and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including April 14

- 1. Prepare firebreaks not less than three (3) metres wide within 100 metres of and surrounding all buildings, haystacks and fuel dumps.
- 2. Prepare firebreaks not less than ten (10) metres wide immediately around the perimeter of any scrub or timber which has been logged, chained or otherwise prepared for burning within seven (7) days of such work being completed, no area to be greater than 400 hectares.
- 3. In respect of land within any Townsite within the Shire, you shall—
 - (A) Where the area is 2,000 square metres or less, remove all inflammable material on the land from the whole of the land.

- (B) Where the area of land exceeds 2,000 square metres, firebreaks not less than two (2) metres wide shall be prepared immediately inside and along all external boundaries of the land.
- (C) Rural Residential Zone-
 - (i) Where a Lot is traversed by a strategic firebreak shown on the Subdivision Guide Plan, the owner(s) of the Lot is responsible for maintaining such a firebreak to the satisfaction of Council.
 - (ii) To maintain access for fire fighting purposes, a well maintained access track and sufficient clearing around all building structures is required.
 - (iii) Clearing of firebreaks along fence lines other than for strategic firebreaks will not be permitted unless for safety reasons, to comply with Council and Bush Fires Board requirements.
 - (iv) It is the responsibility of the Lot owner to ensure that all buildings are constructed of materials that are relatively fire resistant.
 - (v) Council will require all owners of the Lot to annually contribute to a special fund administered by Council and used for the maintenance of the standpipe facility and fire fighting equipment.
 - (vi) Land owners and developers within the Shire of Jerramungup that are required to install strategic firebreaks, on coastal or any fragile areas shall only install these strategic firebreaks by the method of slashing.

Definition: The type and size of the slashing machine to be classed in the Heavy Duty Class.

PENALTY FOR NON-COMPLIANCE: \$1000.00

EXEMPTIONS/VARIATIONS TO THE FIREBREAKS ORDER

If it is considered impractical to construct firebreaks as required by this Notice, the approval of the Council must be obtained. This is for exemption of construction of firebreaks in areas affected by soil degradation/erosion or to clear firebreaks in an alternate position.

Approval for the exemption or any variation to the construction of firebreaks or part thereof will only be granted by Council if the said area has been inspected by a Bush Fire Control Officer. Approvals for exemptions will stand until such a time as a complaint is received and inspected by an authorised officer. Upon completion of inspection the exemption will remain or be cancelled.

It is an offence to provide firebreaks on a road reserve without the prior approval of the Council, or Main Roads Department in the case of Declared Main Roads.

Burning on Sundays during the restricted and prohibited burning period is banned.

Harvesting on Christmas Day is banned.

BUSHFIRE PRECAUTIONS

The prohibited burning times within the Shire will be 1 November 2002 to 2 February 2003.

It is Council Policy that the prohibited burning period be advertised through all local media channels.

RESTRICTED BURNING TIMES

The Restricted Burning Times within the Shire will be 1 October 2002 to 31 October 2002, and 3 February 2003 to 14 April 2003.

It is Council Policy that the restricted burning period be advertised through all local media channels once determined.

These dates are subject to variation according to seasonal conditions, but any alterations will be advertised locally.

A permit to burn issued under Section 18 of the Bush Fire Act is valid only for the date specified on the permit. It is important that Control Officers issuing permits should take care that permits do not exceed 28 days. The permit to burn is not valid until the Base Radio Operator has been notified of a person's intention to burn.

FIRE BREAK INSPECTION OFFENDERS AND PENALTIES

Council has now adopted the following Policy in respect to offenders of the Firebreak Order, subsequent to aerial and ground inspection of construction standards of firebreaks throughout the Municipal district.

The proposed penalties have been adopted by Council in an effort to maintain a fire- free season within the district as well as landowners becoming aware of their responsibilities to protect property, not only their own but land adjoining.

Known offenders are to be given a category, which attracts specified penalties as under—

Immediately following Firebreak inspections, offenders are categorised as follows-

CATEGORY 1—

14 days notice given to have the break put in.

No fine applied.

CATEGORY 2—

A Category 1 offender in the past automatically becomes Category 2.

Penalty—21 days notice given to comply. \$80 fine.

CATEGORY 3-

If Category 2 offender in past then automatically becomes Category 3.

Penalty—Immediate prosecution by Council and a \$1000 fine plus costs for having Council put breaks in.

