PART IIA – FIREBREAKS AND RELATED MATTERS

Interpretation

- 2A.1. In this Part, unless the context otherwise requires—
 - "Act" means the Bush Fires Act 1954;
 - "Flammable Matter" includes all forma of vegetation both living and dead, and any other flammable materials and combustible matter;
 - "Firebreak" means ground which is cleared to a mineral earth standard in which all flammable material (which includes vegetation and with all overhanging branches, trees, limbs, etc to be trimmed back clear of the Firebreak area) has been removed and on which no flammable material (which includes vegetation) is permitted during the Firebreak period and the Firebreak must be the required width from the ground up in a vertical line with no restrictions;
 - "Firebreak Period" means the time between 30 November in any year until 31 March in the year following;
 - "Trafficable" means able too be driven around, unhindered, in a standard four-wheel drive vehicle.

Construction of Firebreaks

- 2A.2. All owners and occupiers of land within the district shall clear flammable matter from the land in accordance with the following requirements—
 - (1) As to land which is 2032m² or less is area, or which is zoned "Residential" under the town planning scheme, the owner or occupier is to remove all the flammable matter from the whole of the property, except living trees, shrubs, plants under cultivation and lawns, by slashing or mowing the matter to a height of not more than 50 millimetres, or otherwise to the satisfaction of Council or an authorised person, and the property is to be maintained to the standard so stated in this subsection for the duration of the period 1 October to 31 May each year.
 - (2) As to land, which is greater than $2032 m^2$ in area, shall have a trafficable firebreak three (3) metres in width cleared to mineral earth subject to the following requirements—
 - (a) immediately inside all external boundaries of the land; and

- (b) immediately surrounding all buildings (if any) situated on the land; and
- (c) immediately surrounding all fuel dumps and ramps (if any) on the land; and
- (d) in any event, clear the firebreaks to the satisfaction of Council or an authorised person.
- (3) In reference to subsection (2) all firebreaks must be cleared by the owner or occupier of land on or before 30 November in any year, and thereafter be maintained by the owner or occupier clear of flammable matter up to and including 31 March in the following year.
- (4) Where an owner or occupier of land fails or neglects to comply with this Part of the Local Law within the time specified, an authorised person may with such employees and/or contractors, vehicles and machinery as the authorised person deems necessary enter upon the land and do all such things as necessary to comply with this Local Law and may recover costs and expenses of doing so as a due debt from the owner or occupier of the pursuant to the Act, in addition to any penalty which might be imposed.

Variation to Fire prevention Measures

- 2A.3. (1) If for any reason an owner or occupier considers it impractical to clear firebreaks in accordance with subsection (2) of section 2A.2, the owner or occupier may apply in writing to Council or an authorised person no later than 31 October in any year for approval to construct a firebreak in an alternative position on his or her land.
- (2) If permission is not granted in writing by Council or an authorised person, the owner or occupier must comply with the requirements of this Local Law.
- (3) An exemption or partial exemption granted by Council or an authorised person shall only remain in force until a change of ownership of the land immediately following the date of grant of the exemption or partial exemption.
- (4) In reference to subsection (3) Council reserves the right, at any time, to revoke, alter or add to the provisions of a variation order.

Change of Land Ownership

2A.4. If a person becomes an owner or occupier of land within the firebreak period the owner or occupier must within fourteen (14) days of becoming the owner or occupier of land comply with this Part of the Local Law.

Burning Rubbish, Refuse or other Material

- 2A.5. (1) A person shall not on any land less than 2032m² in area or which is zoned "Residential" under the town planning scheme, set fire to or cause to be set on fire, any rubbish, refuse or other material.
- (2) On land greater than $2032\mathrm{m}^2$ in area a person may set fire to rubbish, refuse or other material provided they have obtained approval from an authorised person. This approval will be subject to—
 - (a) successfully demonstrating that reasonable alternatives do not exist and the potential for pollution is low;
 - (b) the material not including any plastic, rubber, food scraps or other material which may cause the generation of smoke or odour in such quantity as to cause a nuisance to other persons;
 - (c) a haze alert not being issued by the Bureau of Meteorology during the time burning is to take place; and
 - (d) compliance with the *Bush Fires Act 1954* and any conditions as determined by an authorised person.
- (3) Barbeques, solid fuel water heaters, space heaters and ovens fired with dry paper, dry wood, synthetic char or charcoal type fuel will be exempted from this Part of the Local Law unless otherwise prescribed by the *Bush Fires Act 1954*.

Enforcement of this Part

2A.6. A person who fails to comply with any provisions of this Part commits an offence and any fine or penalty shall be as prescribed by the *Bush Fires Act 1954*.

Notice of draft management plan prepared for the Ningaloo Marine Park and of proposal to reserve Western Australian waters.

Ningaloo Marine Park Draft Management Plan and Indicative Management Plan for an Extension to the Existing Marine Park and a Proposed Marine Management Area.

