TAMALA PARK LOCAL LAW 2002

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

1.1 Title

This local law may be cited as the *Mindarie Regional Council Tamala Park Local Law 2002*. Made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1995*.

1.2 Commencement

This local law comes into operation 14 days after the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

1.3 Interpretation

In this local law, unless the contrary intention appears—

“**Act**” means the *Local Government Act 1995*;

“**authorised person**” means a person authorised by the regional local government under section 9.10 of the Act to perform any of the functions of an authorised person under this local law;

“**authorised staff member**” means a person employed by the regional local government and authorised in writing by the CEO to carry out duties and functions at or in respect of a refuse and recycling facility;

“**CEO**” means the Chief Executive Officer of the regional local government;

“**commencement day**” means the day on which this local law comes into operation;

“**council**” means the Council of the regional local government;

“**operations manager**” means an authorised officer of the regional local government charged with the conduct of operations at a refuse and recycling facility and includes any person acting in that position;

“**refuse and recycling facility**” means the property and buildings used for the disposal, treatment and recycling of waste material;

“**regional local government**” means the Mindarie Regional Council;

“**regulations**” means the *Local Government (Functions and General) Regulations 1996*.

1.4 Application

This local law applies to Portion of Lot 118 on Plan 28300 and being the whole of the land comprised in Certificates of Title Volume 2213, Folios 691, 692, 693, 694, 695, 696 and 697.

1.5 Repeal

The following bylaws are repealed—

- (a) Mindarie Regional Council By-laws Relating to the Operation of Tamala Park Refuse and Recycling Facility published in the Government Gazette on 3 April 1992.

PART 2—REFUSE AND RECYCLING FACILITIES

2.1 Speed Limit

A driver of any vehicle within a refuse and recycling facility must observe all speed limit restrictions at all times.

2.2 Obeying instructions

Each person within a refuse and recycling facility must obey a lawful instruction given by the Operations Manager or an authorised staff member.

2.3 Failure to obey instructions

(1) If the Operations Manager or an authorised staff member believes on reasonable grounds that a person has failed to—

- (a) comply with a provision of this local law; or
- (b) obey a lawful instruction of the Operations Manager or an authorised staff member,

then he or she may direct the person to leave the refuse and recycling facility immediately.

(2) A person who fails to comply with a direction under subclause (1) commits an offence.

2.4 Disposal of waste

A person must not place or dispose of any waste material at a refuse and recycling facility other than in accordance with a notice or an instruction of the Operations Manager or an authorised staff member.

2.5 Removal of waste

A person must not remove any waste material from a refuse and recycling facility unless authorised to do so by the Operations Manager.

2.6 Lighting of fires

A person must not light, or attempt to light, any fire within a refuse and recycling facility unless authorised to do so by the Operations Manager.

2.7 Damage to property

A person must not damage, deface or otherwise interfere with any building, equipment or other property of the regional local government within or near a refuse and recycling facility.

2.8 Flora and fauna

Unless authorised to do so by the Operations Manager, a person must not—

- (a) dig up, remove, damage or otherwise interfere with any flora; or
- (b) trap, chase, worry, remove or otherwise interfere with any fauna.

2.9 Opening hours

(1) The regional local government may from time to time set and alter the hours of operation of a refuse and recycling facility.

(2) The hours of operation set under subclause (1) are to be displayed for public information at or near the public entrance to a refuse and recycling facility.

2.10 Free entry

(1) In this clause the “prescribed fee or charge” means the relevant fee or charge or both, payable for admission to a refuse and recycling facility, in the scale of fees and charges determined by the regional local government from time to time in accordance with section 6.16 of the Act.

(2) Except where authorised by the CEO or an authorised staff member, a person must not enter a refuse and recycling facility to dispose of or dump waste without paying the prescribed fee or charge.

2.11 Hazardous materials

(1) A person must not dispose of or dump at a refuse and recycling facility any liquid, toxic or hazardous material declared by the Health Department of Western Australia to be of a class which is required to be disposed of and treated at a declared facility suitable for that class of material unless the person disposes of that material in accordance with a direction of an authorised staff member.

(2) If a person disposes of or dumps material in breach of subclause (1) then—

- (a) the local government may remove the material and make good any damage caused by its disposal or dumping at a refuse and recycling facility; and
- (b) the costs of removal and making good any damage may be recovered from that person in a court of competent jurisdiction.

PART 3—ENFORCEMENT*Division 1—Notices given under this local law***3.1 Offence to fail to comply with notice**

Whenever the regional local government gives a notice under this local law requiring a person to do any thing and that person fails to comply with the notice, that person commits an offence.

3.2 Regional local government may undertake requirements of notice

Where a person fails to comply with a notice referred to in clause 3.1, the regional local government may do the thing specified in the notice and recover from the person to whom the notice was given, as a debt, the costs incurred in so doing.

*Division 2—Offences and penalties**Subdivision 1—General***3.3 Offences and general penalty**

(1) Any person who fails to do anything required or directed to be done under this local law, or who does anything which under this local law that person is prohibited from doing, commits an offence.

(2) Any person who commits an offence under this local law is liable, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding \$5,000, and if the offence is of a continuing nature, to an additional penalty not exceeding \$500 for each day or part of a day during which the offence has continued.

