Associations Incorporation Amendment Regulations 2003

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Associations Incorporation Amendment Regulations 2003*.

2. The regulations amended

The amendment in these regulations is to the *Associations Incorporation Regulations 1988**.

3. Regulation 6 replaced

Regulation 6 is repealed and the following regulation is inserted instead —

"

6. Applied provisions — voluntary winding up

- (1) The voluntary winding up of an incorporated association under section 30 of the Act is declared to be an applied Corporations legislation matter for the purposes of Part 3 of the *Corporations (Ancillary Provisions) Act 2001* in relation to Parts 5.5 and 5.6 of the Corporations Act other than sections 491, 496 to 500, 507, 514 to 529, 580 and 581.
- (2) The following modifications to the text of Parts 5.5 and 5.6 of the Corporations Act apply for the purposes of subregulation (1)
 - (a) a reference to the constitution of a company is to be read as a reference to the rules of an incorporated association;

- (b) a reference to a special resolution is to be read as a reference to a special resolution within the meaning of the Act;
- (c) a reference to an officer, or a past officer, of a company is to be read as a reference to a member, or a past member, of the committee of an association;
- (d) a reference to a contributory of a company is to be read as a reference to a member of an association;
- (e) a reference to the registered office of an incorporated association is to be read as a reference to the place where the secretary of an incorporated association resides;
- (f) a reference to a company carrying on its business or having a place of business is to be read as a reference to an incorporated association pursuing its objects or purposes;
- (g) a reference to the deregistration of a company is to be read as a reference to the winding up of an incorporated association.
- (3) Section 501 of the Corporations Act, as applied because of this regulation, is not to be read as authorising the distribution of surplus property of an incorporated association to its members.
- (4) In addition to any person qualified to act as the liquidator of a company under Parts 5.5 and 5.6 of the Corporations Act, as applied because of this regulation, a person in respect of whom an approval is in force under regulation 7 may be appointed, and may act as, liquidator of an incorporated association to which the approval relates.
- (5) Subregulation (4) applies despite section 532 of the Corporations Act as applied because of this regulation.

BUSH FIRE NOTICE AND REQUIREMENTS

Notice to all owners/ or occupiers of land in the Shire of West Arthur.

In accordance with Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, you are required to carry out fire prevention work on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the provisions of this order.

The penalty for non-compliance with this notice is a maximum fine of \$1000, and not withstanding prosecution, Council may enter upon the land and carry out required works at the owners/occupiers expense.

TOWNSITES

Darkan – Duranillin – Arthur River

Compliance date: 30th September 2003 to 15th May 2004

In respect of land owned or occupied within these townsites where the area of the land is less than 2023 square metres ($\frac{1}{2}$ acre), is used for the storage of flammable liquids or zoned for a hotel, clear all flammable materials.

In respect of land owned or occupied within these townsites where the area of the land is greater than 2023 square metres, ($\frac{1}{2}$ acre)

- 1. Where undeveloped land abuts developed land a firebreak not less than 2.5 metres wide is required, and
- 2. Mow the grass or maintain the flammable material to a height of no more than 50mm.

HOMESTEADS, BUILDINGS, HAYSTACKS, STACKS OF FODDER, BULK FUEL, DRUMS AND LIQUID PETROLEUM

Compliance date: 30th September 2003 to 15th May 2004

A firebreak or a combination of firebreaks or closely grazed land is required to completely surround any rural homestead , buildings, haystacks, stacks of fodder (refer to definition), bulk fuel, drums and liquid petroleum.

- 1. A firebreak not less than 10 metres wide must be constructed immediately surrounding; if provided by cultivation, spraying or burning.
- 2. If provided by closely grazed land; at least 30 metres wide completely surrounding; with the outer 2.5 metres cultivated or completely free of flammable material as required under the definition of firebreak.

PLANTATIONS

Eucalypt/Pine

Compliance date: 30th September 2003 to 15th May 2004

All plantations exceeding 30 hectares:

'Existing' plantations (pre June 2002) require a 15 metre firebreak, the outer 10 metres must be cleared of all flammable material (to bare earth), with no overhanging branches for a vertical clearance of at least 4 metres, the remaining 5 metres of firebreak must be maintained in a low fuel condition. Eg. Very short grass may be considered 'low fuel'.

'New' plantations (post – June 2002) require firebreaks in accordance with plantation fire management plans approved by the Shire.

DEFINITION OF FIREBREAK: A minimum of 2.5 metres wide, to bare mineral earth, with a vertical clearance of 4 metres.

DEFINITION OF HAYSTACKS: means a collection of hay including fodder rolls or large bales placed or stacked together within 200 metres of any homesteads, buildings or fuel installations).

NOTE: All firebreaks are to be maintained until 15th May. Firebreaks constructed on road verges do not constitute legal firebreaks under the Bush Fires Act.

BUSHFIRE PRECAUTIONS

Prohibited Burning Time (PBT): The 'prohibited burning' time that applies within the Shire is 1st November 2003 to 21st February 2004 (inclusive)

Restricted Burning Times (RBT): The 'restricted burning' times are 30th September 2003 to 1st November 2003 (inclusive) and 22nd February 2004 to 15th May 2004 (inclusive).

These dates may be subject to variation according to seasonal conditions. Any changes will be advertised.

If for any reason it is considered impracticable to comply with the requirements of this order, you may make written application to the Shire Chief Executive Officer no later than 14th November for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative position or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on your land. The application must be countersigned by the Fire Control Officer for your local area to signify his agreement to the proposed variation. No applications, whether verbal or written, will be considered after this date.

EXEMPTION CERTIFICATE PURSUANT TO REGULATION 2.13

(No.10 of 2003)

I, Brian Thomas Bradley, WorkSafe Western Australia Commissioner, hereby grant an exemption to NDC Wireless from the requirements of Regulations 3.117(1) and 3.117(2) of the *Occupational Safety and Health Regulations 1996* in relation to the respective requirements to hold a Class 1 or Class 2 demolition licence for total or partial dismantling of any communications structure comprising of a mast, pole, tower or similar structure and associated antennae but not including a communication structure that is itself a building.

I further grant an exemption from the requirements of Regulation 3.118(a) and 3.118(b) of the *Occupational Safety and Health Regulations 1996* in relation to the requirements to ensure, respectively, that any Class 1 demolition work is done by a holder of a Class 1 demolition licence and that any Class 2 demolition work is done by a holder of a Class 2 demolition licence during the dismantling of any such communications structures.

This exemption is subject to the following conditions—

- A documented method statement and job safety analysis is to be prepared by a competent person prior to the work commencing.
- The dismantling work is to be directly supervised by a competent person at all times during the dismantling of the structures.
- All personnel involved with rigging work are to hold an appropriate rigging certificate of competency.
- All personnel involved with working at heights are to have completed the appropriate training for this work and be competent in the use of fall injury prevention systems in use.
- Adequate public protection is to be provided and maintained during the structure dismantling process.

- · All adjacent power sources are to be isolated or disconnected during the dismantling.
- All personnel required to work on the communications structures are to have been trained in identifying, monitoring and controlling Radio Frequency Electro-magnetic Emissions.

This exemption is valid until 31 August 2003.
