BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

(Section 33)

*Shire of Broome***FIREBREAK NOTICE**

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of land in the Shire of Broome.

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before 15 May 2004 and thereafter up to and including 31 December 2004 to have firebreaks clear of all inflammable material in accordance with the following—

- (a) Rural lands, being all land outside townsites and not being land held under pastoral lease, firebreaks are required to be—
 1. Not less than four metres wide inside, along and within 10 metres of the external boundaries.
 2. Not less than three (3) metres wide and within three metres of the perimeter of all boundaries and/or haystacks, or groups of buildings.
- (b) Pastoral lands; being all land outside townsites held under pastoral lease, firebreaks are required to be not less than two metres wide and within three metres of the perimeter of all haystacks, buildings or groups of buildings.
- (c) Townsite land—
 1. Where the area of land is 2,000 square metres or less, all inflammable materials from the whole of the land are to be slashed, ploughed, scarified, cultivated or chemically treated so as to negate any potential fire hazard.
 2. Where the area of the land is greater than 2,000 square metres, a firebreak of not less than two metres in width, immediately surrounding any building or not less than three (3) metres wide inside, along and within two metres of the external boundaries of the land is required.
- (d) Rubbish sites, being all rubbish sites for pastoral station, townsite and community use. Firebreaks are required to be not less than two metres wide and within three metres of the perimeter of the rubbish site.
- (e) Fuel pumps and depots - remove all inflammable material from all land where fuel drum ramps or dumps are located and where fuel drums whether containing fuel or not are stored to a distance of at least five metres outside the perimeter of any drum, ramp or stack of drums.
- (f) The Acts referred to in paragraphs (a) to (d) herein must be performed to the satisfaction of the duly authorised officer of the Shire of Broome.

- (g) If it is considered impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove flammable material from the land as required by this Notice, you may apply to this Council or its duly authorised officer not later than 14 May 2004 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land.
- (h) The penalty for failing to comply with this Notice is a fine of \$5 000 or a prescribed penalty of \$250 on service of an Infringement Notice and a person in default is also liable whether prosecuted or not to pay the cost of performing the work.

Having conducted a special meeting pursuant to section 13(2) of the *Medical Act 1894* (WA) (as amended) ("the Act") to consider the question of whether Dr Hood had been convicted of a criminal offence in this State that in the opinion of the Board might render him unfit to practice as a medical practitioner, and upon hearing Ms Naylor as Counsel Assisting the Medical Board of Western Australia, the Medical Board of Western Australia makes the following orders—

1. It has been established that on 23 February 2004 Dr Rex Hood was convicted in the District Court of Western Australia of three counts of perjury, contrary to section 124 of the *Criminal Code* (WA).

2. The offences of which Dr Hood was convicted are demonstrative of unfitness to practice medicine.
3. The name of the Practitioner is to be removed from the Register of Medical Practitioners.
4. The Practitioner shall pay reasonable costs of the special meeting of the Board.