*Subdivision 2—Infringement notices and modified penalties***3.4 Prescribed offences**

(1) An offence against a clause specified in Schedule 1 is a prescribed offence for the purposes of section 9.16(1) of the Act.

(2) The amount of the modified penalty for a prescribed offence is that specified adjacent to the clause in Schedule 1.

(3) For the purpose of guidance only, before giving an infringement notice to a person in respect of the commission of a prescribed offence, an authorised person should be satisfied that—

- (a) commission of the prescribed offence is a relatively minor matter; and
- (b) only straightforward issues of law and fact are involved in determining whether the prescribed offence was committed, and the facts in issue are readily ascertainable

3.5 Form of notices

(1) For the purposes of this local law—

- (a) where a vehicle is involved in the commission of an offence, the form of the notice referred to in section 9.13 of the Act is that of Form 1 in Schedule 1 of the Regulations;
- (b) the form of the infringement notice given under section 9.16 of the Act is that of Form 2 in Schedule 1 of the Regulations; and
- (c) the form of the notice referred to in section 9.20 of the Act is that of Form 3 in Schedule 1 of the Regulations.

(2) Where an infringement notice is given under section 9.16 of the Act in respect of an alleged offence against clause 2.1, the notice is to contain a description of the alleged offence.

Citation

1. This local law may be cited as the *Town of Mosman Park Amendment Local Law (No. 1) 2002*.

Principal Local Laws

2. In this local law, the Town of Mosman Park Parking and Parking Facilities Local Law published in the *Government Gazette* on November 23rd, 2000, and amended as published in the *Government Gazette* on November 30th, 2001 is referred to as the principal local law.

Clause 3.8 Amended

3. In paragraph (b) of subclause (1) of clause 3.8, delete “*unattached to a motor vehicle*”.

Second Schedule Amended

4. In item 29 of the Second Schedule delete “*or unattached trailer or caravan*”.

(Approved Authority) Notice 2002**

Made by the Minister under section 3(3) of the Act.

1. Citation

This notice may be cited as the *Witness Protection (Western Australia) (Approved Authority) Notice 2002*.

2. Commencement

This notice comes into operation on the day on which it is published in the *Gazette*.

3. Declaration of approved authority

For the purposes of paragraph (d)(ii) of the definition of “approved authority” in section 3(1) of the Act, the Crime and Misconduct Commission, continued in existence under the *Crime and Misconduct Act 2001* of Queensland, is declared to be an approved authority for the purposes of the Act.

Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation (Acts of Terrorism)
Act 2001

Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation (Acts of Terrorism) (Bali Bombing) Order 2002

Made by the Minister under section 8 of the Act.

1. Citation

This order may be cited as the *Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation (Acts of Terrorism) (Bali Bombing) Order 2002*.

2. Act of terrorism

- (1) For the purposes of the *Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation (Acts of Terrorism) Act 2001*, it is stated that the Minister believes that an act of terrorism has occurred, that being the several bombings in Kuta, Bali, Indonesia, on 12 October 2002.
- (2) For the purposes of section 8(1)(b) of the Act, 12 October 2002 is specified as the day on which the act of terrorism is to be treated, for the purposes of this Act, as having occurred.

3. Claim barred unless made within 90 days after the act of terrorism

For the purposes of section 8(1)(c) of the Act, it is stated that, despite anything in the *Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation Act 1981*, a claim for compensation for a disability attributable to the act of terrorism identified in clause 2(1) is barred unless it is made within a period of 90 days after the day on which the act of terrorism occurred.

DECLARATION OF LOCAL-INTAKE AREAS FOR SCHOOLS WITH PRIMARY STUDENTS

(Pursuant to Sections 60, 78, 79 and 80)

The Hon. Minister for Education has declared that the local-intake areas for the schools listed hereunder shall be as stated in this notice. Children of compulsory school age who reside within the local-intake areas stated shall be entitled to attend the schools to which such local-intake areas apply if there is an appropriate educational program for them at that school. Children who reside outside these local-intake areas may apply to attend the schools to which such local-intake areas apply.

BEECHBORO PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following defines the local-intake area of this school—

From the intersection of Altone Road and Benara Road, west along Benara Road to Bottlebrush Drive, north from this point to the western extremity of Silver Place, northeast from this point to the junction of Ironbark Road, and Darwin Crescent, north from this point to the junction of King Road and Platte Way, northwest from this point to the western extremity of Jana Court, northeast along Jana Court to Platte Way, northnorthwest along Platte Way to Amazon Drive, eastnortheast along Amazon Drive to St Lawrence Drive, northnorthwest along St Lawrence Drive to Pentecost Avenue, north from this point to Marshall Road, east along Marshall Road to the northern extension of Altone Road, and south to and along Altone Road to Benara Road.

The boundary parts of Benara Road (north side), Platte Way (both sides), Amazon Drive (both sides), St Lawrence Drive (both sides), Marshall Road (both sides) and Altone Road (west side) and the boundary street of Jana Court (both sides) are included within the area for Beechboro Primary School.

