Conservation and Land Management Act 1984

Public Firewood Areas Order (No. 2) 2002

Made by the Executive Director under regulation 98 of the *Forest Management Regulations 1993*.

1. Citation

This order may be cited as the *Public Firewood Areas Order (No. 2) 2002*.

2. Interpretation

- (1) References in this order to CALMAPS are to maps produced by the Department of Conservation and Land Management.
- (2) Copies of the maps are available for inspection by the public during normal office hours at the places referred to in clause 4.

3. Public firewood areas

- (1) The areas of State forest named in column 1 and described in column 3 of Schedule 1 are set aside for the purposes of the collection of firewood by members of the public.
- (2) The areas set aside under subclause (1) are delineated on the relevant CALMAPS referred to in column 2 of Schedule 1.
- (3) Regulation 100 of the *Forest Management Regulations 1993* applies to the areas described in Schedule 1 Part 1.
- (4) No fees are payable in respect of the removal of firewood from the area designated in Schedule 1 Part 2.

4. Inspection of CALMAPS

A CALMAP referred to in the Schedule may be inspected at the following Department of Conservation and Land Management offices —

Electricity Corporation Act 1994

Electricity Transmission Amendment Regulations 2002

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Electricity Transmission Amendment Regulations 2002*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation on 1 January 2003.

3. The regulations amended

The amendments in these regulations are to the *Electricity Transmission Regulations 1996** unless otherwise indicated.

4. Regulation 20 replaced

Regulation 20 is repealed and the following regulation is inserted instead —

“

20. Loss factors

(1) In this regulation —

“**Prices and Charges Paper**” means a document containing details of pricing methods referred to in clause 6(3)(c) of Schedule 5 to the Act.

- (2) The loss factor for a particular connection or a connection of a particular class is the factor for that connection or class specified in the most recent Prices and Charges Paper.
- (3) If an exempt connection is commissioned and is not specified or of a class specified in the most recent Prices and Charges Paper, then the loss factor for the exempt connection is equal to the loss factor for the connection located electrically closest to the exempt connection.
- (4) Western Power may amend the Prices and Charges Paper —
 - (a) to change a loss factor or to include a new loss factor; or
 - (b) to change the description of a class of connections, or to include a new class of connections, for loss factors.
- (5) An amendment of a kind described in subregulation (4) must not be made more than once in any financial year.
- (6) Before Western Power —
 - (a) makes an amendment of a kind described in subregulation (4); or
 - (b) changes the methodology used to calculate loss factors specified in the Prices and Charges Paper,it must provide details of the proposed amendment or change to the Coordinator and take into consideration any recommendations made by the Coordinator as to the amendment or change.
- (7) Western Power must review annually the loss factors specified in the Prices and Charges Paper.

5. Schedule 4 repealed

6. Consequential amendments to *Electricity Distribution Regulations 1997*

- (1) The amendments in this regulation are to the *Electricity Distribution Regulations 1997**.
