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- Material submitted to the Executive Council prior to gazettal will require a copy of the signed Executive Council Minute Paper and in some cases the Parliamentary Counsel's Certificate.
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Periodically the normal *Gazette* publishing times need to be altered to cater for disruption caused by public holidays.

- Easter and Christmas holidays cause disruption each year.
- Australia Day and Anzac Day cause disruption when they fall on a Tuesday or Friday.

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

Title

1. This local law may be cited as the Standing Orders Amendment Local Law 2004.

Commencement

2. This local law comes into operation 14 days after the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

Purpose and Intent

3. (1) The purpose of this Local Law is to include provisions for permissible motions by Council on recommendations from Committees.

(2) The effect of this local law is to provide clarity within the Standing Orders Local Law 1999 on dealing with recommendations from Committees.

PART 2—STANDING ORDERS

Amendment

4. The City of Perth Standing Orders Local Law 1999 published in the *Government Gazette* on 16 November 1999 including amendments, is hereby amended in the following manner—

(1) Insert the following new sub-clause 8.10—

8.10 Permissible motions on recommendation from Committee

- (1) A recommendation made by or contained in a report of a Committee may be—
 - (a) adopted by the Council without amendment or modification;
 - (b) rejected by the Council in its entirety;
 - (c) subject to clause 9.18 amended or modified and adopted with amendments or modifications; or
 - (d) referred back to the Committee for further consideration in accordance with subclause (2).
- (2) A member may at the conclusion of the speech of any other member move without notice that the recommendation or part of it be referred back to the Committee.
- (3) On a motion referred in subclause (2)—
 - (a) the mover may speak for not more than 5 minutes;
 - (b) the seconder is not to speak other than to formally second; and
 - (c) no other debate is to be allowed.
- (4) Where part of the recommendation is referred back to the Committee, the balance of the recommendation is to be dealt with in accordance with this clause.

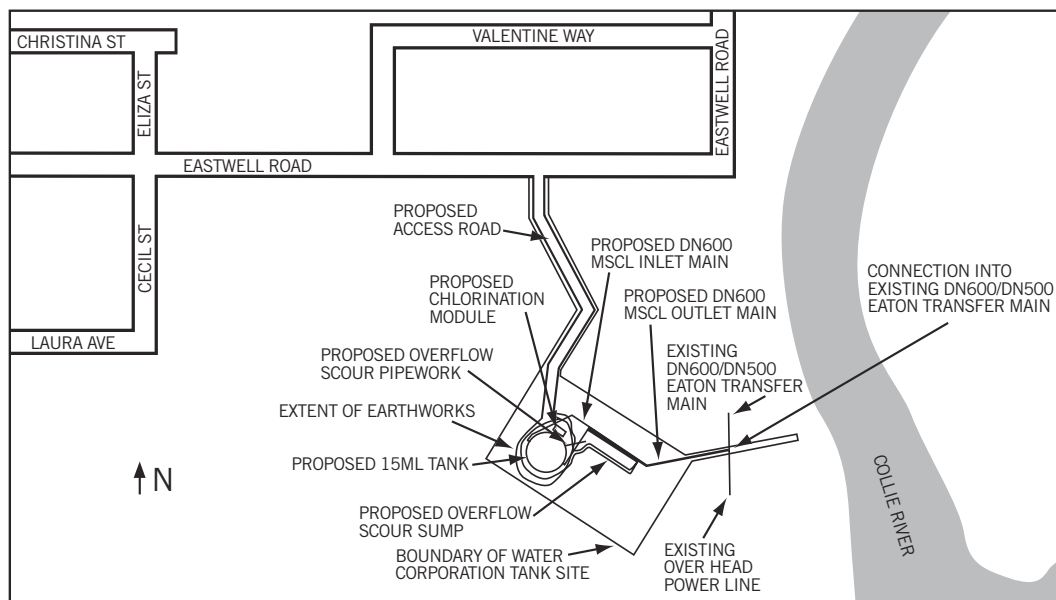
