WELLINGTON NATIONAL PARK AND WESTRALIA CONSERVATION PARK

Draft Management Plan

The Conservation Commission of Western Australia advises that the draft management plan (the Plan) for Wellington National Park and Westralia Conservation Park has been released for public comment.

The Plan covers Wellington National Park, Westralia Conservation Park, proposed Westralia Interim Forest Conservation Area and the Wellington Discovery Forest Reserve, which are located about 195 km south of Perth and 7 km west of Collie. It contains information relevant to the management and protection of the reserves and makes recommendations for adoption in a final management plan.

INTENTION TO AMEND AN ENTRY IN THE REGISTER OF HERITAGE PLACES

It is proposed that the entry in the Register of Heritage Places ("the Register") relating to *P1372, Kellerberrin Post Office & Residence* located at 58 Massingham Street, Kellerberrin ("the Place") be amended pursuant to section 54(1) of the *Heritage of Western Australia Act 1990*.

The reason for the proposed amendment is to include the adjacent Bank of New South Wales (fmr) into the Place, creating *P17504 Kellerberrin Post Office and Residence and Bank of New South Wales (fmr) Group* located at 58 & 60 Massingham Street, Kellerberrin. LG501***BUSH FIRES ACT 1954***Shire of Gingin***FIREBREAK ORDER 2006/2007**

Notice is hereby given to landowners/occupiers within the Shire of Gingin that firebreaks must be installed by 1 November 2006 and maintained clear of flammable material up to and including 31 May 2007.

RURAL (FARM) FIREBREAKS (Properties 20ha {50 acres} or larger).

Clear a firebreak of all flammable material, for a width of no less than three metres (3m), immediately inside the external boundaries of the property.

Trees must be trimmed back to provide a vertical clearance of a minimum three and a half metres (3.5m) to allow fire appliances to drive along the firebreak.

Construct a three metre (3m) firebreak immediately surrounding all buildings and fuel storage areas.

Areas cleared for burning require a twenty metre (20m) firebreak.

ALL OTHER NON URBAN LAND

2023 m² (half an acre) to 8 ha (20 acres). This category relates to nearly all lots in Gingin Rural Industrial Estate, Woodridge, Ocean Farm, Redfield Park, Sovereign Hill, Seaview Park and Moondah Ridge.

Clear a two and a half metre (2.5m) wide firebreak of all flammable material, immediately inside the external boundaries of the land.

Trees must be trimmed back to provide a vertical clearance of a minimum three and a half metres (3.5m) to allow fire appliances to drive along the firebreak.

On heavily grassed blocks slash all dry grass to a height of no more than 50mm.

8 ha (20 acres) to 20 ha (50 acres)

Clear a two and a half metre (2.5m) wide firebreak of all flammable material, immediately inside the external boundaries of the land.

Trees must be trimmed back to provide a vertical clearance of a minimum three and a half metres (3.5m) to allow fire appliances to drive along the firebreak.

On heavily vegetated or grassed blocks, implement supplementary fuel reduction for a further five metres (5m) inside the firebreak.

For your own protection, landowners are encouraged to install additional firebreaks around all buildings where practical.

URBAN LAND—ALL TOWNSITES

Land 2023m² (Half acre) or less

Clear land of all flammable material, i.e. debris, dry grass, dry bush etc.

Land larger than 2023m² (Half acre)

Clear a two and a half metre (2.5m) wide firebreak of all flammable material, immediately inside the external boundaries of the land.

ALTERNATIVE ALIGNMENTS

If it is impractical to have a firebreak immediately inside a boundary, for environmental or any other reason(s), you are required to notify the Shire of Gingin in writing, before 1 October, to obtain permission for firebreaks to be installed in an alternative position.

Only properties that are licensed for horticulture may have a firebreak installed immediately inside the vegetated buffer adjacent to the property boundary.

PLANTATIONS

Tree Plantations of more than three hectares (3ha), but less than ten hectares (10ha)

Construct a ten metre (10m) wide firebreak, clear of all flammable material, immediately surrounding the plantation (Adjacent areas of the same property subject to provisions as for Rural Areas).

Plantations larger than ten hectares (10ha)

Comply with the Shire of Gingin's Guidelines for Plantation Fire Protection. A copy is available from the Shire Office upon request.

HARVEST/MOVEMENT OF VEHICLES BANS

A ban on harvesting and the movement of vehicles in paddocks (except for the watering of stock) is likely to be imposed when the predicted weather conditions, are classified by the Bureau of Meteorology as very high or extreme.

ADDITIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND PENALTIES

Persons who fail to comply with the requirements of this Order may be fined up to \$1000.00. In addition, Council can arrange for the required work to be carried out at the cost of the owner or occupier.

Gas or electric barbecues ONLY, are permitted during Prohibited Burning Times.

Prior to any burning, please notify your neighbours, Fire control Officer and the Shire of Gingin.

A Permit to Burn must be obtained during the Restricted Burning Period. Permits are generally subject to a number of conditions but will NOT be issued for burning on Sundays or Public Holidays, unless approved by the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer.

Besides being responsible for the safety of your own property, if a fire escapes from your property, you may be liable to pay compensation for any damage caused outside of your property—this could be very costly.

Trees must not be planted in a manner that results in vegetation encroaching into the firebreak area.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

Shire of Beverley

FIRE BREAK ORDER

All owners and occupiers of land are required on or before 15 November every year to provide and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable material until 15 April of the following year, firebreaks as stipulated in the manner described in the following schedule.

Schedule**RURAL LAND**

Buildings and Haystacks: A firebreak of at least 4 metres wide and not more than 60 metres from the perimeter of all buildings (including temporary dwellings e.g. caravans) and/or haystacks or groups of buildings and/or haystacks so as to completely surround the buildings, haystacks and/or fuel dumps.

Bulldozed Bush: A firebreak 20 metres wide shall be maintained immediately inside the external boundaries of all land which has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether it is intended to burn the bush or not).

Stationary Pumps/Motors: A firebreak 4 metres wide shall be cleared and maintained around all stationary pumps and motors.

Harvesting Operations: During the period when harvesting operations are being conducted, there shall be provided in the same paddock or within 400 metres of that paddock an operational independent mobile fire-fighting unit having a water capacity of not less than 650 litres. The tank of the unit shall be kept full of water at all times during the harvest operations. The responsibility to supply the unit being that of the landowner.

Operation of Plant and Machinery: During the restricted and prohibited burning times, all harvesters and trucks carting grain shall not be operated on rural land unless fitted with a fire extinguisher. On days of HARVEST BANDS there shall be no movement of any vehicles within paddocks.

Paddock Burns: At any time throughout the year, where a landowner intends to burn paddocks, the following must be provided to prevent escape of fire—

1. A firebreak 2.2 metres wide clear of all inflammable material completely surrounding the area to be burnt.
2. An operational fire-fighting unit having a capacity of not less than 650 litres.
3. Permits to burn may be required. Contact your Fire Control Officer for details.

TOWNSITE LAND

All lots with an area of 2.024 ha (5 acres) or less, shall be clear of all inflammable material or have grass mown to a height no greater than 15cm.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Fuel Dumps: You shall remove all flammable materials or material likely to become flammable during summer from land occupied by bulk storage tanks and/or drums used for storage of liquid fuel whether the bulk storage tanks and/or drums contain liquid or not. This includes the land on which ramps for holding the drums are constructed. The flammable free ground must be maintained to a distance of at least 4 metres outside the perimeter of any drum, stack of drums or drum ramp or bulk storage tank.

Variations to Requirements: By the Order. For permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or by alternative date or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land, an application must be made no later than 14 days prior to the date firebreaks are required. If permission is not granted by the Shire or its duly authorized officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

Penalty for Failure to Comply: The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of up to \$1000. If the owner or occupier fails to carry out the works required by this Firebreak Order the Shire of Beverley may enter the land and prepare the firebreaks at the cost of the owner or occupier.

Burning: If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fire Act 1954.

Central to any application made is the program of work proposed for each of the years of the six year term. Applications are to be made in accordance with Section 31 of the *Petroleum Act 1967* and Section 21 of the *Petroleum (Submerged Lands) Act 1982* as appropriate. Consideration of an application for the grant of a Permit shall take into account work programs relative to the whole of the area applied for, the adequacy of the work program and the applicant's technical and financial ability to undertake the work. Permits are awarded on the understanding that the first two years work commitment will be fulfilled without variation.

Where there is more than one applicant to the application, the percentage participating interests of each party to the application is to be supplied including evidence that a satisfactory settlement has been, or can be, reached on a Joint Operating Agreement (a copy of a Heads of Agreement dealing will generally suffice).

Applicants should also make themselves aware of the existence of any areas, which have the potential to restrict exploration activities eg, National Parks, Nature Reserves, Marine Parks, World Heritage Areas, Conservation Reserves, Defence Areas and Mining Titles.
