AMENDMENTS TO THE PERTH PARKING LOCAL LAW 1999

Under the power conferred by the Local Government Act 1995 and under all other powers enabling it, the Council of the City of Perth resolved on 26 November 2002 to make the following amendments to the Perth Parking Local Law 1999.

PART 1—OPERATION AND INTERPRETATION

PEARLING (ANNUAL FEES) NOTICE 2002

Made by the Minister under section 27(1)(a).

Citation

1. This notice may be cited as the Pearling (Annual Fees) Notice 2002.

Interpretation

2. In this notice, unless the contrary intention appears—

"pearling (seeding) licence" has the same meaning as in the regulations;

"pearling (wildstock) licence" has the same meaning as in the regulations;

"pearl shell unit"-

- (a) in respect of a pearling (wildstock) licence, means 1000 pearl oysters that may be taken under that licence;
- (b) in respect of a pearling (seeding) licence, means 1000 pearl oysters that may be seeded under that licence;

"regulations" means the Pearling (General) Regulations 1991.

Commencement

3. This notice shall commence operation on 1 January 2003.

Annual fees for farm leases, pearling licences, hatchery licences and permits

- 4. For the purposes of section 27(1)(a) of the Act, the annual fee declared for the year ending 31 December 2003 in respect of—
 - (a) a farm lease is \$155.00 per square nautical mile or part thereof of the area of the relevant pearl oyster farm;
 - (b) a pearling (wildstock) licence is \$5198.00 per pearl shell unit or part thereof;
 - (c) a pearling (seeding) licence is \$600.00 per pearl shell unit or part thereof;
 - (d) a hatchery licence is \$125.00;
 - (e) a pearling permit is \$55.00;
 - (f) a hatchery permit is \$55.00.

Payment by instalments

- 5. (1) For the purposes of regulation 9A of the regulations, the annual fee for a pearling licence may be paid by instalments as specified in the Schedule to this notice if—
 - (a) an election to pay by instalments is made by the holder of the licence in accordance with subclause (2); and
 - (b) there is no other fee, charge or levy in respect of the licence which has not been paid at the time the election is received at the head office of the Department.
- (2) An election made for the purposes of subclause (1) must be—
 - (a) made in writing;
 - (b) received at the head office of the Department prior to the commencement of the licensing period to which the election relates;
 - (c) accompanied by the first instalment plus the surcharge.
- (3) For the purposes of regulation 9A(2) of the regulations, the surcharge shall be 3.13% of the total fee.
- (4) The holder of a licence, or a person acting on that person's behalf, must not engage in any pearling activity at any time when the fee or surcharge payable in respect of the licence is outstanding.

Schedule

Pearling licence fee—payment by instalments—

- (a) The first instalment is 25% of the annual fee and is due for payment on or before 1 January of the year for which the licence is granted or renewed.
- (b) The second instalment is 25% of the annual fee and is due for payment on or before 1 April immediately following the period specified in paragraph (a).
- (c) The third instalment is the annual fee less the instalments provided for in paragraphs (a) and (b) and is due for payment on or before 1 July immediately following the period specified in paragraph (a).

Western Australian Planning Commission Act 1985 ('the Act') does hereby delegate its functions as set out in schedule 1 to the City Rail Development Committee being a committee of that name established by the Commission under section 19(1) of the Act in the manner set out in schedule 2.

In accordance with section 20(5) of the Act, a reference in this instrument to a function or a power of the Commission includes and extends to, without limitation or restriction, any of the powers, privileges, authorities, discretions, duties and responsibilities vested in or conferred upon the Commission by the Act or any other written law as the case requires.

SCHEDULE 1—FUNCTIONS DELEGATED

- 1. All functions of the Commission as set out in sections 18 (1)(a), (bb) (c) and (d) of the Act.
- 2. Without limiting the powers in paragraph 1, power to—
 - (i) prepare plans and processes for the delivery of the City Rail Development Project described in Schedule 3; and
 - (ii) report, advise and make recommendations to the Minister for Planning and Infrastructure ("the Minister") and the Commissioner, Western Australian Government Railways ("the Commissioner") on all planning and project issues for the City Rail Development Project, including, without limitation, the plans and processes referred to in sub-paragraph (i) and procurement strategies and implementation, resource allocation, financial management and development works to be undertaken.

SCHEDULE 2—APPLICATION OF DELEGATION

The delegation of functions set out in Schedule 1 apply to the City Rail Development Committee subject to the following conditions—

- 1 the delegation is limited to those matters identified in the terms of reference for the City Rail Advisory Committee;
- 2 the delegation excludes the power to expend Commission funds;
- 3 the delegation excludes the power to enter into contracts involving the acquisition of land or the redevelopment of property; and
- 4 the delegation is limited to the scope of the terms of reference and responsibilities of the City Rail Development Committee as determined by the Commission and as set out in Schedule 3.

SCHEDULE 3—TERMS OF REFERENCE AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Terms of Reference

The City Rail Development Committee is established to—

- Undertake planning functions associated with the delivery of the City Rail Development project; and
- Provide such guidance and advice to the Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC) and Minister for Planning and Infrastructure concerning the City Rail Development project as the Minister requests.

The City Rail Development project is defined as that portion of the South West Metropolitan Railway project located between the Narrows Bridge and the connection to the Northern Suburbs railway. It includes civil and drainage works, tunnel structures, stations and all urban development works associated with railway construction. It excludes rail infrastructure, signals and communications.

Responsibilities

The Committee will—

- Develop plans and processes for delivery of the City Rail Development project according to and consistent with the approved budget and timeframe, for approval by the Minister and implementation by government agencies;
- Monitor the implementation by relevant agencies, including the Western Australian Government Railways Commission, of approved management plans and processes;
- Report to the Minister and to the Perth Urban Rail Development Steering Committee on project issues, including contracting strategy (subject to the conditions detailed below), resource allocation, financial management and development works;
- Make recommendations to the Minister on project issues;
- Report and make recommendations to the Minister and the WAPC on planning issues and land acquisition;
- Make recommendations to the Minister on opportunities for the delivery of additional urban development works (including the sinking of the Fremantle-Midland rail lines and removal of the William Street overpass), with due regard to funding availability and other project constraints.

The Committee shall have no involvement in any evaluation, recommendation or approval of any recommendation, in relation to the procurement of any works or services for the City Rail Development project.
