Grain Marketing Act 2002

Grain Marketing Amendment Regulations 2003

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Grain Marketing Amendment Regulations 2003*.

2. The regulations amended

The amendment in these regulations is to the *Grain Marketing Regulations 2002**.

[* Published in Gazette 30 October 2002, p. 5353-7.]

3. Regulations 5, 6, 7 and 8 inserted

After regulation 4 the following regulations are inserted —

5. Annual fee for main export licence

- (1) The person who is the main export licence holder at the beginning of a financial year is required to pay to the Authority for that financial year an annual fee of \$400 000 unless subregulation (4) applies.
- (2) The period commencing on the day on which the *Grain Marketing Amendment Regulations 2003* come into operation and ending on 30 June 2004 is to be regarded as the first financial year to which this regulation applies, and the annual fee for that year is the proportion of \$400 000 that the number of days in the period represents of a full year.
- (3) A fee under subregulation (1) or (2) is to be paid
 - (a) as to one half, on or before 15 November in the financial year to which it relates; and

- (b) as to the other half, on or before 15 May in the financial year to which it relates.
- (4) A person who holds the main export licence for a period that is only a part of a financial year is required to pay to the Authority an annual fee for that financial year that is the proportion of \$400 000 that the number of days in the period represents of the full financial year.
- (5) If subregulation (4) applies to a person who has already paid a fee under subregulation (1) for the financial year concerned, the amount paid under subregulation (1) is to be credited towards the fee payable under subregulation (4) except that, to the extent, if any, that it exceeds the fee payable, it is to be refunded to the person.
- (6) A fee under subregulation (4) is to be paid within 14 days after the end of the period to which it relates.
- (7) If the total of the amounts of all revenues for a financial year, as derived from a notice published under regulation 8, exceeds the total of
 - (a) the amounts of all expenses for that year, as derived from a notice published under regulation 8, not including the amount of a rebate, if any, under this subregulation; and
 - (b) the amount, as shown in a notice published under regulation 8, of any rebate under regulation 6(2) paid during that year,

the excess is to be repaid as a rebate to the person who paid a fee under this regulation or, if more than one fee was paid for the year, is to be distributed as rebates between the persons paying in proportion to the parts of the financial year for which each of those persons paid a fee that was not refunded.

6. Special export licence application fee

(1) The application fee that section 35(1) of the Act requires is to accompany an application for a special export licence is as shown in the Table to this subregulation.

- (2) If the amount that a person pays as a special export licence application fee exceeds the State's expenses, as shown in a notice published under regulation 8, attributable to the deciding of the application and the determination of any appeal under section 40(5) of the Act, the excess is to be repaid as a rebate to the person who paid the fee.
- (3) The rebate is payable as soon as the circumstances described in subregulation (2) are established.

7. Annual fee for special export licence

- (1) A person who holds a special export licence is required to pay to the Authority for each financial year for the whole or any part of which the licence is held an annual fee of \$500.
- (2) A fee under subregulation (1) is to be paid upon the grant of the licence and, during the term of the licence, at the beginning of each financial year after the licence is granted.

8. Minister's statement

As soon as practicable after the end of a financial year, the Minister is to cause a notice to be published in the *Gazette* showing —

- (a) for that year the amounts of
 - (i) expenses attributable to the deciding of each application for a special export licence;
 - (ii) expenses attributable to the determination of each appeal under section 40(5) of the *Grain Marketing Act 2002*;
 - (iii) expenses attributable to each grant of a special export licence;
 - (iv) all other expenses incurred in administering the *Grain Marketing Act* 2002;
 - (v) revenue from each application fee for a licence;
 - (vi) revenue from other licence fees; and
 - (vii) all other revenues received under the *Grain Marketing Act 2002*;

and

(b) the amount of any rebate paid under regulation 5(7) or regulation 6(2), specifying the kind of licence to which each rebate relates, and the payment to which the rebate relates.

East Perth Redevelopment Act 1991

East Perth Redevelopment (Return of Redeveloped Land) Supplementary Order 2002

Made under the *East Perth Redevelopment (Subtracted Area)* Regulations 2002 regulation 4 by the Minister.

1. Citation

This order may be cited as the *East Perth Redevelopment* (Return of Redeveloped Land) Supplementary Order 2002.

[Note that according to regulation 4(3) this order takes effect at the beginning of the day after the day on which it is published in the *Gazette*.]

