Wildlife Conservation Act 1950

Wildlife Conservation (Rare Flora) Notice 2003

Made by the Minister under section 23F(2) of the Act.

1. Citation

This notice may be cited as the *Wildlife Conservation (Rare Flora) Notice 2003*.

2. Interpretation

In this notice —

"extant" means known to be living in a wild state;

"protected flora" means any flora belonging to the classes of flora declared by the Minister under section 6 of the Act to be protected flora by notice published in the *Gazette* 9 October 1987, at p. 3855;

"taxon" includes any taxon that is described by a genus name and any other name or description.

Note: The plural form of "taxon" is "taxa".

3. Rare flora

Subject to clause 4, protected flora —

- (a) specified in Schedule 1, being taxa that are extant and considered likely to become extinct or rare and therefore in need of special protection; and
- (b) specified in Schedule 2, being taxa that are presumed to be extinct in the wild and therefore in need of special protection,

are declared to be rare flora for the purposes of section 23F of the Act throughout the State.

4. Application

Clause 3 does not apply to those plants of a taxon of protected flora specified in Schedule 1 or 2 that have been planted for any purpose other than such plants that have been planted for the purpose of conservation of that taxon and in accordance with approval given by the Executive Director.

5. Revocation

The Wildlife Conservation (Rare Flora) Notice 2002 is revoked.

Wildlife Conservation (Specially Protected Fauna) Notice 2003

Made by the Minister for the Environment and Heritage under section 14(2)(ba) of the Act.

1. Citation

This notice may be cited as the *Wildlife Conservation (Specially Protected Fauna) Notice 2003*.

2. Interpretation

In this notice —

"taxon" includes any taxon that is described by a family name or a genus name or any other name or description.

Note: The plural form of "taxon" is "taxa".

3. Declaration of specially protected fauna

For the purposes of the Act, all taxa of the fauna —

- (a) specified in Schedule 1, being fauna that is rare or likely to become extinct, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection;
- (b) specified in Schedule 2, being fauna that is presumed to be extinct, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection;
- (c) specified in Schedule 3, being birds that are subject to an agreement between the governments of Australia and Japan relating to the protection of migratory birds and birds in danger of extinction, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection; and
- (d) specified in Schedule 4 are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection, otherwise than for the reasons mentioned in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c).

4. Revocation

The Wildlife Conservation (Specially Protected Fauna) Notice 2002 is revoked.

1. This instrument may be cited as the West Coast Demersal Gillnet and Demersal Longline Fishery (Interim) Management Plan Amendment 2003.

Principal Plan

2. The amendments in this instrument are to the West Coast Demersal Gillnet and Demersal Longline Interim Managed Fishery Management Plan 1997*.

Clause 4 amended

3. Clause 4 is amended by inserting in the appropriate alphabetical order—

""total fee" means the fee as specified in item 3(26a) of Part 3 of Schedule 1 of the regulations;".

Clause 17 deleted and inserted

4. Clause 17 is deleted and the following clause is inserted instead—

"Payment by instalments

- 17. (1) For the purposes of regulation 137(2) of the regulations, the total fee may be paid by instalments as specified in Schedule 5 if—
 - (a) an election to pay by instalments is made by the holder of a permit in accordance with subclause (2); and
 - (b) there is no other fee, charge or levy in respect of the permit which has not been paid at the time the election is received at the head office of the Department.
- (2) An election for the purposes of subclause (1) must be—
 - (a) made in writing;
 - (b) received at the head office of the Department prior to 1 June of the year for which the licence is to be renewed; and
 - (c) accompanied by the first instalment plus the surcharge.
- (3) For the purposes of regulation 137(3) of the regulations, the surcharge shall be 3.13% of the total fee.
- (4) The holder of a permit, or a person acting on that persons behalf, must not fish in the Fishery at any time when any fee or surcharge payable in respect of the permit is outstanding.".

Clause 27 amended

5. Clause 27 is amended in paragraph (a) by inserting after "13," the following—" 17(4), ".

Schedule 5 deleted and inserted

6. Schedule 5 is deleted and the following schedule is inserted instead—

"Schedule 5

Payment by Instalments

- (a) The first instalment is 25% of the total fee and is due for payment on or before 1 June of the year for which the permit is to be granted or renewed.
- (b) The second instalment is 25% of the total fee and is due for payment on or before 1 September immediately following the period specified in paragraph (a).
- (c) The third instalment is the total fee less the instalments provided for in paragraphs (a) and (b) and is due for payment on or before 1 December immediately following the period specified in paragraph (a). ".