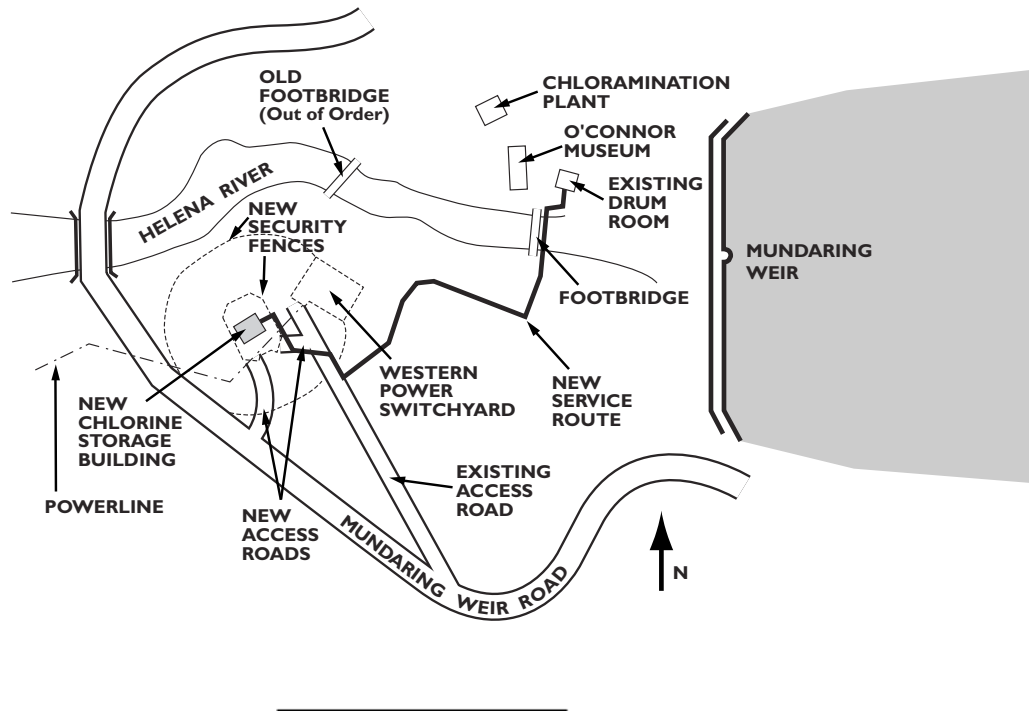
WATER SUPPLY IMPROVEMENTS: MUNDARING WEIR WATER TREATMENT PLANT

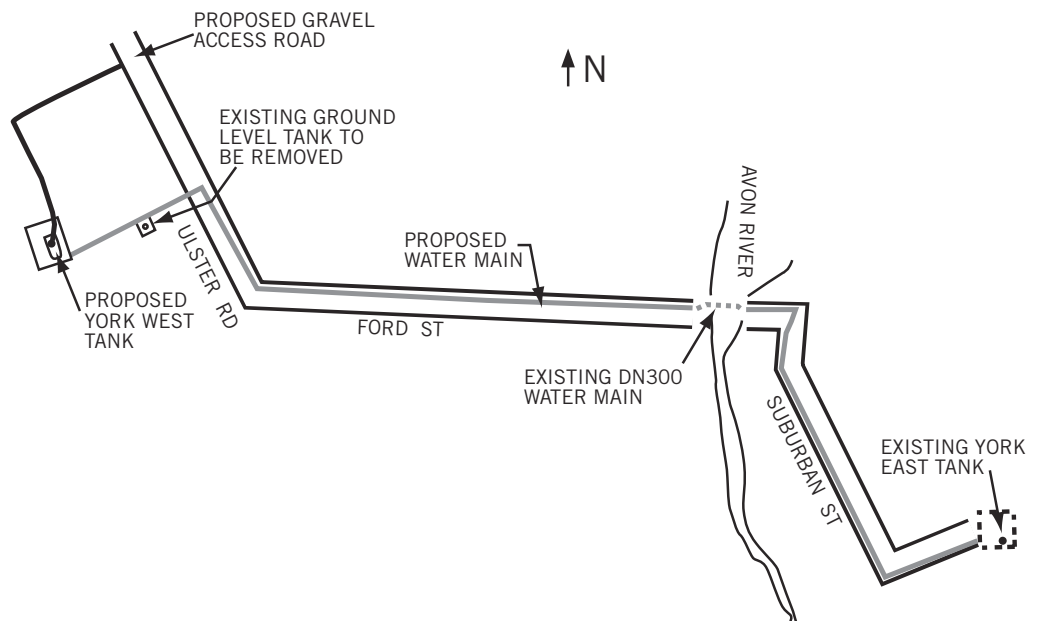

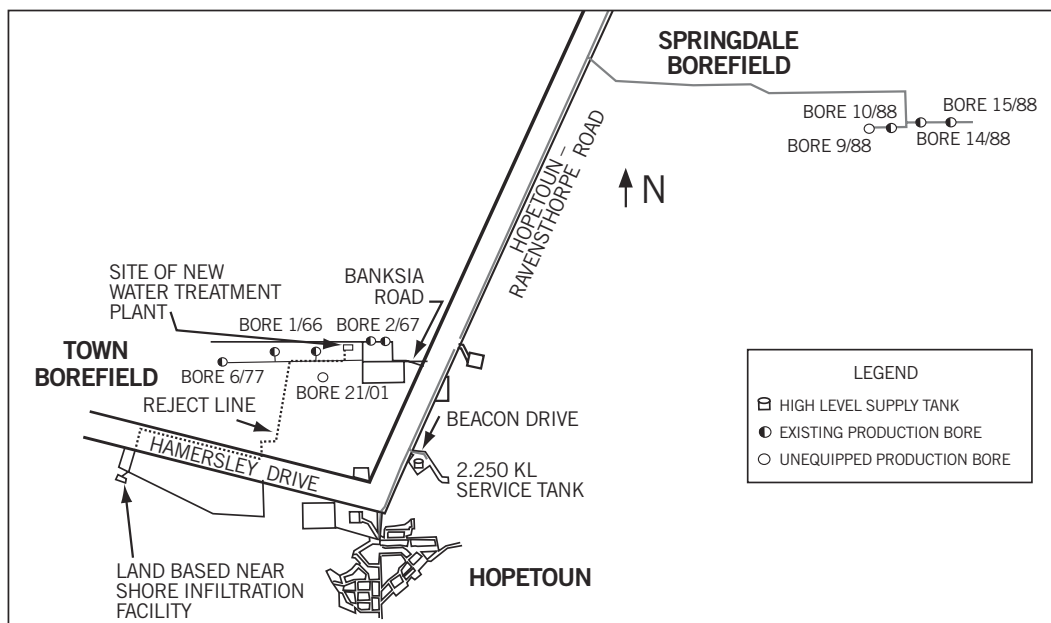
