EXTRACTIVE INDUSTRIES AMENDMENT LOCAL LAWS 2004

Pursuant to its powers under the *Local Government Act 1995* and all other powers the Council of the City of Armadale has resolved to make the following local laws.

Upon hearing Ms W. S. Buckley, Counsel Assisting the Medical Board, and Mr A. S. Derrick, Counsel for Dr John Michael Vujcich, on the allegations contained in the Notice of Inquiry issued 26 August 2003 and as amended on 31 March 2004, the Board finds and orders that—

1 Findings

- 1.1 Dr John Michael Vujcich is guilty of gross carelessness as alleged in paragraph 1 of the Amended Notice of Inquiry.
- 1.2 Dr John Michael Vujcich is guilty of incompetence as alleged in paragraph 2 of the Amended Notice of Inquiry.
- 1.3 Dr Vujeich is guilty of gross carelessness as alleged in paragraph 4 of the Amended Notice of Inquiry with respect to the performance of the left ophorectomy.

2 Orders

- 2.1 That Dr John Michael Vujcich be reprimanded.
- 2.2 That Dr John Michael Vujcich be fined \$ 10,000.00.
- 2.3 That the following condition be imposed upon his practice of medicine for a period of two years commencing on 2 April 2004—

All patients under the age of 35 years whom Dr John Michael Vujcich considers require hysterectomy, or where hysterectomy is indicated, be referred for a second gynaecological opinion and for psychological assessment and counselling.

2.4 Dr John Michael Vujcich be responsible for 75 percent of the costs of this Inquiry.

Area 19–Leda/Wellard

Whereas the area has been set aside for urban extensions to Kwinana Town and whereas the area includes the Leda Conservation Reserve and Bush Forever sites and whereas portions of the area have been developed for various residential forms and whereas development constraints and community aspirations need to be considered, the following planning policy shall apply—

- (a) Subdivision and development shall be designed based on the principles contained within Liveable Neighbourhoods and Transit Orientated Design and achieve mixed-use Neighbourhood Centres.
- (b) Subdivision and development shall be in accordance with a Structure Plan and associated documentation approved by the Council and the Western Australian Planning Commission, incorporating the following design objectives—
 - Council shall support a wide range of residential lot sizes and development designs in accordance with the approved Structure Plan.
 - The north-south chain of wetlands shall be integrated into the neighbourhood design and set aside as open space.
 - The recreation slow-ways forming part of the townsite linear parkland system shall be provided for in the Structure Plan and subdivision layout.
 - A central access spine focussing on the Neighbourhood Centre and transit precinct.
- (c) Subdivision design and works should be carried out in such a manner as to retain any feature, specifically the undulating landform, ridgelines and vegetation, which Council considers is practicable to and worthy of preservation.
- (d) Subdivision and development shall be established in such a manner as to avoid contamination of wetland bodies from stormwater and leachates and to minimise intrusion into environmentally sensitive areas.
- (e) Extractive industry is not permitted.
- 2. To include portions of Pt Lot 254 Blacksmith Drive, Pt Lot 271 Leda Boulevard and Pt Lot 242 Silversmith Street, Lot 272 Leda Boulevard and Pt Lot 277 Gilmore Ave within the Fourth Schedule Residential Development Areas, as follows—

Esperance Bay

Acting pursuant to the powers conferred by Section 48A of the Navigable Waters Regulations the department by this notice revokes paragraph (1)(a)(5)(i) of Notice MH404 as published in the Government Gazette on 25 October 1991 and hereby defines and sets aside the following area of Navigable Water for the purpose of Water Skiing between the hours of Sunrise and Sunset and orders that bathing shall be prohibited therein:

Esperance Bay:

All those waters contained within an area of Esperance Bay commencing at Point A being at the water's edge on the foreshore at the groyne approximately 300 metres north of the Tanker Jetty. Thence seaward following a line offset to the north by 300 metres from the Tanker Jetty to Point B, being 300m from the water's edge. Thence along the continuation of the offset line to Point C, at the intersection of a line joining the Dolphin at the end of the Tanker Jetty and the seaward end of the Western Entrance Breakwater of the Bandy Creek Boat Harbour. Thence in a generally north-easterly direction along the said line to Point D being 300 metres offset to the south-west of the Western Entrance Breakwater. Thence generally north-west and south-west along a line 300 metres offset from the water's edge on the Western Entrance Breakwater and the foreshore to Point E, being approximately 500 metres from the Tanker Jetty until intersecting the water's edge at Point F. Thence generally south-west along the water's edge to Point A. The Points A, B, E and F delimit the Take-off and Landing zone. Points A and F are depicted by signs on the foreshore and buoys in the water.