1. Inserting "14. Tourist Business" to Clause 3.1 of the Scheme.

- 2. Inserting "6.1.5 Prior to considering an application for development abutting a railway reserve, Council will require the applicant to demonstrate that any site contamination is within acceptable levels to the satisfaction of Council and the Department of Environmental Protection. Should the site be contaminated, remediation work may be required to the satisfaction of Council and the Department of Environmental Protection. At the time of subdivision, Council may require a notification to be placed on a Certificate of Title advising of the potential site contamination."
- 3. Inserting "6.1.6 Prior to considering an application for development abutting a railway reserve, Council will require the applicant to demonstrate that any development proposed is constructed in such a way as to mitigate noise levels from the adjoining railway reserve, to within acceptable levels, to the satisfaction of Council and the Department for Environmental Protection. At the time of subdivision, Council may request as a Condition for a notification to be placed on a Certificate of Title advising of the requirement to develop in such a manner to mitigate noise generated from the existing railway corridor."
- 4. Inserting "6.17 TOURIST BUSINESS" to Part 6—Development Standards, of the Scheme as follows—

"6.17 TOURIST BUSINESS

- 6.17.1 Aims and Objectives: Council recognises the importance of providing high amenity town sites which provide a range of businesses catering for the needs of tourists. Council seeks to encourage the establishment of businesses, which attract and promote the Donnybrook and Balingup town sites as tourist destinations within the Tourist Business Zone.
 - In considering applications for development approval under this zone, the Council shall—
 - (a) Seek to facilitate tourism focused commercial development within the Shire.
 - (b) Seek to facilitate an urban fabric of pedestrian orientated movement system, parks, gardens, art, cultural, entertainment and heritage village style architecture within the town sites of the Shire.
 - (c) Seek to facilitate building design elements which create an "old time village" theme in town sites within the Shire.
- 6.17.2 Urban Design: The facade of developments fronting any street within the Tourist Business Zone should reflect, and be compatible with, the predominant existing streetscape and architectural style.
- 6.17.3 Building Height: Development within the Tourist Business Zone is to be a maximum of two (2) storeys, not exceeding 9.0 metres in height, as defined in the Residential Planning Codes.
- 6.17.4 Materials and Finish: Development within the Tourist Business Zone should reflect, and be compatible with, the predominant colours, materials and finish of existing development within the Town Centre.
- 6.17.5 Any development subject to Planning Approval will be subject to the following landscaping provisions—
 - (a) Requiring the continued maintenance of the landscaping;
 - (b) The approved development not being used or occupied until the required landscaping has been provided;
 - (c) Landscaping including architectural structures and/or sculptures compatible with a "village" theme.
- 6.1716 Where it considers the amenity of surrounding properties will not be detrimentally impacted upon, Council may permit nil setbacks to any boundary.
- 6.17.7 No development will be permitted to use the land between the street front boundary and the building line for any purpose other than the following:—
 - (a) A means of vehicle access and egress;
 - (b) Vehicle car parking;
 - (c) The loading and unloading of vehicles; and
 - (d) Open air display where approved by the Council;
 - (e) Landscaping.
- 6.17.8 Provision should be made in any development for area(s) for the storage of any matter including refuse, and shall be—
 - (a) Screened from view to the satisfaction of the Council;
 - (b) Located not less than 10.0 metres from any residential building unless the area is fully enclosed.
 - (c) Accessible to service vehicles and of an internal floor area that is in accordance with the $Health\ Act\ 1911$.

PART X—SPECIAL CONTROL AREAS

10.1 Operation of Special Control Areas

10.1.1 The following Special Control Areas are shown on the Scheme Maps—

Poultry Farm Special Control Area

10.1.2 In respect of a special control area shown on the Scheme Map, the provisions applying to the special control area apply in addition to the provisions of the underlying zone or reserve and any general provisions of the Scheme—

10.2 Poultry Farm Special Control Area

Poultry Development Special Control Area The Poultry Farm Special Control Area is delineated on the Scheme Map as PF.

