## **CONSUMER AFFAIRS ACT 1971**

SECTION 23Q

Interim Prohibition Order

- I, Patrick John Walker, Commissioner for Fair Trading, acting pursuant to section 23Q of the Consumer Affairs Act 1971 ("the Act")—
  - 1. having referred to the Consumer Product Safety Committee the question of whether in the interests of the safety of the public the supply of goods of the class described in the Schedule ought, by reason of the goods being dangerous, or the supply of the goods being dangerous, be prohibited or allowed only subject to restrictions or conditions; and
  - 2. believing on reasonable grounds that the said goods are so dangerous to public safety that their supply ought, in the interests of the safety of the public be prohibited immediately;

HEREBY prohibit for a period of 28 days from the date of publication of this order in the *Gazette* the supply of the class of goods described in the Schedule.

## SCHEDULE

All sunglasses, spectacles, glasses, camera viewfinders, binoculars, telescopes or other lenses or filter system either stated as being for the purpose of, or suitable or safe for use in, viewing or watching a solar eclipse.