2. Background to this order

- (1) This order supplements the *East Perth Redevelopment (Return of Redeveloped Land) Order 2002** (called the "initial order" in this order).
 - [* Published in Gazette 29 January 2002, p. 477-8.]
- (2) The plan referred to in clause 3(3) of the initial order (called "Plan 1051 EPRA" in this order) does not correctly show the reservation of certain land in accordance with the *East Perth Redevelopment (Subtracted Area) Regulations 2002* regulation 4.


- (3) The intended reservation of that land is as shown on Plan 4.1480/3 held at the office of the Western Australian Planning Commission established under the *Western Australian Planning Commission Act 1985* section 4 (called "Plan 4.1480/3" in this order).
- (4) Schedule 1 contains a representation of a part of Plan 4.1480/3.
- (5) The purpose of this order is to ensure that, as intended, the land has the appropriate reservation under the Metropolitan Region Scheme made under the *Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act 1959* Part III (called the "Scheme" in this order).

3. Metropolitan Region Scheme amended

To the extent that any land referred to in clause 3 of the initial order is shown on Plan 1051 - EPRA to be reserved for a purpose that differs from the purpose for which Plan 4.1480/3 shows the land to be reserved, the Scheme is amended as required to give the land the reservation under the Scheme that is shown on Plan 4.1480/3.

AGRICULTURE AND RELATED RESOURCES PROTECTION ACT 1976

LIST OF DECLARED ANIMALS

Agriculture Protection Board, South Perth. Date: 14 August 2003

Pursuant to Section 37 of the Agriculture and Related Resources Protection Act 1976, the Agriculture Protection Board hereby lists the classes of animals that are for the time being the subject of a declaration made under Section 35 of that Act, together with the matters specified pursuant to subsection (2) of that Section in relation to each class.

The following applies to the list below-

- If a species does not appear in this list and is not an indigenous animal, it is prohibited as a declared animal in categories A1, A2, A3. The meanings of those categories are summarised below. Of these species some (marked *) have been assessed for entry into the state and have been rejected, so they remain prohibited. Prohibited species should be immediately reported.
- If a species does not appear in this list and is an indigenous species, it is not regulated under the *Agriculture and Related Resources Protection Act 1976*, but may be regulated under other legislation.
- It is an offence to liberate or attempt to liberate declared animals or to fail to prevent them being at large.
- Conditions for introduction and keeping of declared animals are specified in the Declared Animals regulations or by Board decision and leaflets are available showing requirements for each species.
- Of the species not subject to declaration that are exempt, some (marked #) occur in a commensal or feral state and advice may be obtained from the Agriculture Protection Board on control or management of problems which they may occasionally cause.

GRAIN MARKETING ACT 2002

MINISTERIAL GUIDELINES FOR THE GRAIN LICENSING AUTHORITY

Issued under Section 16

1. Purpose

The purpose of these guidelines is—

- to assist the Grain Licensing Authority (the Authority) to administer the licensing scheme provisions of the Grain Marketing Act 2002 (the Act);
- · to inform persons involved in the grain industry and other members of the community.

2. Guidelines

The purpose of the Act is not to undermine the benefits of single desk marketing arrangements, but to maximise the benefit of competition in the market place while retaining any identified premium arising from the exercise of market power advantages that are available to the main export licence holder.

2.1 Definition of Premium

Key tasks of the Authority are to determine the existence of a "premium", in the context of section 31(2) of the Act and to assess the effect the issue of a special export licence may have, in the context of section 31(3) of the Act.

Section 31(1) prevents the Authority granting a special export licence with a term beginning prior to 1 November 2003.

Section 31(2) provides that—

Before deciding whether to grant any other special export licence (that is, a licence with a term commencing after 1 November 2003), the Authority is to—

- "(a) ascertain whether the main export licence holder exports prescribed grain to the market for which the special export licence is sought; and
- (b) if so, decide whether the price at which the main export licence holder exports that grain incorporates a premium resulting from the exercise by it of its market power as the main export licence holder."

In this context, a premium is essentially the market advantage that can be leveraged by the existence of a main export licence; that is, the price that can be achieved through a range of mechanisms used by the main export licence holder to control supply and manage the market place.

In deciding whether a premium exists the Authority should take into account all relevant matters, including—

- the market structure and pertinent trade policies for the relevant prescribed grain in a particular market.
- · prices and price trends in the market for the supply of the relevant prescribed grain; and
- · the quality and quantity of grain being exported to a particular market.