BEELIAR PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following defines the local-intake area of this school—

From a point on the westerly extension of Beeliar Drive that is due south of the midpoint on Yangebup Road between Birchley Road and Spinnaker Heights, south to the westerly extension of Fancote Avenue, west along the western extension of Fancote Avenue to the railway line, south along the railway line to Russell Road, south east and east along Russell Road to a point due south of the centre of Kogolup Lake, north from this point on Russell Road through Thompsons Lake and Kogolup Lake to Beeliar Drive, west along Beeliar Drive and its westerly extension to the midpoint between Birchley Road and Spinnaker Heights. The boundary parts of Beeliar Drive (south side) and Russell Drive (north side) are included within the local-intake area for Beeliar Primary School.

BRIDGETOWN PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following defines the local-intake of this school—

The township of Bridgetown and the areas served by the following school bus routes—

Kangaroo Gully, Maranup Ford, Hester, Winnejup, Glentulloch, Peninsula, and Greenbushes (south from and including Catterick Road-both sides).

BUTLER (BRIGHTON) PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following defines the local-intake area of this school—

From the junction of Marmion Avenue and Lukin Drive, east along Lukin Drive and its proposed extension to the proposed Mitchell Freeway, north along the proposed Mitchell Freeway to the locality boundary between Alkimos and Butler, west along the locality boundary between Alkimos and Butler to the locality boundary between Alkimos and Jindalee, continuing west along the locality boundary between Alkimos and Jindalee to the coastline, south along the coastline to the locality boundary between Jindalee and Quinns Rocks, east along the locality boundary between Jindalee and Quinns Rocks to Marmion Avenue, and south along Marmion Avenue to the junction with Lukin Drive. The boundary parts of Lukin Drive (north side) and Marmion Avenue (east side) are included within the local-intake area of this school.

CANNINGTON COMMUNITY COLLEGE

The following defines the local-intake area for this school for students in Years 1 to 7—

From the junction of Albany Highway and Welshpool Road, east along Welshpool Road to the railway line, south east along the railway line to William Street, south west along William Street to Albany Highway, west along Albany Highway to Nicholson Road, south west along Nicholson Road to the Canning River, north west along the Canning River to the south westerly extension of Civic Gardens (formerly Wharf Street), north east along Civic Gardens and its north east extension to Albany Highway and north east along Albany Highway to Welshpool Road. The boundary parts of Welshpool Road (south side), William Street (north west side), Albany Highway (southern section, north side), Nicholson Road (north west side), Civic Gardens (south east side) and Albany Highway (northern section, east side) are included within the local-intake area of this school.

The following defines an optional area between Cannington Community College and Wilson Primary School—

From the junction of Albany Highway and Manning Road, west along Manning Road to Fleming Avenue, south east along Fleming Avenue to Kent Street, south west along Kent Street and its south westerly extension to the Canning River, generally south, east and north along the Canning River to the south westerly extension of Civic Gardens, north east along this extension to and along Civic Gardens and its north east extension to Albany Highway, north west along Albany Highway to Manning Road. The boundary parts of Manning Road (south side), Fleming Avenue (both sides), Kent Street (both sides), Civic Gardens (north west side) and Albany Highway (south west side) are included within this optional area.

CHALLIS EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTRE AND CHALLIS PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following defines the local-intake area of the abovementioned schools—

From the junction of Railway Avenue and Armadale Road, west along Armadale Road to the southern extension of Dewar Street, north west to and along Dewar Street to Braemore Road, north east along Braemore Road to Cobar Street, north west between Firetail Court, Bellbird Place, Skylark View and Peacock Close to the south west and Petrel Close, Waterway Crescent and Fulmar Way to the north east, to Seville Drive, north east along Seville Drive to Chisholm Circle, north west along Chisholm Circle to the proposed section of Westfield Road, north west along the proposed section of Westfield Road to Hesketh Avenue, south west along Hesketh Avenue to Fallon Place, north west along Fallon Place to Lake Road, north east along Lake Road to Champion Drive, south east along Champion Drive to Railway Avenue and south along Railway Avenue to Armadale Road. The boundary parts of Armadale Road (north side), Chisholm Circle (both sides) are included within this local-intake area, while the boundary parts of Dewar Street (both sides), Braemore Street (both sides), Seville Drive (both sides), Chisholm Circle (both sides), Hesketh Avenue (both sides) and Lake Road (both sides) are excluded from the local-intake area for Challis Early Childhood Centre and Challis Primary School.

The following defines an optional area between Challis Early Childhood Centre and Challis Primary School and Willandra Primary School—

From the junction of Seville Drive and Armadale Road, east along Armadale Road to the southern extension of Dewar Street, north west to and along Dewar Street to Braemore Road, north east long Braemore Road to Cobar Street, north west between Firetail Court, Bellbird Place, Skylark View and Peacock Close to the south west and Petrel Close, Waterway Crescent and Fulmar Way to the north east, to Seville Drive, north east along Seville Drive to Chisholm Circle, north west along Chisholm Circle to the proposed section of Westfield Road, north west along the proposed section of Westfield Road to Hesketh Avenue, south west along Hesketh Avenue to Fallon Place, north west along Fallon Place to Lake Road, south west along Lake Road to Poad Street, south east along Poad Street to Seville Drive, and south along Seville Drive to Armadale Road. The boundary parts of Armadale Road (north side), Dewar Street (both sides), Braemore Street (both sides), Chisholm Circle (both sides), Seville Drive (northern section, both sides), Chisholm Circle (both sides), Hesketh Avenue (both sides) and Seville Drive (southern section, east side) are included within this optional area. The boundary parts of Poad Street (both sides) and Lake Road (both sides) are excluded from this optional area.