Public notification is hereby given under section 57 of the Conservation and Land Management Act 1984 (CALM Act) of the preparation of a draft management plan for the Ningaloo Marine Park. Notice is also hereby given under section 14 of the CALM Act of a proposal to reserve Western Australian waters under section 13(1) of the CALM Act as an extension to the existing Ningaloo Marine Park and for the Muiron Islands Marine Management Area and that an indicative management plan for these waters has been prepared and is included in the draft management plan for the Park. Notice is hereby given that the proposed extension to the Ningaloo Marine Park and Muiron Islands Marine Management Area are proposed to be classified as Class A.

Any person may make a written submission on this proposal and all persons with an interest in the proposal are encouraged to do so.

Marine parks are created to protect natural features and aesthetic values while at the same time enabling recreational and commercial uses where these activities do not compromise conservation values (the statutory purpose of marine parks is provided in CALM Act section 13B(1)).

The Ningaloo Marine Park comprises all waters reserved as Marine Park Reserve No. 2 under section 13(1) of the CALM Act by an Order in Council published in the Gazette on 3 April 1987 at page 1239.

Marine management areas are created for the purpose of managing and protecting the marine environment so that it may be used for conservation, recreational, scientific and commercial purposes (the statutory purpose of marine management areas is provided in CALM Act section 13C(1)).

The proposed extension to the Ningaloo Marine Park and proposed Muiron Islands Marine Management Area comprise Western Australian waters , including the airspace above those waters and sea-bed to a depth of 200 metres below those waters, bounded by the coordinates listed below.

(NOTE: All coordinates below are based on the Geocentric Datum of Australia 1994 - GDA94).

- *Pastoral lease, is 40m from High Water Mark (HWM) inland but the proposed marine reservations will be bounded by the HWM.
- * HWM is the ordinary (mean of) HWM at spring tides as defined by the Land Administration Act 1997.

Boundaries of the proposed extension to the Ningaloo Marine Park—

All that portion of land and water, contained within and bounded by lines commencing on the western shore of Western Australia's mainland at the intersection of latitude 23°33′55.4040″south and High Water Mark**, and extending—

- westerly along the latitude 23°33′55.4040″south (abutting the southern boundary of the existing Ningaloo Marine Park) to the seaward limit of Coastal Waters for Western Australia (3 nautical miles seaward of the territorial sea baseline), then generally south-westerly along the seaward limit of Coastal Waters for Western Australia to latitude 24°01′51.8160″south, then easterly along latitude 24°01′51.8160″south to the High Water Mark, then generally east and north-easterly along the High Water Mark back to the point of commencement at latitude 23°33′55.4040″south.

Boundary of the proposed Muiron Islands Marine Management Area—

All that portion of the Indian Ocean, contained within and bounded by lines commencing west of the Muiron Islands at the intersection of longitude 114°14′23.4960″east and the seaward limit of Coastal Waters for Western Australia (3 nautical mile seaward of the territorial sea baseline) and extending—

- generally south-easterly (abutting the boundary of the existing Ningaloo Marine Park) to the intersection of latitude $21^{\circ}44'51.2160"$ south and longitude $114^{\circ}17'18.4920"$ east, then generally north-easterly to the intersection of latitude $21^{\circ}44'29.6520"$ south and longitude $114^{\circ}25'43.3200"$ east, then generally north-easterly to the intersection of latitude $21^{\circ}42'24.6600"$ south and longitude $114^{\circ}27'29.4840"$ east, then generally north-westerly to the intersection of latitude $21^{\circ}36'34.1640"$ south and longitude $114^{\circ}25'54.1560"$ east, then generally north-westerly to the intersection of longitude $114^{\circ}22'26.9760"$ east and the seaward limit of Coastal Waters for Western Australia, then generally south-westerly along the seaward limit of Coastal Waters for Western Australia back to the point of commencement at the intersection of longitude $114^{\circ}14'23.4960"$ east.

A draft management plan for the Ningaloo Marine Park and indicative management plan for the proposed extension to the existing Park and Muiron Islands Marine Management Area have been prepared outlining how the Ningaloo Marine Park, proposed extension and Muiron Islands Marine Management Area would be managed. This plan includes a map and details of the boundaries, zoning and management strategies for the existing marine park, proposed extensions and marine management area.

The proposed management zones for both the existing marine park and the proposed extension to the Park are intended to be classified under CALM Act section 62(1a) as general use area, sanctuary area and recreation area.

Eleven recreation areas are proposed. The following activities are considered to be incompatible with the purpose of these areas: all commercial fishing activities; pearling; aquaculture; mineral and petroleum drilling and development; recreational netting; recreational specimen collecting; recreational and spearfishing on compressed air, and all spearfishing between Tantabiddi well and Winderabandi Point.

In the proposed Muiron Islands Marine Management Area there are three areas that are intended to be classified under CALM Act section 62(1b), for the purpose of flora/fauna protection.

Copies of the Ningaloo Marine Park Draft Management Plan and Indicative Management Plan for a Proposed Extension to the Existing Marine Park and the Proposed Muiron Islands Marine Management Area can be inspected at the office of the Shire of Exmouth and the Exmouth Public Library.
