GENETICALLY MODIFIED CROPS FREE AREAS ACT 2003

GENETICALLY MODIFIED CROPS FREE AREAS EXEMPTION ORDER 2006

Made by the Minister for Agriculture and Food under Section 6 of the Act.

1. Citation

This is the *Genetically Modified Crops Free Areas Exemption Order 2006*.

2. Duration

This order comes into operation on the day on which it is published in the *Gazette* and remains in force for 12 months from the date of publication.

3. Exemption

The Crown is exempt from the application of section 5(1) of the Act in relation to the cultivation of genetically modified herbicide resistant canola to serve as a control in tests for the unintended presence of genetically modified herbicide resistant canola in non-genetically modified canola.

4. Conditions

This exemption is subject to the following conditions—

- (a) The plants must be cultivated in trays in locked greenhouses at secure locations within the Department of Agriculture's South Perth and Northam premises.
- (b) The plants must not be removed from the greenhouses except to enable them to be sprayed with herbicide and must be returned to the greenhouse immediately after spraying.
- (c) The plants are to be prevented from forming viable seed.
- (d) At the conclusion of the testing the plants and the soil in which the plants were cultivated are to be disposed of using the quarantine approved deep burial method.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

Shire of Wyndham East Kimberley

FIREBREAK ORDER AND BUSHFIRE INFORMATION 2006/2007

(This is a summary of the Order adopted by the Shire of Wyndham East Kimberley under Section 33 of the *Bush Fires Act 1954*.)

In accordance with the provisions of this Order, landowners are required to carry out fire prevention work on land they own or occupy.

Details of work required to be completed are contained in this Order. Work must be completed by 1 June each year.

PERSONS WHO FAIL TO COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE ORDER MAY BE ISSUED WITH AN INFRINGEMENT NOTICE (PENALTY \$250) OR PROSECUTED WITH AN INCREASED PENALTY UP TO (\$1000). IN ADDITION, THE SHIRE MAY CARRY OUT THE REQUIRED WORK AT COST TO THE OWNER OR OCCUPIER OF THE LAND.

There may be instances where it is considered to be impractical to clear firebreaks or remove flammable materials as required by this Order, due to—

- The aggravation of soil erosion;
- The identification of a more effective system of fire prevention; or
- Firebreaks being rendered unnecessary by natural features existing on the land.

In this instance, application may be made to Council not later than 1 April for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions, or to take alternative action to reduce fire hazards on the land.

If Council permission is not forthcoming, then you will be required to comply with the provisions of this Order.

Firebreaks are used primarily to gain access to and provide an area to work from when controlling a fire. They will not stop all fires, and removal of unnecessary flammable material prior to the fire season is your best safeguard against fire threat.

If the requirements of this Order are fulfilled by burning off, then the burning must be carried out in accordance with the relevant provisions of the *Bush Fires Act 1954*.

1. Ord River Irrigation Project Area—

Firebreaks for all land within the Ord Irrigation Area must be—

- Not less than three (3) metres wide inside and along and as close as possible to external boundaries; and
- Not less than six (6) metres wide and within three (3) metres of the perimeter of all buildings and/or haystacks and groups of buildings.

NOTE: This requirement need not be met if the property is being worked, and provided the irrigation channels are in use.

2. Pastoral Lands—

Firebreaks are required to be a distance of not less than six (6) metres wide and within three (3) metres of buildings and/or haystacks or groups of buildings.

3. Townsite Land—

Where the area is 2 000m² or less, all inflammable material (with the exception of standing live trees) shall be removed from the whole of the land by clearing or slashing.

Where the area of the land is greater than 2 000m², a firebreak of not less than six (6) metres in width immediately surrounding any buildings, or not less than three (3) metres in width inside and along the whole of the external boundaries of the land is required.

4. Rural Lands—

Land outside townsites which is not under a pastoral lease requires firebreaks of—

- Not less than four (4) metres wide inside, along and within ten (10) metres of external boundaries; or
- Not less than six (6) metres wide and within three (3) metres of the perimeter of all buildings and/or haystacks or groups of buildings.

5. Rubbish Sites—

All rubbish sites for pastoral stations and communities require firebreaks not less than three (3) metres wide and within three (3) metres of the perimeter of the rubbish site.

6. Fuel Dumps and Depots—

Flammable material must be removed from all land where fuel drum ramps or dumps are located and where fuel drums (whether containing fuel or not) are stored, to a distance of at least fifteen (15) metres outside the perimeter of any drum, ramp or stack of drums.

The acts referred to in paragraphs 1 to 6 herein must be performed to the satisfaction of the duly authorised person appointed by the Shire of Wyndham East Kimberley.

If it is impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove flammable material from the land as required by this Order, you may apply to Council or its duly authorised officer by not later than 1 April for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions, or to take alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land.