Purpose

The general objectives of the Poultry Farm Special Control Area are—

- 1. To implement the Commission's Statement of Planning Policy No. 5 Poultry Farms Policy.
- 2. To implement Council's 2000 Rural Strategy Review, Poultry Policy Overlay, being Council's response to Statement of Planning Policy No. 5.
- 3. To provide Council with a policy framework acceptable to the broader community that will allow the poultry industry to relocate to within the Shire in an environmentally suitable manner.

The specific objectives of the Poultry Farm Special Control Area are—

- 1. To ensure that new poultry farms are established in locations suitable to their operational requirements.
- 2. To minimise the impact of poultry farms on residential, rural-residential and other potentially incompatible uses.
- 3. To protect the interests of existing poultry farms in the face of encroaching development.

Application requirements

Planning consent is required to develop or expand a poultry farm.

Development applications for new poultry farms and expansion of existing poultry farms shall be accompanied by the following information—

- Site plan showing the location and extent of the site, the location and size of all existing and proposed buildings, a contour plan showing any significant drainage features.
- 2. Profile and materials of construction for all buildings.

- 3. Development in the vicinity of the site and, where the proposed development is within 300 metres of existing/proposed rural-residential development and 500 metres of existing/proposed residential development, an assessment of the likely environmental impacts (odour, noise, dust, traffic movement and visual impact) of the proposed development, and how the impacts are to be managed.
- 4. Separation from existing or proposed residential, ruralresidential and other incompatible development and
- Vehicular access to the site and circulation within the site, including details of the preferred truck routes using Kargotich, Lowlands, Rapids (north of Karnup), Hopelands and Karnup Roads.
- 6. A description of the type of farm operation including the maximum number of birds, effluent and drainage management and disposal methods, types of machinery and whether regular sales to the public will be made.
- 7. Hours of operation and information on whether any night-time activities will be carried out.
- 8. Proposed landscaping and screening including significant vegetation to be retained.
- 9. A description of the soil conditions relative to their capability and suitability to sustain the proposed development.
- 10. A description of the existing uses on the site and their relationship with the proposed development.

Determination of Applications

Notwithstanding Table 1—Zoning Table, an application for a new poultry farm or expansion of an existing poultry farm within the Poultry Farm Special Control Area will be determined by Council as a "P" use under the provisions of the Scheme, provided the application satisfies the following requirements. All other applications will be determined as a "AA" use under the provisions of the Scheme.

- 1. Controlled environment sheds or other (more superior) best practice controlled environmental technology, will be used to house the poultry.
- 2. There will be an internal loop road to allow articulated vehicles and truck and dog configurations to enter and leave the site, and service the facility, in a forward direction.
- 3. Landscaping and screening of the poultry sheds and surrounds accords with the "Standards for Revegetation on New Poultry Farms".
- 4. All litter material and dead birds will be disposed of off the site and in accordance with best practice.
- 5. A sign/s is placed on the site in a visible location to the satisfaction of the Council indicating the type of operation, hours of operation and possibility of undesirable environmental impacts on the surrounding areas as specified in schedules 1 and 2 of the Commission's Statement of Planning Policy No. 5 Poultry Farms Policy.
- 6. In respect of New Poultry Farms the sheds are at least—
 - 500 metres from any existing or future residential zone:
 - 300 metres from any existing or future ruralresidential zone:
 - 200 metres from any wetland subject to Water and Rivers Commission advice;
 - 100 metres from the boundary of the Poultry Farm.
- 7. In respect of the expansion of Existing Poultry Farms the new shed(s) shall be no closer than 100 metres from the poultry farm boundary (unless the nearby land does not contain an existing or proposed use sensitive to poultry farm operations in which case a lesser setback distance

- may be supported). In cases where there is an existing shed located closer than 100 metres from a poultry farm boundary a new shed shall be no closer than the existing shed from that particular boundary.
- 8. All the application requirements have been provided and the Council is satisfied with the establishment, operations and management and the impacts of the proposed development on the local environs.
- 2. Amend the Scheme Maps by inserting the relevant Legend reference and depicting the land identified on Attachment "A" within the Poultry Farm Special Control Area.
