POISONS (AUTHORIZED POSSESSION OF SUBSTANCES) ORDER 2005

Made by the Governor in Executive Council under section 41 of the Act.

Citation

1. This order may be cited as the Poisons (Authorized Possession of Substances) Order 2005.

Commencement

2. This order comes into operation on the day on which it is published in the Gazette.

Interpretation

3. In this order—

"specified person means" Douglas Alfred Clarke, Principal Professional Officer (Chemistry), of the Division of Physical Sciences, School of Engineering Science of the Murdoch University;

"specified place" means the Physical Sciences Building of the Murdoch University, South Street, Murdoch;

"specified substance" means the amount of the substance included in Schedule 9 to the Act, possession and use of which is authorized under clause 4.

Possession and use of certain substance authorized

4. Subject to clause 5, the specified person is authorized to possess and use at the specified place, for educational purposes, not more than 10g of 4—Hydroxybutanoic acid.

Conditions of authorized possession

- 5. The possession and use authorized under clause 4 is subject to the conditions that—
 - (a) the specified substances, when not required for the purposes referred to in clause 4, is stored at the specified place in a secure manner, as directed by the Commissioner of Health;

- (b) written records relating to the specified substance are maintained by the specified person at the specified place, as directed by the Commissioner of Health; and
- (c) that, if requested by the Commissioner of Health, any oral information or written report relating to the specified substance is given by the specified person to the Commissioner.

WESTERN AUSTRALIAN INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS COMMISSION RECLASSIFICATION APPEALS—PRACTICE DIRECTION

GENERAL APPROACH

The Public Service Arbitrator encourages discussion between the parties and the disclosure of relevant information and documentation at all stages of the reclassification appeal process.

Before an Appellant requests that an appeal be listed for hearing, the Respondent should have made the Appellant fully aware of the reasons of the employer (including of the classification review committee) for rejecting the application for reclassification. This should include a copy of any report presented to and relied on by the employer for its consideration, however, it should be recognised that such reports are not always accepted by employers and accordingly may be of little use to the Appellant in considering his/her situation. The Appellant should have had the opportunity to consider his/her position in light of the employer's reasons before deciding to proceed with his/her appeal.

It should be borne in mind that, in determining reclassification appeals, the Arbitrator is performing an administrative review of the decision made by the employer, including the conclusions of the committee. It is not appropriate for parties to adopt an adversarial approach to the proceedings. There will be an opportunity for each party to ask questions of witnesses for the purposes of clarification and elaboration. However, this is not cross-examination in the sense usually undertaken in hearings before the Commission generally.

The appeal should be based on the material that was before the employer and not on new material not previously considered. Where an Appellant seeks to pursue an appeal based in part or in whole on new material not considered by the employer, the Arbitrator is likely to not proceed with the appeal until that has occurred.

PROCEDURE

- 1. At least seven (7) clear working days before the hearing of the appeal, the Appellant is to provide the Arbitrator with a written statement of the facts upon which the Appellant relies to support the appeal and any witness statements, and serve a copy of the statement on the Respondent or its representative.
- 2. At least three (3) clear working days before the hearing, the Respondent is to provide the Arbitrator with a written statement of the basis upon which it relies to resist or otherwise question the appeal and any witness statements, and serve a copy of that statement on the Appellant or the Appellant's representative.
- 3. The material included in the parties' statements is the primary evidence to be considered. Where there is a need for oral evidence, witnesses may be asked questions by the other party with a view to clarifying or eliciting information. However, this is not an opportunity for cross-examination in the traditional sense.