COOGEE PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following defines the local-intake area of this school—

From the junction of Stock Road and Russell Road, north along Stock Road to Yangebup Road, west along Yangebup Road to Rockingham Road, north along Rockingham Road to Troode Street, west along Troode Street to Hamilton Road, north along Hamilton Road to King Street, west along King Street to Hillcrest Street, south along Hillcrest Street to Beach Road, west along Beach Road to Cockburn Road, north along Cockburn Road to Powell Road, west along Powell Road and its extension to the Indian Ocean. The boundary streets of Troode Street (both sides), King Street (both sides), Hillcrest Street (both sides) and Beach Road (both sides) are excluded from the area for this school. The boundary parts of Stock Road (west side), Yangebup Road (south side), Rockingham Road (west side) and Hamilton Road (west side) are included within the local-intake area for Coogee Primary School.

DEANMORE PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following defines an optional area between Deanmore Primary School and Scarborough Primary School—

From the intersection of Scarborough Beach Road and Duke Street, north along Duke Street to Moorland Street, west along Moorland Street to Deanmore Road, south along Deanmore Road to Manning Street, west along Manning Street and its extension to the coastline, south along the coastline to a point due west of the westerly extension of Scarborough Beach Road, east along this extension and continuing east along Scarborough Beach Road to Duke Street. The boundary parts of Duke Street (west side), Deanmore Street (both sides), Manning Street (both sides) and Scarborough Beach Road (north side) are included within this optional area. The boundary parts of Moorland Street (both sides) are excluded from this optional area.

EAST BEECHBORO PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following defines the local-intake area of this school—

From the junction of Benara Road and Altone Road, north along Altone Road and its northern extension to Marshall Road, east along Marshall Road to Bennett Brook, south and south east along Bennett Brook to Reid Highway, east along Reid Highway to the intersection with Lord Street, south to the northern end of Waldeck Road, south along Waldeck Road to Benara Road and west along Benara Road to Altone Road.

The boundary parts of Altone Road (east side), Marshall Road (both sides), Reid Highway (south side), Waldeck Road (both sides) and Benara Road (north side) are included within the area for East Beechboro Primary School.

GEOGRAPHE PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following defines the local-intake of this school—

From the coastline of Geographe Bay, west along the Vasse Estuary and the Vasse River to Queen Street, north along Queen Street to the coastline of Geographe Bay, west along the coastline of Geographe Bay to the drainage channel, south along the drainage channel to Bussell Highway, west along Bussell Highway to Fairway Drive, south along Fairway Drive to the Busselton Bypass, east along the Busselton Bypass to the Bussell Highway, and continuing east along Bussell Highway to a point due south of the mouth of the Vasse Estuary, north from this point to the mouth of the Vasse Estuary. The boundary parts of Queen Street (west side), Bussell Highway (north west section, south side), Fairway Drive (east side), Busselton Bypass (north side) and Bussell Highway (south east section, both sides) are included within the local-intake area of this school. In addition, the areas served by the following school bus routes are included within the local-intake area of this school: Chapman/Ambergate, Acton Park, Tutunup and Ludlow/Capel.

MEDINA PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following redefines the previously gazetted additional area for Medina Primary School (with the details defining the remaining parts of the local-intake area for Medina Primary School as gazetted on 22 December 1998 remaining unchanged)—

From the intersection of the Kwinana Freeway and Thomas Road, east along Thomas Road to the western boundary of the Marri Park Golf Course, south along the western boundary of the golf course to Orton Road, east along Orton Road to the local government boundary between the Town of Kwinana and the Shire of Serpentine-Jarradale, south along this local government boundary to Mortimer Road, west along Mortimer Road to the Kwinana Freeway and north along the Kwinana Freeway to Thomas Road. The boundary parts of Thomas Road (south side), Mortimer Road (north side) and the Kwinana Freeway (east side) are included within this additional area for Medina Primary School.

NORTH COTTESLOE PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following defines the local-intake area of this school—

From the junction of Stirling Highway and Forrest Street, north east along Stirling Highway to Airlie Street, east along Airlie Street to Bindaring Parade, north along Bindaring Parade to Richardson Avenue and continuing north along Richardson Avenue to Stirling Highway, continuing north across Stirling Highway to Parry Street, north along Parry Street to the railway line, south west along the railway line to the closest point to the junction of West Coast Highway and Claremont Crescent, north west from this point to West Coast Highway, north along West Coast Highway to North Street, west along North Street to Marine Parade, south along Marine

Parade to Forrest Street, east along Forrest Street (western section) and its extension to Forrest Street (eastern section), and east along Forrest Street (eastern section) to Stirling Highway. The boundary parts of Stirling Highway (west side), Airlie Street (both sides), Bindaring Parade (both sides), Richardson Avenue (both sides), Parry Street (west side), West Coast Highway (west side), North Street (south side), Marine Parade (both sides) and Forrest Street (western and eastern sections, north side in both cases) are included within the local-intake area of this school.