HARVESTING & MOTOR POWERED MACHINES EXCEPTING THE OPERATION OF A CLOVER HARVESTER

A person shall not operate any harvesting machine or header in any crop during the restricted and prohibited time, unless—

- 1. A fire extinguisher is fitted in a readily accessible position on the machine.
- 2. A readily mobile fire fighting unit of a minimum 400 litres capacity powered by an engine driven pump is in attendance in or adjacent to the entrance of the paddock being harvested: or
- 3. A tractor and plough are readily available in or adjacent to the entrance of the paddock being harvested for the purpose of fighting fires.
- 4. All vehicles shall carry a fire extinguisher while operating in the paddock during harvesting time

TRACK RAKING & SIMILAR OPERATIONS

- 1 During the prohibited Burning Time track raking and similar operations are not permitted unless permission is granted by the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer, Chief Fire Weather Officer, or in their absence, their Deputies.
- 2 On days for which the fire danger forecast issued by the Bureau of Meteorology in Perth, in respect of the locality where the operations are to take place, is "Very High" or "Extreme", track raking and similar operations are not permitted unless permission is granted by the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer, Chief Fire Weather Officer, or in their absence, their Deputies.
- 3 In the Restricted and Prohibited burning times fire fighting equipment must be available in the immediate area of the track raking, or similar operations. Such fire fighting equipment must meet the minimum standard currently required by the Local Government for harvesting operations. (Bush Fire regulation 38 & 38a).
- 4. Track raking and similar operations include the dragging of a heavy chain (or other implements) by one or more tractors, bulldozers or graders for the reduction of bush/vegetation height, or for the clearing of bush, and grading, or mechanical rock picking operations.

Operation of Harvesters (Reg 38)

A harvesting machine or header may not be operated in any crop during the prohibited burning times or the restricted burning times unless it is equipped with a fire extinguisher.

Operation of Harvesting, and other, Machinery-Regulations by Control Officers (Reg 38A)

A Bush Fire Control Officer, subject to any directions which may be issued by the Local Government, may prohibit or regulate the operation of harvesting machines or any other plant, vehicle engines or machinery on any day when it is considered the machinery is likely to cause a fire. A Local Government may arrange for the banning of harvesting operations to be made by one officer for the whole district. Orders restricting the use of harvesting machines can be applied similarly. A ban or restriction on harvesting may be announced by a radio broadcast.

DEFINITIONS

The following definitions shall apply to the guidelines on the ban of vehicles and machinery movement and the operation of internal combustion engines under Regulation 38A and 38B of The Bush Fire Act—

"Fire Extinguisher"

A device which comprises—

- (a) A container filled with at least 7.5litres of water, and
- (b) A pump capable of discharging that water, and which is in a sound and efficient condition.

Laneway/Roadway (non gazetted)

A laneway/roadway is defined as having a trafficable surface; free of inflammable material a minimum of four metres wide. Overhanging vegetation must be pruned back so as not to come into contact with parts of a vehicle.

Registered On and Off Loading Area

A registered On and Off Loading area is defined as an area free of inflammable material, save live standing trees to a radius of 50 metres from the centre of the Area.

Mobile Fire Fighting Unit

A mobile fire fighting unit is defined as having a minimum water carrying capacity of four hundred (400) litres, equipped with a 38mm engine-driven pump fitted with a minimum of twenty (20) metres of nineteen (19), millimetre diameter fire fighting hose capable of delivering water through an adjustable nozzle in the spray of jet configurations.

Harvest Ban

A ban on the operation of all grain harvesting machines within a Shire or part of a Shire and during a time, as specified in a notice broadcast (Reg 38A).

A Ban on the Movement of all Vehicles and Machinery and the Operation of Internal Combustion Engines

A ban on the Movement of all vehicles and Machinery and the operation of internal combustion engines within a Shire or part of a Shire and during a time as specified in a notice or broadcast (Reg 38A & B) with the exception of the movement of vehicles and machinery on main gazetted roads, laneways and yards. The following activities are permitted provided these comply with specified conditions.