- 4. The evidence presented to the Arbitrator should be confined to that information provided to the employer for consideration of the application for reclassification and the Respondent's reasons for refusing the application.
- 5. The hearing of the appeal will proceed on the following basis:
 - (a) The Appellant or agent may, if desired, make a brief opening statement to outline the basis of the appeal.
 - (b) The Appellant may give evidence to support the appeal which, in the normal course of events, will be confined to those matters raised in the written statements submitted by the Appellant and Respondent.
 - (c) The Respondent may then question the Appellant.
 - (d) The Appellant may then be re-questioned in light of the Respondent's questioning.
 - (e) The Appellant may call any other witnesses.
 - (f) The case for the Appellant then closes.
 - (g) The Respondent through its agent then opens its case and in doing so may make a brief opening statement.
 - (h) The Respondent may give evidence to support its position which, in the normal course of events, will be confined to those matters raised in the written statements submitted by the Appellant and Respondent.
 - (i) The Appellant may then question the Respondent.
 - (j) The Respondent may then be re-questioned in light of the Appellant's questioning.
 - (k) The Respondent may call any other witnesses.
 - (l) The case for the Respondent then closes.
 - (m) The parties may make brief closing statements.
- 6. 1.5 hours is normally set aside for each appeal.

OPERATIVE DATE

The normal practice is that reclassifications are effective from the date on which the employee formally notified the employer that a reclassification is sought.

1.1.2 Minimum Guaranteed Work Program

The applicant's minimum guaranteed proposal (including indicative minimum expenditure) for exploration wells to be drilled, 3D and 2D seismic and other surveying activities, data evaluation and other work, for each year of the first three years of the permit term. This proposal, to be known as the minimum guaranteed work program, should comprise work expected to involve a substantial exploration component—normally, appraisal work should not be included

1.1.3 Secondary Work program

The applicant's proposal (including indicative minimum expenditure) for exploration wells to be drilled, 3D and 2D seismic and other surveying activities, data evaluation and other work, for each of the three remaining years of the permit term. This proposal, to be known as the secondary work program, should comprise work expected to involve a substantial exploration component—normally, appraisal work should not be included.

NOTE: Applicants should note it is mandatory that the minimum work program proposed in each year of the exploration permit is stated precisely to avoid any ambiguity. Proposals for work programs that cannot be guaranteed to be undertaken within the first 3 years of the permit must not be included.

1.2 Particulars of the applicant—

- 1.2.1 the technical qualifications of the applicant and of its key employees
- 1.2.2 the technical advice available to the applicant

1.3 Other Information

Such other information as the applicant wishes to be taken into account in consideration of the application. Where an applicant has previously had an exploration permit cancelled such information might include why the applicant believes the prior failure is irrelevant to the current application.

1.4 Fee

Each application must be accompanied by a fee of \$A4040, payable to the Commonwealth of Australia through an Australian bank or bank cheque.

An information package on the release areas detailing the work program bidding system outlined above and including the criteria for assessment of applications and the conditions to apply following the award of a permit, is available on the Department of Industry, Tourism and Resources Website at www.industry.gov.au/petexp, or on CD-ROM. Copies of the CD-ROM can be obtained through the Department of Industry, Tourism and Resources by e-mailing petroleum.exploration@industry.gov.au.

Obtaining and observing the release package is essential to making an informed application for any of the areas.

The Government will also publish on-line data about Australia's petroleum exploration opportunities. This spatial data gives key hydrocarbon well information (about hydrocarbon shows, biostratigraphic age, porosity and depositional environment) and will be released on the Geoscience Australia internet site at www.ga.gov.au free of charge.

It should be noted that any income derived in the future from the recovery of petroleum from these areas will be subject to the Commonwealth Government's Resources Rent Tax.



EXEMPTION CERTIFICATE PURSUANT TO REGULATION 2.13

(No. 7 of 2005)

I, Nina Lyhne, WorkSafe Western Australia Commissioner, hereby grant an exemption to Raillink Joint Venture from the requirements of Regulation 3.64 of the Occupational Safety and Health Regulations 1996, to permit plant to enter the "danger zone" of an overhead power line, to a distance of not less than 5.2 metres from a live overhead power line, whether insulated or not, of a voltage exceeding 33 000 volts.

This exemption applies only in relation to the 631 scrapers working under the Western Power HV 132kV power lines near Dalrymple Drive, Leda, as part of the Southern Suburbs Railway construction project.

- the installation of adequate signage to warn all plant operators of the overhead dangers.

Exemption No. 6 of 2005 is hereby revoked.

(In accordance with Subregulation (1)(d) the "danger zone" is defined as being within 6.0 metres of such an overhead power line).