NORTH PARMELIA PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following defines the local-intake area of this school—

From the intersection of Thomas Road and the Kwinana Freeway, south along the Kwinana Freeway to Mortimer Road, west along Mortimer Road to Bertram Road, continuing west, north west and south along Bertram Road to Wellard Road, west along Wellard Road to Parmelia Avenue, north along Parmelia Avenue to Sulphur Road, east along Sulphur Road to Hennessy Avenue, north west along Hennessy Avenue to Wiggins Road, north east along Wiggins Road and its extension to the junction with Leghorn Road, north from this point to the junction of Dunrobin Avenue and Colchester Avenue, north along Dunrobin Avenue to the intersection with Nottingham Parkway, north from this point to Thomas Road and east along Thomas Road to the Kwinana Freeway. The boundary parts of the Kwinana Freeway (west side), Mortimer Road (north side), Bertram Road (both sides), Wellard Road (north side), Parmelia Avenue (both sides), Sulphur Road (south side), Dunrobin Avenue (both sides), Nottingham Parkway (both sides, eastern arm from Dunrobin Avenue) and Thomas Road (south side) are included within the local-intake area of for North Parmelia Primary School, while the boundary parts of Hennessy Avenue (both sides), Nottingham Parkway (both sides, western arm from Dunrobin Avenue) and the boundary street of Wiggins Road (both sides) are excluded from the area for North Parmelia Primary School.

The following is an optional area for Medina Primary School and North Parmelia Primary School—

The area bounded by the western boundary of Marri Park Golf Course, Thomas Road (south side), the boundary between the Town of Kwinana and the Shire of Serpentine-Jarrahdale and Orton Road (both sides).

NORTH PERTH PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following defines an optional area between North Perth Primary School and West Leederville Primary School—

From the intersection of Oxford Street and Richmond Street, east along Richmond Street to Loftus Street, north along Loftus Street to Salisbury Street, west along Salisbury Street to Oxford Street, and south along Oxford Street to Richmond Street. The boundary parts of Richmond Street (north side), Loftus Street (west side) and Oxford Street (east side) are included within this optional area. The boundary parts of Salisbury Street (both sides) are excluded from this optional area.

QUINNS BEACH PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following defines the local-intake area of this school—

From the junction of Marmion Avenue and Santa Barbara Parade, generally west along Santa Barbara Parade to Mordialta Avenue, south west along Mordialta Avenue to Tapping Way, north west along Tapping Way to Camira Way, west along Camira Way and its westward extension to the coastline, north along the coastline to the locality boundary between Jindalee and Quinns Rocks, east along the locality boundary between Jindalee and Quinns Rocks to the proposed northern extension of Marmion Avenue, south along this proposed extension of Marmion Avenue and continuing south along the existing section of Marmion Avenue to the junction with Santa Barbara Parade.

The boundary parts of Tapping Way (north east side), Camira Way (north side) and Marmion Avenue (west side) are included in the local-intake area of this school. The following boundary parts are optional between Quinns Beach Primary School and Quinns Rocks Primary School – Santa Barbara Parade (both sides from Marmion Avenue to Mordialta Avenue) and Mordialta Avenue (both sides from Santa Barbara Parade to Tapping Way).

SCARBOROUGH PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following defines the local-intake area of this school—

From the intersection of Scarborough Beach Road and Duke Street, south along Duke Street to Brighton Road, and continuing south along Weaponess Road to Sonia Street, west along Sonia Street to Corbett Street, north along Corbett Street to Ventnor Street, west along Ventnor Street and its westerly extension to the coastline of the Indian Ocean, north along the coastline to a point due west of the westerly extension of Scarborough Beach Road, east along this extension and continuing east along Scarborough Beach Road to Duke Street. The boundary parts of Duke Street (west side), Weaponess Road (west side), Corbett Street (both sides) and Scarborough Beach Road (south side) are included within the local-intake area of this school. The boundary parts of Sonia Street (both sides) and Ventnor Street (both sides) are excluded from this local-intake area.

The following defines an optional area between Deanmore Primary School and Scarborough Primary School—

From the intersection of Scarborough Beach Road and Duke Street, north along Duke Street to Moorland Street, west along Moorland Street to Deanmore Road, south along Deanmore Road to Manning Street, west along Manning Street and its extension to the coastline, south along the

coastline to a point due west of the westerly extension of Scarborough Beach Road, east along this extension and continuing east along Scarborough Beach Road to Duke Street. The boundary parts of Duke Street (west side), Deanmore Street (both sides), Manning Street (both sides) and Scarborough Beach Road (north side) are included within this optional area. The boundary parts of Moorland Street (both sides) are excluded from this optional area.