If the Authority determines that there is a premium in a market for which a special export licence is sought the Authority must consult the main export licence holder (section 31(3)(a)) and must determine if the granting of the special export licence would affect that premium to a significant extent (section 31(3)(b)).

Section 31(3)(b) provides that—

"The Authority cannot grant the special export license if it considers that to do so would be likely to affect the premium to an extent that the Authority considers to be significant."

The issue of a special export licence will affect a premium to a significant extent if it will damage current or future market access or damage the ability of the main export licence holder to maintain the premium it currently receives. There may also be other circumstances in which the Authority considers that a premium would be likely to be affected to an extent that the Authority considers to be significant.

The Act does not require the Authority to determine that the premium will be significantly affected, only that this is considered likely.

2.2 Section 31(4)

The only other matter that the Act specifically requires the Authority to take into account before issuing a special export licence is the effect that doing so may have on the State's reputation as a grain exporter and on the State's grain industry generally. (See section 31(4))

Beyond the matters referred to in section 31 it is up to the Authority to decide what matters are relevant to be taken into account in determining an application for a special export licence. In most cases these matters will include—

- the predicted production for a season or seasons;
- · the main export licence holder's marketing strategy;
- the ability of the main licence holder to enter into and deliver on long term supply agreements; and
- the world supply, demand and price trends for the relevant prescribed grain and/or its
 equivalent.

2.3 Report to Minister

The Authority is required to report to the Minister as required by section 20 of the Act.

Section 20 provides that—

The Authority is to report to the Minister annually, and whenever directed by the Minister to do so, on—

- (a) the operation and effectiveness of the licensing scheme in Part 3 of the Act; and
- (b) any other matter relating to the operation of the Act that the Minister specifies.

For the purpose of paragraph (b) the matters that the Authority is to report on are:

- the information made publicly available under section 42 of the Act (the number of applications for special export licences for each prescribed grain in each season of production; the total amount of each prescribed grain produced in each season for which a special export licence was sought or granted);;
- · the number of special export licences granted;
- the effect of the issue of special export licences on the operation of the main export licence:
- · the benefits and costs associated with the main export licence and special export licences;
- an annual assessment, to be conducted by the Authority, of the existence and extent of price premiums which result from market power available to the main export licence holder:
- the effect of the licensing scheme on the Western Australian Grains Industry generally;
 and
- any other matters relating to the operation of the Act that the Authority considers should be brought to the attention of the Minister.

FIREBREAK ORDER (SECTION 33)

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 1st October 2003 to plough, scarify, cultivate, or otherwise clear and thereafter maintain free from all flammable material until 31st March 2004, firebreaks in accordance with the following—

1. Rural Land

Owners and Occupiers of lands, other than within a townsite, shall clear of all flammable material firebreaks of at least three (3) metres width as close as practicably possible inside and along the whole of the external boundary of their property or properties.

2. Townsite Land

Owners and Occupiers within a townsite shall—

- (a) Clear of all flammable material the whole of the area where—
 - (i) The area of the land is 2023 square metres or less or,
 - (ii) The land is used for storage of flammable liquids, or
 - (iii) There is a hotel situated thereon.
- (b) If the area of land exceeds 2023 square metres (half an acre)—
 - (i) Clear of all flammable material firebreaks at least two (2) metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land, or
 - (ii) Have the grass mown to a height of not more than 50mm over the whole of the land, except where the land is used for the storage of flammable liquids.

3. Homesteads, Building, Haystacks, Stacks of Fodder, Bulk Fuel, Drums and Liquid Petroleum

Owners and Occupiers of land shall—

During the period from 1st day of October, 2003 to the 31st day of March 2004, inclusive, have firebreaks at least three (3) metres wide in such positions as are necessary to completely surround the perimeter of any homestead, building, fuel installation (including drums), haystack (where such a haystack is situated within 200 metres of any homestead, building, fuel installation) or group of such structures or installations.

4. Harvesting

A fully operational mobile fire-fighting unit complete with a container with at least 400litres minimum capacity of water is to be readily available to any paddock being harvested. A fully operational plough, tillage or cultivator equipment is to be readily available, and in close proximity, to any paddock being harvested. The responsibility to supply these units being that of the landholder.

5. General Information

If for any reason it is considered impractical to comply with any provision of this notice, a written application for a variation may be made to the Shire Council and must reach the Chief Executive Officer by the 30th day of September 2003. Any such application must bear the signature of the Fire Control Officer of the area signifying his agreement to the variation.