Regulated Activities—

- 1. Loading and offloading of grain, fertiliser and feed is only permitted on sites which are approved and registered by Council on an annual basis and which are clear of all inflammable material save live standing trees to a radius of at least 50 metres. A mobile fire fighting unit shall be in attendance at all times the site is in use during the ban period.
 - (Please note that an owner or occupier of a site may appeal to the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer in cases where approval was not granted or granted subject to additional conditions).
- 2. Water carting for stock and domestic purposes provided it is accompanied by a mobile fire fighting unit, or alternatively, the water carting vehicle acts as the mobile fire fighting unit and meets minimum specifications (this also requires to retention of 400L of water at all times).
- 3. All necessary travel to and from and within piggeries, sheep or cattle feed lots, provided this is undertaken in a mobile fire-fighting unit.
- 4. All necessary carting of livestock, provided that such vehicle is accompanied by a mobile fire-fighting unit.
- 5. Activities which received specific exemptions from Council or a CBFCO.
 - All other activities or operations may only be undertaken during Total Vehicle and Machinery Movement Bans and Bans on the Operation of Internal Combustion Engines after approval has been granted by Council. Approval has to be sought on an individual basis. Approval may be subject to specified conditions. It should be noted that approval may not be granted.

LICENSED STORAGE AREAS

- 1. As from the 1994/1995 season, grain carting and outloading during harvest ban times shall be permitted from licensed storage and outloading areas, subject to inspection prior to licensed approval being given from the local Bush Fire Brigade. There will be a licence fee of \$20.00 payable to the local Bush Fire Brigade in the area: the owners name and locations are to be published in local media publications.
- 2. The storage areas are to be on a roadway or adjacent to a road with 50m radius cleared area free of flammable materials, therefore the ou loading areas should attract the same conditions, either being on or adjacent to a roadway or near houses or sheds. All areas are subject to inspection for Bush Fire Advisory Committee, further, that once inspected they need to be licensed.
- 3. PENALTY FOR NON-COMPLIANCE: \$200
 - *BUSH FIRE EMERGENCY UHF CHANNEL 5

VARIATIONS TO FIREBREAK WIDTHS AROUND BUSH

The Public is hereby advised that properties within the Bremer Bay, Gairdner, and Jacup Bush Fire Brigade areas shall construct at minimum, a Firebreak width of 20 metres around logged bush.

FIRE PROTECTION OF PRIVATE HARDWOOD/SOFTWOOD PLANTATIONS DEFINITIONS AND SPECIFICATIONS

Plantations—Any area of planted hardwood or softwood species exceeding 3ha within a townsite or 10ha outside a townsite, with depth greater than 50 metres.

Compartment Size and Layout—there is a need for access within a plantation so that firefighters are able to concentrate their efforts on containing fires to a relatively small area rather than waiting for the fire to reach the boundary fire break.

If potential losses are to be minimised, there must be an emphasis on safe internal access of fire fighters. The recommended maximum compartment size for both Pine and Eucalyptus species plantations is 30-hectare compartments. Up to 100 hectares may be considered depending on prevailing conditions such as local climate, terrain, topography and proximity to local development. Compartment boundaries should as far as possible, follow existing roads or natural features and avoid situations where soil erosion problems may be aggravated.

Minimum Fire Break Standards

The following fire break standards are recommended for plantations—

Boundary Breaks

Firebreaks constructed 15 metres wide on the boundaries of plantations or on such alternative locations as may be agreed between the Local Government Authority and the plantation owner.

Compartment Break

Internal fire breaks between compartments up to 30 hectares must be a minimum of 6 metres wide and for compartments over 30 hectares, a minimum of 10 metres wide. In all cases a 5 metre running surface should be maintained to allow access by fire fighting applicances.

Note: For all fire breaks it may be necessary for trees on both sides of fire breaks to be progressively pruned to a minimum height of 4 metres to allow unrestricted access for maintenance and fire fighting equipment and so as to maintain an effective width of fire break.

Fire Breaks Along Public Roads

Firebreaks adjoining public roads must be constructed to a width of 15 metres.

Fire Breaks Along Power Lines

Where power lines pass through plantation areas, fire breaks and clearing corridors must be in accordance with Western Power specifications. Contact Western Power for current standards.

Note: For all of these firebreaks, vegetation overhanging fire breaks must be pruned back so that fire breaks have a minimum 5 metre horizontal clearance between tree canopies.

Fire fighting Water Supplies

Plantation fire fighting water supply facilities must be designed and constructed so that heavy-duty fire fighting equipment, built to BFS or CALM specifications, is able to access the supply.