SOUTH COOGEE PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following defines the local-intake area of this school—

From the junction of Stock Road and Fanstone Avenue, north along Stock Road to a point due west of the westerly extension of Erceg Road, east along the westerly extension of Erceg Road, continuing east along Erceg Road, and continuing east along the easterly extension of Erceg Road to the railway line, continuing east along the railway line to the northern extension of Spearwood Avenue, south west along the railway line to Yangebup Road, north east along Yangebup Road to a point midway between Birchley Road and Spinnaker Heights, south from this point to the easterly extension of Fanstone Avenue, west along the easterly extension of Fanstone Avenue and continuing west along Fanstone Avenue to Stock Road.

The boundary parts of Stock Road (east side), Erceg Road (both sides), Yangebup Road (south side) and Fanstone Avenue (both sides) are included within the area for this school.

The following is an optional area between South Coogee Primary School and Yangebup Primary School—

From the most easterly of the two railway intersections with Yangebup Road, north east along the railway line to the proposed northern extension of Spearwood Avenue, south along the proposed northern extension of Spearwood Avenue to Yangebup Road and south west along Yangebup Road to the intersection with the railway line. The boundary part of Yangebup Road (north side) is included with this optional area.

SUBIACO PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following defines an optional area between Subiaco Primary School and West Leederville Primary School—

From the junction of Roberts Road and Rokeby Road, north to the Subiaco Railway Station, north east and east along the railway line to Loftus Street, south west along Loftus Street to Roberts Road, and west along Roberts Road to Rokeby Road. The boundary parts of Loftus Street (west side) and Roberts Road (north side) are included within this optional area.

WEST BEECHBORO PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following defines the local-intake area of this school—

From the junction of Bottlebrush Drive and Benara Road, north to the western extremity of Silver Place, northeast to the junction of Ironbark Road and Darwin Crescent, north to the junction of King Road and Platte Way, northwest to the western extremity of Jana Court, northeast along Jana Court to Platte Way, northnorthwest along Platte Way to Amazon Drive, eastnortheast along Amazon Drive to St Lawrence Drive, northnorthwest along St Lawrence Drive to Pentecost Avenue, north to Marshall Road, west along Marshall Road to the proposed extension of Tonkin Highway, south along the proposed alignment of Tonkin Highway to Reid Highway, southwest along Reid Highway to Tonkin Highway, south along Tonkin Highway to Benara Road, east along Benara Road to Beechboro Road North, south along Beechboro Road North to Devonshire Street, east between Eugene Court and Redgum Way to the north and Elletra Close to the south to Arbor Park, southeast along the western boundary of Arbor Park to Challenger Avenue, north and east along Challenger Avenue to Bottlebrush Drive, north along Bottlebrush Drive to Milligan Avenue, northeast and north along Milligan Avenue and its extension to Benara Road and west along Benara Road to Bottlebrush Drive.

The boundary parts of Beechboro Road North (east side), Reid Highway (southeast side), Tonkin Highway (east side), Benara Road (eastern section, southside; western section, north side) and Bottlebrush Drive (west side) and the boundary street of Milligan Avenue (both sides) and Marshall Road (south side) are included within the area for West Beechboro Primary School, while the boundary parts of Platte Way (both sides), Amazon Drive (both sides), St Lawrence Drive (both sides) and the boundary streets of Jana Court (both sides) and Challenger Avenue (both sides) are excluded from the area for West Beechboro Primary School.

From the junction of Cambridge Street and Gregory Street, north along Gregory Street to the junction with Scaddan Street, east from this junction through Lake Monger to the Mitchell Freeway, north east along the Mitchell Freeway to the western extension of Wylie Place, east along the western extension of Wylie Place to Wylie Place, continuing east along Wylie Place to Oxford Street, south along Oxford Street to Richmond Street, east along Richmond Street to Loftus Street, south along Loftus Street to the northern extension of Colin Place, south along the extension of Colin Place and Colin Place to Troode Street, east along Troode Street to Sutherland Street, south east and south along Sutherland to Wellington Street, west along Wellington Street to the junction with Roberts Road and Thomas Street, north along Thomas Street and continuing

north along Loftus Street to the Perth-Fremantle railway line, generally west along the railway line to the Subiaco Railway Station, west from the Station to Station Street (southern section), north along Station Street (southern section) to Salvado Road, west along Salvado Road to Station Street (northern section), north along Station Street (northern section) to Cambridge Street, west along Cambridge Street to Gregory Street.

The boundary parts of Oxford Street (west side), Richmond Street (south side), Loftus Street (northern section, west side), Colin Place (both sides), Troode Street (both sides), Sutherland Street (southern and western sides), Wellington Street (north side), Loftus Street (southern section, east side), Station Street (southern and northern sections, east side), Salvado Road (north side) and Cambridge Street (north side).

The boundary parts of Gregory Street (both sides), and Wylie Place (both sides) are excluded from this local-intake area.

The following defines an optional area between North Perth Primary School and West Leederville Primary School—

From the intersection of Oxford Street and Richmond Street, east along Richmond Street to Loftus Street, north along Loftus Street to Salisbury Street, west along Salisbury Street to Oxford Street, and south along Oxford Street to Richmond Street. The boundary parts of Richmond Street (north side), Loftus Street (west side) and Oxford Street (east side) are included within this optional area. The boundary parts of Salisbury Street (both sides) are excluded from this optional area.

