Hospitals and Health Services Act 1927

Hospitals and Health Services (Day Hospital Facility) Determination (No. 2) 2005

Made by the Minister for Health under section 2(3) of the Act.

1. Citation

This determination is the *Hospitals and Health Services (Day Hospital Facility) Determination (No. 2) 2005.*

2. Commencement

This determination comes into operation on the day on which it is published in the *Gazette*.

3. Services that are "professional attention"

- (1) A psychiatric treatment programme that
 - (a) is for a patient who has a mental illness;
 - (b) is provided by a multi-disciplinary team under the direction and supervision of a psychiatrist; and
 - (c) is a half or full day programme that consists of more than one type of mainstream therapeutic activity,

is determined to be professional attention for the purposes of the definition of "day hospital facility" in section 2(1) of the Act.

(2) In this clause —

"mental illness" has the meaning given to that term in the *Mental Health Act 1996* section 4;

"multi-disciplinary team" means a team of health professionals that includes at least one psychiatrist, one clinical psychologist, one registered mental health nurse, one occupational therapist and one social worker;

"psychiatrist" means a medical practitioner whose name is contained in a register of psychiatrists prepared and maintained under the *Mental Health Act 1996* section 4 by the Medical Board.

AGRICULTURE AND RELATED RESOURCES PROTECTION ACT 1976

LIST OF DECLARED ANIMALS

Agriculture Protection Board South Perth.

Date: 18 November 2005.

Pursuant to Section 37 of the Agriculture and Related Resources Protection Act 1976, the Agriculture Protection Board hereby lists the classes of animals that are for the time being the subject of a declaration made under Section 35 of that Act, together with the matters specified pursuant to subsection (2) of that Section in relation to each class.

The following applies to the list below-

- If a species does not appear in this list and is not an indigenous animal or a fish (Class Pisces), it and hybrids thereof are prohibited as declared animals in categories A1, A2, A3. The meanings of those categories are summarised below. Of these species some (marked *) have been assessed for entry into the state and have been rejected, so they remain prohibited. Prohibited species should be immediately reported.
- Unless otherwise specified, declarations cover the entire State of Western Australia.
- Bird species declared in categories A1, A2, A3 are not to be held in private, public or research facilities outside the statutory zoo except by government departments permitted for that purpose by the Board.
- If a species does not appear in this list and is an indigenous species, it is not regulated under the *Agriculture and Related Resources Protection Act 1976*, but may be regulated under other legislation.
- It is an offence to liberate or attempt to liberate declared animals or to fail to prevent them being at large.
- Conditions for introduction and keeping of declared animals are specified in the Declared Animals regulations or by Board decision and documentation is available showing requirements for each species.
- Of the species not subject to declaration that are exempt, some (marked #) occur in a commensal or feral state and advice may be obtained from the Agriculture Protection Board on control or management of problems which they may occasionally cause.

Declaration categories under the Agriculture and Related Resources Protection Act 1976

- A1 Entry prohibited.
- A2 Subject to eradication in the wild.
- A3 Keeping prohibited.
- A4 Entry subject to Department of Agriculture permits and/or conditions.
- A5 Numbers will be reduced/controlled.
- A6 Keeping subject to Department of Agriculture permits and/or conditions.
- A7 A management programme for each species outlines the area and conditions under which controls may be applied. Programmes are for the whole of the State or as indicated for each species.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

City of Bunbury

BUSH FIRE NOTICE AND REQUIREMENTS

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the *Bush Fires Act 1954*, it is hereby notified that owner/occupiers of land with the District of the City of Bunbury are required to carry out fire prevention work in accordance with the provisions of this notice. This work must be carried out no later than 30 November 2005 and kept maintained throughout the summer months until 10 May 2006. The penalty of non-compliance with this notice is a maximum of \$1000, and not withstanding prosecution, Council may enter upon the land and carry out required works at the owners/occupiers expense.

REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Rural and Townsite Land (includes residential, commercial and industrial)
 - (a) Where the area of land is 2024m² (approximately 1/2 acre) or less, remove all flammable material on the land except living standing trees, from the whole of the land; and
 - (b) Where the area of land exceeds 2024m² provide firebreaks free of all flammable material and at least 3 metres wide, immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings and haystacks situated on the land. Where several adjoining lots are held or used by the owner/occupier, the firebreaks may be provided inside and along the external boundaries of the group or lots.

2. Rural Land

The owners of all rural holdings zoned as Rural under Town Planning Schemes must maintain clear of all flammable materials, a firebreak not less than three (3) metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land.

3. Fuel and Gas Depots

In respect of land owned and/or occupied by you on which is situated any container normally used to contain liquid or gas fuel, including the land on which any ramp or supports are constructed, you shall have the land clear of all flammable material.

4. Plantations

Boundary Firebreaks-

On the horizontal plane a firebreak shall be provided 15 metres wide and immediately adjoining all external boundaries of the planted area. The outer 10 metres will be cleared of all flammable material while the inner 5 metres, i.e. that portion closest to trees may be kept in a reduced fuel state, i.e. by slashing or grazing grass provided that the height of the grass does not exceed 8cm.

On the vertical plane a clear space 4 metres high will be maintained above the outer 10 metres of the firebreak.

Internal Firebreaks—

Plantations shall be subdivided into areas not exceeding 30 hectares by firebreaks 6 metres wide, which shall be cleared of all flammable material. In the vertical plane a clearance of a minimum height of 4 metres from the ground level will be maintained above the firebreak.

5. Burning Permits, Burning of Bush, Grass and Garden Refuse

Burning of anything including bush, grass and garden refuse is totally prohibited from $30th\ December\ 2005\ to\ 28th\ March\ 2006\ (inclusive).$

Permits to burn are required for any burning including garden refuse at any time between November 15 2005 and December 29 2005 (inclusive) and between March 29 2006 and May 10 2006 (inclusive).

Permits to burn will only be issued to land owners/occupiers for hazard reduction burning until 30 November 2005 (inclusive). From 1 December 2005 to 29 December 2005 (inclusive), permits to burn will not be issued to land owner/occupiers for hazard reduction burning. Permits to burn will only be issued to fire brigades established in accordance with the *Fire Brigades Act 1942* or the *Bushfires Act 1954* and for any other burning as approved by the Councils Chief Bush Fire Control Officer.

6. Campfires

Campfires are totally banned within the whole of the District of the City of Bunbury from 15 November 2005 until 10 May 2006 (inclusive).

7. Prohibited and Restricted Burning periods

Prohibited Burning Period: The 'prohibited burning' period that applies within the District of the City of Bunbury is 30 December 2005 to 28 March 2006 (inclusive).

Restricted Burning Period: The 'restricted burning' periods that apply within the District of the City of Bunbury are 15 November 2005 to 29 December 2005 (inclusive) and 29 March 2006 to 10 May 2006 (inclusive). These dates may be subject to variation according to seasonal conditions, but any changes will be advertised in a newspaper circulating the Bunbury District.

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks as required by this notice or if natural features render fire-breaks unnecessary, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than 15 November 2005 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, the requirements of this notice shall be complied with. If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bushfires Act.
