LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995 AGRICULTURE AND RELATED RESOURCES PROTECTION ACT 1976

PEST PLANTS LOCAL LAW

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the above-mentioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Town of Kwinana hereby records having resolved on 8 October 2003 to make the following local law.

Citation

1. This local law may be cited as the $Town\ of\ Kwinana\ Pest\ Plants\ Local\ Law.$

Interpretation

- 2. In these local laws, unless the context otherwise requires—
 - "district" means the district of the Town of Kwinana
 - "local government" means the Town of Kwinana
 - "pest plant" means a plant described as a pest plant by clause 4 of these local laws.
- 3. These local laws apply in respect of the district.
- 4. Every plant described in the First Schedule of these local laws is a pest plant.
- 5. The local government may serve on the owner or occupier of private land within the district, notice requiring him/her to destroy, eradicate or otherwise control any pest plant on that land and any person so served shall comply with that notice within the time and in the manner specified therein.

- 6. Where a person fails to comply with a notice under clause 5 of these local laws served upon him/her, the local government may— $\,$
 - (a) without payment of any compensation in respect thereof, destroy, eradicate or control, as the case may be, any pest plant the destruction, eradication or control of which was required by the notice; and
 - (b) recover in a court of competent jurisdiction from the person to whom the notice is directed, the amount of the expense of such destruction, eradication or control.

RETAIL TRADING HOURS ACT 1987

RETAIL TRADING HOURS (CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR) EXEMPTION ORDER 2003 Made by the Minister for Consumer and Employment Protection.

Part 1—Preliminary

1. Citation

This order may be cited as the Retail Trading Hours (Christmas and New Year) Exemption Order 2003.

2. Interpretation

In this order—

"motor shop" means a general retail shop or portion of a general retail shop, as the case requires—

- (a) in, on or from which motor vehicles are sold by way of retail sale; or
- (b) in, on or from which spare parts are sold by way of retail sale in conjunction with the sale of motor vehicles.

3. Application

- (1) This order applies to all general retail shops, other than motor shops, in the Perth metropolitan area.
- (2) This order does not affect the operation of the Retail Trading Hours Exemption Order (No. 12) 1994.
- (3) This order does not affect the operation of the Retail Trading Hours (Rockingham) Exemption Order 1995.
- (4) This order does not affect the operation of the Retail Trading Hours (Wanneroo) Exemption Order 1995.

Part 2—Exemptions from Act provisions

4. Application of current exemption order

The Retail Trading Hours (Tourism Precincts) Exemption Order 1996 does not apply to a general retail shop on a day to which the Part applies.

5. Sunday 14 December 2003

Each general retail shop to which this order applies is exempted from section 12(1)(d) of the Act on Sunday 14 December 2003 provided the shop is closed on that day until 10.00am and from and after 5.00pm.

6. Friday 19 December 2003

Each general retail shop to which this order applies is exempted from section 12(1)(a) of the Act on Friday 19 December 2003 provided the shop is closed on that day until 8.00am and from and after 9.00pm.

7. Sunday 21 December 2003

Each general retail shop to which this order applies is exempted from section 12(1)(d) of the Act on Sunday 21 December 2003 provided the shop is closed on that day until 10.00am and from and after 5.00pm.

8. Monday 22 December 2003

Each general retail shop to which this order applies is exempted from section 12(1)(a) of the Act on Monday 22 December 2003 provided the shop is closed on that day until 8.00am and from and after 9.00pm.

9. Tuesday 23 December 2003

Each general retail shop to which this order applies is exempted from section 12(1)(a) of the Act on Tuesday 23 December 2003 provided the shop is closed on that day until 8.00am and from and after 9.00pm.

10. Friday 2 January 2004

Each general retail shop to which this order applies is exempted from section 12(1)(a) of the Act on Friday 2 January 2004 provided the shop is closed on that day until 8.00am and from and after 9.00pm.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

City of Bunbury

BUSH FIRE NOTICE AND REQUIREMENTS

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act, 1954, it is hereby notified that owner/occupiers of land with the District of the City of Bunbury are required to carry out fire prevention work on in accordance with the provisions of this notice. This work must be carried out no later than 30 November 2003 and kept maintained throughout the summer months until 10 May 2004. The penalty of non-compliance with this notice is a maximum of \$1000, and not withstanding prosecution, Council may enter upon the land and carry out required works at the owners/occupiers expense.

REQUIREMENTS

1. Rural and Townsite Land (includes residential, commercial and industrial)

- (a) Where the area of land is 2024m² (approximately 1/2 acre) or less, remove all flammable material on the land except living standing trees, from the whole of the land, and
- (b) Where the area of land exceeds 2024m² provide firebreaks at least 3 metres wide, immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings and haystacks situated on the land. Where several adjoining lots are held or used by the owner/occupier, the firebreaks may be provided inside and along the external boundaries of the group or lots.

2. Rural Land

The owners of all rural holdings zoned as Rural under Town Planning Schemes must maintain clear of all flammable materials, a firebreak not less than three (3) metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land.

3. Fuel and Gas Depots

In respect of land owners and/or occupiers by you on which is situated any container normally used to contain liquid or gas fuel, including the land on which any ramp or supports are constructed, you shall have the land clear of all flammable material.

4. Plantations

Boundary Firebreaks—

On the horizontal plane a firebreak shall be provided 15 metres wide and immediately adjoining all external boundaries of the planted area. The outer 10 metres will be cleared of all flammable

material while the inner 5 metres, i.e. that portion closest to trees may be kept in a reduced fuel state, i.e. by slashing or grazing grass provided that the height of the grass does not exceed 8cm.

On the vertical plane a clear space 4 metres high will be maintained above the outer 10 metres of the firebreak.

Internal Firebreaks—

Plantations shall be subdivided into areas not exceeding 30 hectares by firebreaks 6 metres wide, which shall be cleared of all flammable material. In the vertical plane a clearance of a minimum height of 4 metres from the ground level will be maintained above the firebreak.

5. Campfires

Campfires are totally banned within the whole of the District of the City of Bunbury from 15 November 2003 until 10 May 2004 (inclusive).

Prohibited Burning Time: The 'prohibited burning' time that applies within the District of the City of Bunbury is: 30th December 2003 to 28th March 2004 (inclusive).

Restricted Burning Times: The 'restricted burning' times that applies within the District of the City of Bunbury are 15 November 2003 to 29 December 2003 (inclusive) and 29 March 2004 to 10 May 2004 (inclusive). These dates may be subject to variation according to seasonal conditions, but any changes will be advertised locally.

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks as required by this notice or if natural features render fire-breaks unnecessary, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than 15 November 2003 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, the requirements of this notice shall be complied with. If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bushfires Act.