Sign Postings/Maps

Sign posting must be established to indicate—

- · Compartment Boundaries (Consistent with plantation map and by name or number)
- Water Supplies
- · Emergency access/egress
- Structures (houses, sheds etc)
- Significant features (creek crossings, dead ends, etc)

Note: Plantation Maps showing above details must be provided to the Local Government Authority for distribution to the Fire Services.

Equipment Standards

It is generally recognised that the establishment of plantations in a brigade area may increase the need for efficient fire fighting equipment. Where insufficient brigade fire fighting equipment is available (within 20 minutes response time) for plantation fire protection, plantation growers shall supply and maintain the recommended minimum equipment levels as listed below—

Shire of Gingin Firebreak Order 2002/2003

Notice is hereby given to landowners/occupiers within the Shire of Gingin that firebreaks must be installed by 1 November 2002 and maintained clear of flammable material up to and including 31 May 2003.

RURAL (FARM) FIREBREAKS (Properties 20ha (50 acres) or larger)

Construct a ploughed firebreak, clear of flammable material, for a width of no less than three metres (3m), immediately inside the external boundary of the property.

On heavily grassed blocks slash all dry grass to a height of no more than 50mm.

8 ha (20 acres) to 20 ha (50 acres)

ALTERNATIVE ALIGNMENTS OR METHODS

If it is impractical to plough or place a firebreak immediately inside a boundary, for environmental or other reason(s), you are required to notify the Shire of Gingin, in writing, before the 1 October 2002, to obtain permission for firebreaks to be installed in an alternative position, or by an alternative

method. Only properties that are licensed for horticulture may have a firebreak installed immediately inside the vegetated buffer adjacent to the property boundary.

On all other properties, trees must not be planted in the firebreak area.

PLANTATIONS

Tree Plantations of more than three hectares (3ha), but less than ten hectares (10ha)

Construct a ten metre (10m) wide firebreak, clear of all flammable material, immediately surrounding the plantation (Adjacent areas of the same property subject to provisions as for Rural Areas).

FIREBREAK ORDER

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Mullewa

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 1st October 2002 to plough, scarify, cultivate, or otherwise clear and thereafter maintain free from all flammable material until 31st March 2003, firebreaks in accordance with the following—

1. Rural Land

Owners and Occupiers of lands, other than within a townsite, shall clear of all flammable material firebreaks of at least three (3) metres width as close as practicably possible inside and along the whole of the external boundary of their property or properties.

- (b) If the area of land exceeds 2023 square metres (half an acre)—
 - (i) Clear of all flammable material firebreaks at least two (2) metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land, or
 - (ii) Have the grass mown to a height of not more than 50mm over the whole of the land, except where the land is used for the storage of flammable liquids.

3. Homesteads, Building, Haystacks, Stacks of Fodder, Bulk Fuel, Drums and Liquid Petroleum

Owners and Occupiers of land shall—

During the period from 1st day of October, 2002 to the 31st day of March 2003, inclusive, have firebreaks at least three (3) metres wide in such positions as are necessary to completely surround the perimeter of any homestead, building, fuel installation (including drums), haystack (where such a haystack is situated within 200 metres of any homestead, building, fuel installation) or group of such structures or installations.

4. Harvesting

A fully operational mobile fire-fighting unit complete with a container with at least 400litres minimum capacity of water is to be readily available to any paddock being harvested. A fully operational plough, tillage or cultivator equipment is to be readily available, and in close proximity, to any paddock being harvested. The responsibility to supply these units being that of the landholder.

5. General Information

If for any reason it is considered impractical to comply with any provision of this notice, a written application for a variation may be made to the Shire Council and must reach the Chief Executive Officer by the 30th day of September 2002. Any such application must bear the signature of the Fire Control Officer of the area signifying his agreement to the variation.

If permission for variation is not granted, the terms of this notice must be complied with, or as the Council directs

6. Registration

It is in the interest of all residents to be registered members of the Bush Fire Brigade covering the area in which they own land. Membership of a Brigade is the safest way to ensure cover under the Shire's Fire Insurance Policy which covers personal injury and damage to equipment resulting from fighting bush fires under the direction of a Fire Control Officer.

Flammable material is defined for the purpose of this order to include bush (as defined in the Bush Fire Act), boxes, cartons, paper and like flammable materials, rubbish and also combustible matter, but does not include green standing trees or growing bushes or plants in gardens or lawns.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of \$100 by infringement notice or not more than \$1000 if prosecuted, and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.