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD**1 April to 1 January Each Year**

The Restricted Burning Period now includes Kununurra and Wyndham Townsites, the Ord Irrigation Area and pastoral areas.

PERMITS TO BURN

1. Permits to burn are required for the whole of the Restricted Period, and must be obtained from one of the Fire Control Officers identified for your area (see overleaf).
2. Any special conditions imposed by the Fire Control Officer when issuing permits must be strictly adhered to.
3. The permit holder shall give notice of his intention to burn to—
 - a. The Shire's Kununurra Administration Centre by no later than 24 hours prior to the day when the burning is to take place. Weekend burning must be notified by 4.00pm, Friday.
 - b. The owner or occupier of adjoining land.
 - c. The nearest Department of Conservation and Land Management office if the land is situated within three (3) kilometres of State Forest land, National Park, Nature Reserve or other CALM lands.
4. The period of notice to neighbours prior to burning cannot be more than twenty eight (28) days or less than four (4) days, although lesser notice may be determined by mutual agreement of all neighbours.
5. Your attention is drawn to Items 5, 6 and 7 as listed on the back of the permit.
6. Burning under permit is permitted during the Restricted Burning Period on Sundays and Public Holidays.
7. All landowners and occupiers who suffer a bush fire have an obligation to assist each Area Fire Control Officer to compile a Fire Report Form.
8. Garden refuse (excluding GREEN clippings) burnt on the ground may be lit only between 6.00pm and 11.00pm, and must be completely extinguished with water or earth by midnight. All flammable matter is to be cleared within five (5) metres of all points of the site of the fire, and a person must be in attendance during the whole time the fire is lit.
9. Any incinerator used to burn rubbish must be properly constructed—an open drum (with or without a lid) is not an appropriate incinerator.
10. With reference to Item 8 and 9 of this summary, burning may not take place if the Fire Weather Warning for the day is "Very High", or "Extreme".

Acting pursuant to the powers conferred by Section 67 of the *Western Australian Marine Act 1982*, the department by this notice revokes Notice TR401 as published in the *Government Gazette* on 27 July 1999 relating to the 8 knot speed limit on the Mandurah Estuary in the following waters only—

Mandurah Estuary

All the waters of the Mandurah Estuary bounded by a line commencing from the northern boundary of the Mandurah Traffic Bridge to a line drawn north-north-west from the northern most point of Hall Park to a point on the opposite foreshore 130 metres south east of the southern entrance groyne of the Mandurah Ocean Marina

Providing that this revocation will apply only on 11th March 2006 between the hours 1200 to 1830 and on 12th March 2006 between the hours of 0930 and 1630 and will only apply to bona fide vessels competing in approved aquatic events during Crab Fest 2006 being held by the City of Mandurah.

FURTHERMORE, pursuant to the powers conferred by Section 66 of the *Western Australian Marine Act 1982*, that the above navigable waters will become a Boating Prohibited area that will apply to all vessels, other than bona fide vessels competing in approved aquatic events during Crab Fest 2006.

FURTHERMORE, that subject to Navigable Waters Regulation 48 (a), (b), (c), (d) and (e) that all the above navigable waters may be used for water skiing by bona fide vessels competing in approved aquatic events during Crab Fest 2006 being held by the City of Mandurah.

5.20.2 Land use permissibility within the Rural Groundwater Protection Zone shall be in accordance with the following use permissibilities. All other uses are prohibited within the Zone.

5.20.3 In exercising its discretion in respect of the uses specified under clause 5.20.2, and having regard to the provisions of Statement of Planning Policy No. 2.3, the Council shall only permit such uses where it is satisfied that 'the use does not involve excessive nutrient application or clearing of land, or risk of damage to any on site vegetation or risk of contamination to the Jandakot Groundwater Protection area.

4. Modifying clause 3.1.1 of the Scheme Text by adding reference to the 'Rural Groundwater Protection' zone.

5. Modifying the description of land in appendix 4 of the Scheme Text for 'Special Rural' zone 12 to read as follows—

"Oakford Estate" Those lots and part lots generally bounded by Rowley Road, Nicholson Road, Wolfe Road and Pony Place as depicted on the Scheme Map.

6. Modifying table 1—zoning table of the Scheme Text by inserting a key and column 16 relevant to the 'Rural Groundwater Protection' zone, and including under column 16 the words 'Refer to clauses 5.20.1 through 5.20.3' for all use permissibilities.