If permission for variation is not granted, the terms of this notice must be complied with, or as the Council directs

6. Registration

It is in the interest of all residents to be registered members of the Bush Fire Brigade covering the area in which they own land. Membership of a Brigade is the safest way to ensure cover under the Shire's Fire Insurance Policy which covers personal injury and damage to equipment resulting from fighting bush fires under the direction of a Fire Control Officer.

Flammable Material is defined for the purpose of this order to include bush (as defined in the Bush Fire Act), boxes, cartons, paper and like flammable materials, rubbish and also combustible matter, but does not include green standing trees or growing bushes or plants in gardens or lawns.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of \$250 by infringement notice or not more than \$5000 if prosecuted, and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

Notice to Owners and/or Occupiers of Land

Pursuant to Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954 you are hereby required on or before the **2nd November**, **2003**, or within 14 days of the date of you becoming owner or occupier should this occur after **2 November 2003**, to remove from the land owned or occupied by you, all inflammable material or to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following requirements, and thereafter to maintain the land or the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including the **31st day of March**, **2004**

GENERAL

- 1. Where the area of land is less than 100 hectares, clear and maintain firebreaks at least 3 metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and immediately surrounding all buildings on the land.
- 2. Where the area of land is greater than 100 hectares, clear and maintain firebreaks—
 - (a) at least 3 metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and immediately surrounding all buildings on the land, and
 - (b) at least 3 metres wide in such a position so as to divide the land into the areas not exceeding 100 hectares, with each area to be enclosed by such a firebreak.

FUEL DUMPS

On all land where fuel drum ramps are located and where fuel dumps, whether containing fuel or not, are stored, clear and maintain a firebreak at least four metres wide around any drum, ramp or stack of drums.

HAY STACKS

Clear and maintain a firebreak at least 3 metres wide completely surrounding any haystack on the land, within 60 metres of the haystack.

PINE PLANTATIONS

- 1. Clear and maintain a firebreak at least 10 metre wide—
 - (a) immediately surrounding any area of land on which pine trees are planted,
 - (b) along the boundary of those portions of pine plantations which adjoin a formed public road; and
 - (c) in such positions so that the area of pine plantation bounded by each firebreak does not exceed 200 hectares.
- 2. Clear and maintain firebreaks at least 6 metres wide (including the firebreaks referred to in (a) above) in such positions so that the area bounded by each firebreak does not exceed 25 hectares.

In addition, to the firebreaks required by this notice, pine plantations traversed by Western Power transmission lines have additional obligations under the State Energy Commission Act.

BURNING

The requirements of this notice to provide a firebreak, other than an alternative or strategic firebreak may be carried out by burning. That burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954.

ALTERNATIVE FIREBREAKS

- (a) Should you consider it to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or remove inflammable material from the land as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council in writing on or before the 15th October, 2003, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted in writing by the Council prior to 2 November 2003, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice
 - (b) When written permission to provide alternative firebreaks has been granted, you shall—
 - (i) comply with all conditions endorsed on the permit.
 - (ii) provide firebreaks at least 3 metres wide in the agreed position(s) on the land.
- 2. (a) Where the Council has, in writing, approved a Fire Management Plan and the Fire Management Plan depicts an array of alternative firebreaks, an owner may as an alternative to the construction of a general firebreak, elect to provide the alternative firebreak depicted on the Bushfire Management Plan. However, where the alternative firebreak is not constructed by the date required by this notice, the general firebreak requirements shall apply.
 - (b) Any alternative firebreak provided for under (c) above shall be of the same width requirements as that applicable to a general firebreak but shall be limited to the extent and location depicted on the Bushfire Management Plan.

STRATEGIC FIREBREAKS

(a) Where, under an agreement with the Council, or where depicted on an approved Bushfire Management Plan, strategic firebreaks are required to be provided on the land you are required to clear and maintain firebreaks at least **6 metres wide** in the agreed position.

(b) Strategic firebreaks shall be graded to provide a continuous trafficable surface (suitable for 4 wheel drive vehicles) at least 4 metres wide unimpeded by obstructions including boundary or dividing fences unless fitted with approved gates.

