2. The regulations amended

The amendment in these regulations is to the *Workers' Compensation and Injury Management Regulations 1982**.

[* Reprint 5 as at 3 February 2006.]

3. Regulation 17AE inserted

After regulation 17AD the following regulation is inserted —

17AE. Amount prescribed for funeral expenses - clause 17(2)

- (1) For the purposes of the Act Schedule 1 clause 17(2), the amount prescribed for funeral expenses is
 - (a) for the period up to and including 30 June 2007, \$7 547; and
 - (b) for a financial year commencing on or after 1 July 2007, in accordance with section 5A of the Act, the amount obtained by —
 - (i) varying the amount applying at the end of the preceding financial year by the percentage by which the March CPI varies from the previous March CPI; and

".

- (ii) rounding the amount to the nearest whole number of cents (with an amount that is .5 of a cent being rounded off to the next highest whole number of cents).
- (2) In this regulation
 - "March CPI", for a financial year, means the index number for the quarter ending on the last 31 March before the financial year commences, as shown in the Consumer Price Index Numbers (All Groups Index) for Perth published by the Commonwealth Statistician under the Commonwealth *Census and Statistics Act 1905*.

CONSERVATION AND LAND MANAGEMENT ACT 1984

PROPOSED COMMERCIAL TOURISM OPERATIONS, CERTAIN PARKS AND RESERVES OF THE KIMBERLEY

Compatible Operations Notice

Department of Environment and Conservation.

The Department of Environment and Conservation (DEC) invites public submissions on the proposal to conduct commercial tourism operations in the following parks and reserves of the Kimberley—

- Mirima National Park
- Brooking Springs Conservation Park
- Tunnel Creek National Park
- Windjana Gorge National Park
- Geikie Gorge National Park

Commercial tourism operations include activities such as bushwalking, 4 wheel drive safari tours, camping, accommodation and aerial tours by both helicopters and fixed wing aircraft.

As management plans do not exist for these parks, the *Conservation and Land Management Act 1984* [Section 33 (3)] requires the Department to notify the public of intentions to conduct 'compatible operations' (meaning operations compatible with the purpose of a national or conservation park) and seek public comment on those operations.

All commercial activities and facilities on DEC managed lands are licensed or operated under a lease issued by the Department following consultation with Park Councils and the vesting body (either the Conservation Commission of Western Australia or the Marine Parks and Reserves Authority) and approval by the Minister for the Environment.

SCHEDULE

AMENDING STATUTE NO.1 OF 2006

1. STATUTE 7—MATRICULATION OR ADMISSION TO THE UNIVERSITY

The title of the Statute is amended to "Admission to Courses of the University"

Clauses 1 to 4 inclusive are deleted and replaced by the following-

- 1. Admission to courses of the University is governed by regulations approved by the Senate and rules approved by the Academic Board.
- 2. The Academic Board has responsibility for administering the rules and regulations relating to admission to courses of the University and may delegate this responsibility to a faculty, board or committee.
- 3. All applicants for admission to a course of the University are required to produce satisfactory documentary evidence of their qualifications and proof of identity and citizenship and may be required to produce evidence of good character.
- 4. The Academic Board, on the recommendation of a faculty, may permit a person, on payment of the prescribed fees, if any, to attend a series of lectures or receive practical instruction without undergoing any preliminary test of their ability.