7. Deleting the following use classes from table 1—zoning table of the Scheme Text and their associated interpretations from appendix 1 of the Scheme Text—

Fish Farming
Garden Centre
Kennels
Poultry Farming
Public Recreation
Radio & T.V. Installation
Riding School
Stables

8. Modifying the following use class interpretations under appendix 1 of the Scheme Text to read as follows—

Home Business—means a business, service, trade or similar activity carried on in a dwelling or on land around a dwelling which may employ, in addition to the resident of the dwelling, no more than two persons but which—

- does not entail the retail sale, display or hire of goods of any nature;
- does not cause injury to or prejudicially affect the amenity of the neighbourhood;
- does not detract from the residential appearance of the dwelling house or domestic outbuilding;

- (d) does not entail employment of any person not a member of the occupier's household;
- (e) does not occupy an area greater than 50m²;
- (f) will not result in traffic difficulties as a result of the inadequacy of on-site and off-site parking;
- (g) will not result in a substantial increase in the amount of vehicular traffic in the vicinity; and
- (h) does not entail the presence, parking and garaging of a vehicle of more than 3.5 tonne tare weight.

Home Occupation—means an occupation carried on in a dwelling or on land around a dwelling by a resident of the dwelling which—

- (a) does not entail the retail sale, display or hire of goods of any nature;
- (b) does not cause injury to or prejudicially affect the amenity of the neighbourhood;
- (c) does not detract from the residential appearance of the dwelling house or domestic outbuilding;
- (d) does not entail employment of any person not a member of the occupier's household;
- (e) does not occupy an area greater than 20m²;
- (f) does not display a sign exceeding 0.2m² in area;
- (g) will not result in the requirement of a greater number of parking facilities than normally reserved for a single dwelling, and will not result in a substantial increase in the amount of vehicular traffic in the vicinity; and
- (h) does not entail the presence, parking and garaging of a vehicle of more than 1 tonne tare weight.

Horticultural Pursuit—means the use of land for any purpose set out hereunder and the use of buildings normally associated therewith—

- (a) The growing of vegetables, cereals or food crops;
- (b) The growing of vines, trees, plants, shrubs or flowers for replanting;
- (c) The sale of produce grown solely on the lot or on any adjoining or nearby lot forming part of the same landholding used for horticultural pursuits;

but does not include Floriculture (Extensive), Hydroponics, Orchardring, Viticulture or Plant Nursery.

Industry Extractive—means an industry which involves—

- (a) the extraction of sand, gravel, clay, soil, rock, stone, minerals, or similar substance from the land, and also includes the management of products from any of those materials when the manufacture is carried out on the land from which any of the materials so used is extracted or on land adjacent thereto, and the storage of such materials or products; and
- (b) the production of salt by the evaporation of salt water.

9. Introducing the following use classes in alphabetical and sequential order into table 1—zoning table of the Scheme Text and their associated interpretations into appendix 1 of the Scheme Text—

Animal Husbandry—means any land used for the development of land for the keeping, rearing or fattening of livestock, rabbits (for either meat, or fur production), but does not include pigs, poultry (for either egg or meat production which is not housed) and other livestock in feedlots and which are in excess of the recommended stocking rates by Agriculture WA.

Aquaculture—shall have the same meaning as given to the term in and for the purposes of the Fish Resources Management Act 1994.

Apiary—means the keeping of bees.

Cattery—means the use of an approved outbuilding constructed in accordance with the Health Act Model By-Laws Series 'A' Part One—General Sanitary Provisions, 1927 for the purpose of keeping more than three (3) cats over the age of three (3) months.

Dog Kennels—means any land or buildings used for the boarding and breeding of dogs where such premises are registered or required to be registered by the Council, and may include the sale of dogs.

Equestrian Activity—means any land or buildings used for the showing, competition or training of horses and includes a riding school.

Floriculture (Extensive)—means the production of vegetables, flowers, exotic and native plants.

Fodder and Pasture—means the development of land for non-irrigated fodder production and non-irrigated pasture but does not include turf farms.

Hobby Farm—means any land or building used for the keeping of farm animals or the growing of vegetables, fruit and flowers for non-commercial purposes or sale.

Hydroponics—means the production of vegetables, flowers, exotic and native plants, fruit and nuts using hydroponic systems for the delivery of water and nutrients to the plants.

Nursery—see plant nursery.

Orcharding—means the production and operation of a fruit nurseries.

Plant Nursery—means any land or buildings used for the propagation, rearing and sale of plants and the storage and sale of products associated with horticultural and garden activities.

Poultry Farm (Housed)—means any land or buildings used for hatching, rearing or keeping of poultry for either egg or meat production which does not constitute an offensive trade within the meaning of the Health Act 1911.

Private Tree Plantation—means any land used for growing timber for commercial purposes.

Radio, TV and Communication Installation—means any land or buildings used for the transmission, relay or reception of signals or pictures, both commercial and domestic, but does not include a communications antennae domestic.

Recreation Public—means land used for a public park, public gardens, foreshore reserve, playground or other grounds for recreation which are usually open to the public without charge.

Stable—means any land, building or structure used for the housing, keeping and feeding of horses, asses and mules and associated incidental activities.

Stall-wayside—means a place, stand, vehicle or other thing which offers for sale to the general public, produce or any commodity which is grown or manufactured on the land/site, upon which the place, stand, or vehicle is located.

Viticulture—means the production of grapes.