FIREBREAK CONSTRUCTION

Without affecting the generality of any other provision herein requiring trafficable firebreaks, all firebreaks required by this order on properties greater than 5 hectares in area shall be constructed and maintained in a condition trafficable by 4 wheel drive vehicles. Overhanging trees abutting firebreaks shall be pruned to minimise accumulation of litter and to allow unimpeded access to vehicles up to 4 metres high.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

NOTICE TO ALL OWNERS/OCCUPIERS OF LAND

In the interest of minimising fire hazards and protecting all Shire residents, landowners / occupiers are required before the 1st December 2003 to remove all inflammable matter or to clear firebreaks as detailed in the following notice and maintain the land or the firebreaks clear of all inflammable matter up to and including the 31st March 2004. Following are the details of fire prevention measures required before 1st December 2003 or within 14 days of you becoming the owner or occupier, should this be after the 1st December 2003.

Failure or neglect to comply with this notice renders you liable to infringement action—a fine of \$250 or \$5000 if court action is taken.

1. Property with building on with an area of less than 4,000 square metres.

Slash all grass and clear all dead inflammable matter to a height no greater than 5cm.

Prune all trees and shrubs around all buildings to provide a safety zone.

Clean all the roofs and gutters of inflammable matter.

2. Vacant land with an area of less than 4,000 square metres.

Slash all grass and clear all dead inflammable matter to a height no greater than 5cm.

Install a three metre wide firebreak by removing all dead inflammable matter immediately inside all external boundaries and to a vertical height of four metres.

3. Property with building on with an area greater than 4,000 square metres.

Slash all grass and clear all dead inflammable matter to a height no greater than 5cm.

Install a three metre wide firebreak by removing all dead inflammable matter around all buildings and immediately inside all external boundaries of each lot and to a vertical height of four metres.

Prune all trees and shrubs around all buildings to provide a safety zone.

Clean all the roofs and gutters of inflammable matter.

4. Vacant land with an area greater than 4,000 square metres. GRASSED.

All grass to be slashed to a height no greater than 5cm. If property is stocked, the number of livestock must be able to graze the grass down by the end of December to a safe fuel loading. (Grass flattened)

Install a three metre wide firebreak by removing all dead inflammable matter around and immediately inside all external boundaries of each lot and within twenty metres of and surrounding, the perimeter of any haystacks or stockpiled inflammable matter.

BUSH.

Install a three metre wide firebreak by removing all dead inflammable matter around and immediately inside all external boundaries of each lot and all buildings (also create a twenty metre wide low fuel zone around such areas). All firebreaks are to be cleared to a vertical height of four metres to allow access for emergency vehicles.

Fuel loadings of dead inflammable matter should be maintained at a safe level to enable firefighters to control a fire under wildfire conditions. Fuel loadings need to be maintained under 8 tonnes per hectare.

In some circumstances, eg large blocks, additional requirements may apply.

5. Fuel Dumps and Depots.

Remove all inflammable matter from land where fuel drums ramps or dumps are located, and where fuel drums, whether containing fuel or not, are stored to a distance of at least ten metres outside the perimeter of any drum, ramp or stack of drums.

6. General

The Firebreak Inspection Officers will commence inspection of firebreaks and fire hazards early in the season, and will provide advice on potential fire hazards and suggested remedial measures.

Where the owner or occupier of the land who has received notice fails or neglects to comply with the requisitions within the time specified, the Shire of Kalamunda may, by its officers and with such servants, workmen and contractors, vehicles and machinery as the officers deem fit, enter upon the land and carry out the requisitions of the notice which have not been complied with. The amount of any costs and expenses incurred shall be recovered from you as the owner or occupier of the land.

Although the Bush Fires Act does specify penalties for not taking appropriate fire prevention action, the need for all residents to protect not only their own home and possessions but also those of neighbours and other Shire residents should be the overriding concern.

If the prevention measures are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act, which includes the necessity for permits to burn during the restricted burning season.

Restricted—Permits Required

2nd November to 30th November

1st April to 30th April

Prohibited—Burning Time (Total Fire Ban) 1st December to 31st March

These Dates Can Be Varied Due To Seasonal Condition. (extended or shortened)

7. Application to vary the above requirements.

If it is impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable matter from the land as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council in writing on or before November 2003 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions, or take alternative measures to abate the fire hazards on the land.

If permission is not granted in writing by Council, you shall comply with the requirement of this notice.

8. Approved methods of fuel reduction

Slashing, mowing, chemical spraying, raking and mowing and Council's kerbside pick up.

Council staff are available to provide advice and further information on requirements, and the various passive and active measures that may be taken to minimise the fire risk of living in the Hills environment.