The following defines an optional area between Subiaco Primary School and West Leederville Primary School—

From the junction of Roberts Road and Rokeby Road, north to the Subiaco Railway Station, north east and east along the railway line to Loftus Street, south west along Loftus Street to Roberts Road, and west along Roberts Road to Rokeby Road. The boundary parts of Loftus Street (west side) and Roberts Road (north side) are included within this optional area.

WILLANDRA PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following defines the local-intake area for this school—

From the junction of Armadale Road and Seville Drive, north and north west along Seville Drive to Poad Street, west and north west along Poad Street to Lake Road, south west along Lake Road to the northern extension of Brigade Road, south west to and along Brigade Road and its extension to Armadale Road and east along Armadale Road to Seville Drive. The boundary parts of Seville Drive (west side), Poad Street (both sides), Brigade Road (both sides) and Armadale Road (north side) are included within the local-intake area of this school. The boundary parts of Lake Road (both sides) are excluded from the local-intake area of this school.

The following defines an optional area between Challis Early Childhood Centre and Challis Primary School and Willandra Primary School—

From the junction of Seville Drive and Armadale Road, east along Armadale Road to the southern extension of Dewar Street, north west to and along Dewar Street to Braemore Road, north east along Braemore Road to Cobar Street, north west between Firetail Court, Bellbird Place, Skylark View and Peacock Close to the south west and Petrel Close, Waterway Crescent and Fulmar Way to the north east, to Seville Drive, north east along Seville Drive to Chisholm Circle, north west along Chisholm Circle to the proposed section of Westfield Road, north west along the proposed section of Westfield Road to Hesketh Avenue, south west along Hesketh Avenue to Fallon Place, north west along Fallon Place to Lake Road, south west along Lake Road to Poad Street, south east along Poad Street to Seville Drive, and south along Seville Drive to Armadale Road. The boundary parts of Armadale Road (north side), Dewar Street (both sides), Braemore Street (both sides), Chisholm Circle (both sides), Seville Drive (northern section, both sides), Chisholm Circle (both sides), Hesketh Avenue (both sides) and Seville Drive (southern section, east side) are included within this optional area. The boundary parts of Poad Street (both sides) and Lake Road (both sides) are excluded from this optional area.

YANGEBUP PRIMARY SCHOOL

The following defines the local-intake area of this school—

From the intersection of North Lake Road and the railway line, south east along North Lake Road to the junction with Osprey Road, south from this junction through Yangebup Lake to Beeliar Drive, west along Beeliar Drive and the proposed westerly extension of Beeliar Drive to a point due south of the midpoint on Yangebup Road between Birchley Road and Spinnaker Heights, north to the midpoint on Yangebup Road between Birchley Road and Spinnaker Heights, east from this point to the junction with Spearwood Avenue, north along the northern extension of Spearwood Avenue to the railway line and north east along the railway line to North Lake Road.

The following is an optional area between South Coogee Primary School and Yangebup Primary School—

From the most easterly of the two railway intersections with Yangebup Road, north east along the railway line to the proposed northern extension of Spearwood Avenue, south along the proposed northern extension of Spearwood Avenue to Yangebup Road and south west along Yangebup Road to the intersection with the railway line. The boundary part of Yangebup Road (north side) is included with this optional area.

The Hon. Minister for Education has declared that the local-intake areas for the secondary schools listed hereunder shall be as stated in this notice. Children of compulsory school age who reside within the local-intake areas of the following secondary schools shall be entitled to attend the schools to which such local-intake areas apply if there is an appropriate educational program for them at that school. The local-intake area of a secondary school may be defined in this notice by listing the names of the contributory primary schools, the local-intake areas and the traditional catchment areas of which, when amalgamated, constitute the local-intake area of that secondary school. Children who reside outside these local-intake areas may apply to attend the schools to which such local-intake areas apply.

BUSSELTON SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL

The local-intake area for this school is defined by the local-intake areas of Busselton Primary School, Geographe Primary School, Vasse Primary School and West Busselton Primary School, and the traditional catchment area of Dunsborough Primary Schools.

CANNING VALE COLLEGE

Canning Vale College opens in 2004. The local-intake area for the school has been gazetted now to enable firm advice to be provided during 2003 to applicants for enrolment at this school.

The following primary schools are located within the local-intake area of this secondary school: Campbell, Canning Vale and Ranford .

The following defines the local-intake area of this secondary school—

From the junction of Garden Street and Warton Road, south west along Warton Road to Nicholson Road, north along Nicholson Road to Accourt Road, north west along Accourt Road to Johnston Road, north along Johnston Road to Clifton Road, north and north west along Clifton Road and its extension to the railway line, north east along the railway line to Nicholson Road, south east along Nicholson Road to Garden Street, and continuing south and south east along Garden Street to Warton Road. The boundary parts of Warton Road (west side), Nicholson Road (southern section, east side), Accourt Road (north east side), Johnston Road (east side), Clifton Road (east side), Nicholson Road (northern section, south west side) and Garden Street (south west side) are included within the local-intake area of this secondary school.

