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- Easter and Christmas holidays cause disruption each year.
- Australia Day and Anzac Day cause disruption when they fall on a Tuesday or Friday.

Agriculture and Related Resources Protection (Property Quarantine) Amendment Regulations 2005

1. Citation

- (ii) whether or not grown on the land, including any flower, fruit, seed or timber; or

Wildlife Conservation Act 1950

Wildlife Conservation (Specially Protected Fauna) Notice 2005

Made by the Minister for the Environment under section 14(2)(ba) of the Act.

1. Citation

This notice is the *Wildlife Conservation (Specially Protected Fauna) Notice 2005*.

2. Interpretation

In this notice —

"taxon" includes any taxon that is described by a family name or a genus name or any other name or description.

Note: The plural form of "taxon" is "taxa".

3. Declaration of specially protected fauna

For the purposes of the Act, all taxa of the fauna —

- (a) specified in Schedule 1, being fauna that is rare or likely to become extinct, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection;
- (b) specified in Schedule 2, being fauna that is presumed to be extinct, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection;
- (c) specified in Schedule 3, being birds that are subject to an agreement between the governments of Australia and Japan relating to the protection of migratory birds and birds in danger of extinction, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection; and
- (d) specified in Schedule 4, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection, otherwise than for the reasons mentioned in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c).

4. Revocation

The Wildlife Conservation (Specially Protected Fauna) Notice 2004 is revoked.

Made by the Minister for the Environment under section 23F(2) of the Act.

1. Citation

This notice is the *Wildlife Conservation (Rare Flora) Notice 2005*.

2. Interpretation

In this notice —

"extant" means known to be living in a wild state;

"protected flora" means any flora belonging to the classes of flora declared by the Minister under section 6 of the Act to be protected flora by notice published in the *Gazette* 9 October 1987, at p. 3855;

"taxon" includes any taxon that is described by a genus name and any other name or description.

Note: The plural form of "taxon" is "taxa".

3. Rare flora

Subject to clause 4, protected flora —

- (a) specified in Schedule 1, being taxa that are extant and considered likely to become extinct or rare and therefore in need of special protection; and
- (b) specified in Schedule 2, being taxa that are presumed to be extinct in the wild and therefore in need of special protection,

are declared to be rare flora for the purposes of section 23F of the Act throughout the State.

4. **Application**

Clause 3 does not apply to those plants of a taxon of protected flora specified in Schedule 1 or 2 that have been planted for any purpose other than such plants that have been planted for the purpose of conservation of that taxon and in accordance with approval given by the Executive Director.

In conducting its investigations the Authority is to report on the following matters:

- 1. The current cost to the Water Corporation of providing a bulk potable water supply to Kalgoorlie-Boulder and surrounding regions. This should clearly identify the cost to the State Government through its community service obligations (CSO) payments to the Water Corporation.
- 2. The cost that United Utilities Australia, through its proposed desalinated seawater pipeline from Esperance to Kalgoorlie-Boulder, could provide bulk potable water to Kalgoorlie-Boulder and surrounding regions, over the next 25 years.
- 3. The cost saving to the Water Corporation for the next 25 years if United Utilities Australia did provide Kalgoorlie-Boulder and the surrounding regions with bulk potable water through its proposed desalinated seawater pipeline.
- 4. The impact of each option (points 2 and 3) on the State Government's finances, including borrowings and capital expenditure, tax equivalent and dividend revenue and CSO payments.
- The overall costs and benefits of each option, including the impact on the end consumer and the potential to enhance regional economic development in Kalgoorlie-Boulder and the State generally.

A draft report is to be made available by 6 May 2005. Consultation for this inquiry will be on the basis of the draft report, through invitations for written submissions from industry, government and all other stakeholder groups, including the general community.
