PETROLEUM (SUBMERGED LANDS) ACT 1967

(Section 119)

PROHIBITION OF ENTRY INTO A SAFETY ZONE

I, William Lee Tinapple, the Director Petroleum and Royalties Division of the Department of Industry and Resources of the said State by instrument of delegation dated 26 March 2004, and pursuant to section 119 of the above Act, hereby prohibit all vessels other than vessels under control of the registered holders of Exploration Permit WA-191-P from entering or remaining in the area of the safety zone without the consent in writing of the Director, Petroleum and Royalties Division. This safety zone extends to a distance of: five hundred metres, measured from—

1. The Disconnectable Single Point Mooring System (DSPM) and the stern of the outer edge of the Floating Production Storage and Offloading facility (FPSO), as it vanes around the DSPM (latitude 19° 18' 09.843" South, longitude 116°36' 43.944" East.*);

2. the Mutineer Manifold (latitude 19°15' 32.715"South, longitude 116°38' 16.333"East.*) and
3. the Exeter Manifold (latitude 19°18' 35.898"South, longitude 116°33' 40.204"East.*)

* note: the above are GDA94 coordinates

Where an unauthorised vessel enters or remains in the safety zone specified in contravention of this instrument, the owner and the person in command or in charge of the vessel are each guilty of an offence against section 119 of the Act and are punishable, upon conviction, by a fine not exceeding \$100,000 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 10 years, or both, pursuant to section 119(3) of the Act.

OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH ACT 1984
OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH REGULATIONS 1996
 EXEMPTION CERTIFICATE PURSUANT TO REGULATION 2.13

(No. 11 of 2004)

I, Brian Thomas Bradley, WorkSafe Western Australia Commissioner, hereby grant an exemption to Demolition Works from the requirements of Regulation 3.123 of the Occupational Safety and Health Regulations 1996 in relation to demolition work at 15 Ray Street, Rockingham.

This exemption is granted from the requirement to demolish in accordance with AS2601, and is subject to the following conditions—

- (i) All adjacent property owners and occupiers are notified of the proposed demolition and prohibited from entering the boundaries of the site during the work;
- (ii) Adequate public protection is maintained around the site;
- (iii) The local authority environmental health officer also approves the methodology proposed;
- (iv) All persons involved in the demolition work wear the appropriate asbestos related PPE at all times during the demolition work;
- (v) The structure is saturated with water prior to and during the demolition work.
- (vi) The demolition work and clearing of the asbestos cement sheeting is carried out over no more than a three (3) day period;
- (vii) The clearing of the asbestos cement sheeting is carried out in accordance with section 9 of the Code of Practice for the Safe Removal of Asbestos [NOHSC:2002 (1988)];
- (viii) All demolished material is treated as asbestos waste material;
- (ix) As far as practicable, the mobile plant used on site does not run over any demolished or waste material; and
- (x) All plant and equipment used on the site be cleaned immediately prior to leaving the site.
- (xi) All other demolition work to be carried out in accordance with the workplan attached to your application and AS2601-2001—*Demolition of Structures*.