The following defines an optional area between the secondary school in Canning Vale, Gosnells Senior High School and Thornlie Senior High School—

From the junction of Warton Road and Barrett Street, south east along Barrett Street to Balfour Street, south west along Balfour Street to Ranford Road, north west along Ranford Road to Wright Road, south west along Wright Road to the main entrance of Carey College, north west from the main entrance of Carey College through Harrisdale Swamp to Warton Road and north east along Warton Road to Barrett Street. The boundary parts of Barrett Street (south west side), Balfour Street (north west side), Ranford Road (north east side) Wright Road (north west side) and Warton Road (south east side) are included within this optional area. (It is anticipated that this optional area will eventually become part of the local-intake area of a future secondary school in Southern River or Forrestdale, and will cease to be part of the local-intake area of the secondary school in Canning Vale.)

THORNLIE SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL

The local-intake area for this school contains all or part of the local-intake areas of the following primary schools—

Campbell, Canning Vale, East Kenwick, Forest Crescent, Ranford and South Thornlie, and the traditional catchment areas of Thornlie and Yale Primary Schools.

The following defines the local-intake area of this school—

From the intersection of Nicholson Road and the railway line, north east along the railway line to Albany Highway, south east along Albany Highway to Austin Avenue, south west along the locality boundary between Kenwick and Maddington to the Canning River, generally south along the Canning River to the confluence of the Canning River and the Southern River, south along the Southern River to Corfield Street, north east along Corfield Street to Warton Road, south west along Warton Road to Nicholson Road, north along Nicholson Road to Acourt Road, north west along Acourt Road to Johnston Road, north along Johnston Road to Clifton Road, north west along the proposed Clifton Road to the south westerly extension of Bannister Road, north east along Bannister Road to Nicholson Road, and south east along Nicholson Road to the railway line.

The boundary parts of Albany Highway (south west side), Corfield Street (north side), Warton Road (north west side), Acourt Road (both sides), Johnston Road (both sides), proposed Clifton Road (both sides), Bannister Road (south side) and Nicholson Road (south west side) are included within the local-intake area of this school.

The following is an optional area between Lynwood Senior High School and Thornlie Senior High School—

From the intersection of the Canning River and the railway line, south west along the railway line to Cameron Street, north west along Cameron Street to the proposed Roe Highway, north

east along the proposed Roe Highway to the Canning River, and generally south east along the Canning River to the railway line.

The boundary parts of Cameron Street (both sides) and the proposed Roe Highway (south east side) are included within the local-intake area of this school.

The following defines the boundary of an optional area between Gosnells Senior High School and Thornlie Senior High School—

From the junction of Ranford Road and Southern River Road, north east along Southern River Road to Gay Street, north west along Gay Street and its extension to Warton Road, south west along Warton Road to Ranford Road and south east along Ranford Road to Southern River Road.

The boundary parts of Southern River Road (both sides), Gay Street (both sides) and Warton Road (south side) are included within this optional area. The boundary parts of Ranford Road (both sides) are excluded from this optional area.

Students resident within the former catchment area for Kewdale Senior High School are entitled to attend Thornlie Senior High School. This area is described in the Belmont City College local-intake notice.

WARNBRO COMMUNITY HIGH SCHOOL

The local-intake area for this secondary school contains all or part of the local-intake areas of the following primary schools—

Charthouse, Endeavour, Koorana, Port Kennedy, Rockingham Lakes, Secret Harbour and Warnbro.

From the coastline, east along Hilda Road to Safety Bay Road, north west along Safety Bay Road to Rand Avenue, north east along Rand Avenue to Read Street, north along Read Street to Gngangara Drive, north east along Gngangara Drive to Willmott Drive, east along Willmott Drive to Ennis Avenue, south along Ennis Avenue to Mandurah Road, south along Mandurah Road to the boundary between the localities of Port Kennedy and Secret Harbour, and west along this locality boundary to the coastline. The boundary parts of Hilda Road (both sides), Safety Bay Road (east side), Rand Avenue (south side), Read Street (east side), Gngangara Drive (south side), Willmott Drive (south side), Ennis Avenue (west side) and Mandurah Road (west side) are included within the catchment area for Warnbro Community High School. The boundary parts of Safety Bay Road (west side), Rand Avenue (north side), Read Street (west side), Gngangara Drive (north side), Willmott Drive (north side), Ennis Avenue (east side) and Mandurah Road (east side) are excluded from the catchment area for Warnbro Community High School.

Children of secondary school age resident within the locality of Secret Harbour are entitled to attend either Mandurah Senior High School or Warnbro Community High School.

The Planning Control Area will ensure that no further development occurs on this land until it may be reserved for the purpose of Primary Regional Road in the Metropolitan Region Scheme.

Duration and Effects

The declaration remains in effect for a period of five years from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette* or until revoked by the Western Australian Planning Commission with approval by the Minister, whichever is the sooner.

A person shall not commence and carry out development in a Planning Control Area without the prior approval of the Western Australian Planning Commission. The penalty for failure to comply with this requirement is \$2,000 and, in the case of a continuing offence, a further fine of \$200 for each day during which the offence continues.

Compensation is payable in respect of land injuriously affected by this declaration, and land so affected may be acquired by the Western Australian Planning Commission in the same circumstances and in the same manner as if the land had been reserved in the Metropolitan Region Scheme for a public purpose.
