2. The contribution to be paid under section 9(2a) of the Act, to the Skeleton Weed Eradication Fund, for the crop year 2002-2003, shall be calculated at the rate of 35 cents per tonne of grain, seed or grain and seed delivered by the grower.

- (c) the person is not, or will not become, as a result of the registration of the strata plan or survey-strata plan, an owner of the home.
- (2b) In subregulation (2a) —

"new home" means a home that is built —

- (a) under a comprehensive home building contract; or
- (b) by an owner builder.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

City of Melville

FIRE BREAK NOTICE

Notice to all owners and/or occupiers of land situated in the City of Melville.

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 15th day of November 2002 or within 14 days of the date of you becoming the owner or occupier should this be after the 15th day of November 2002 and thereafter up to and including the 30th day of April 2003 to clear inflammable matter from that land in accordance with the following requirements—

- A. As to land which is 1,500 square metres or less in area, or which is zoned "residential" to clear all inflammable matter from the whole of the land except living trees, shrubs and plants under cultivation and lawns.
- B. As to all other land within the district the owner or occupier shall—
 - (i) Clear firebreaks of a minimum width of 3 metres inside all external boundaries of the land; and
 - (ii) Clear firebreaks of a minimum width of 5 metres around all buildings situated on the land; and

- (iii) Where that area of land exceeds ten hectares, clear firebreaks of a minimum width of 5 metres so as to ensure that no area of land within the firebreaks exceeds ten hectares in land; and
- (iv) In any event, clear the firebreaks to the satisfaction of Council's duly authorised officer.

If for any reason an owner or occupier considers it to be impracticable to clear firebreaks or comply with other fire protection measures in accordance with this requirement, the owner or occupier may apply in writing to the Council's duly authorised officer no later than 31 October 2002 for an exemption or partial exemption from compliance with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not more than \$1,000 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

Eastern Districts Omnibus (No. 6) CALL FOR PUBLIC SUBMISSIONS

The Western Australian Planning Commission intends to amend the Metropolitan Region Scheme (MRS) for land in the Cities of Bayswater and Swan, the Town of Bassendean and the Shires of Kalamunda and Mundaring and is seeking public comment.

The amendment proposes is to incorporate 24 separate minor changes to the zones and reservations of the Metropolitan Region Scheme (MRS) in the Eastern Districts of the Perth Metropolitan Region. These changes arise from decisions made by the Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC), Government proposals for the use and development of land, detailed studies involving changes to the MRS and generally to ensure that the Scheme is kept up to date as the statutory region plan for Perth.
