#### HEALTH ACT 1911 LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995

Shire of Nannup

#### HEALTH AMENDMENT LOCAL LAWS 2006

Made by the Council of the Shire of Nannup under section 342 of the *Health* Act 1911 in accordance with subdivision 2 of Part 3 of the Local Government Act 1995.

#### Citation

1. These local laws may be cited as the Shire of Nannup Health Amendment Local Laws 2006.

#### Principal local laws

2. In these local laws, the *Shire of Nannup Health Local Laws 2003*, made by the Shire of Nannup on 28 August 2003, and published in the *Government Gazette* on 7 November 2003, are referred to as the principal local laws.

#### Principal local laws amended

3. The principal local laws are amended in Part 5, Division 3 by deleting sections 5.16 and 5.17 and substituting the following new sections—

#### **"5.16 Conditions For Keeping an Animal**

- (1) An owner or occupier of premises, within a townsite shall not keep a horse, cow or large animal on those premises without the written approval of the Local Government.
- (2) An owner or occupier of premises who has an approved animal shall ensure—
  - (a) the premises has an area of not less than one hectare, or as approved by the Local Government, for the exclusive use of the approved animal; and
  - (b) the approved animal does not approach within 15 metres of a dwelling.

#### 5.17 Stables

- (1) An owner or occupier of premises who has approval to keep a horse, cow or large animal shall provide for its use a stable which shall—
  - (a) not be situated within 15 metres of a house or other premises;
  - (b) have a proper separate stall for each horse or cow;
  - (c) have each wall and roof constructed of an impervious material; and
  - (d) have on all sides of the building between the wall and the roof, a clear opening of at least 150 millimetres in height.
- (2) The owner or occupier of premises on which a stable is located shall—
  - (a) maintain the stable in a clean and sanitary condition;
  - (b) keep all parts of the stable so far as possible, free from flies and other vectors of disease;
  - (c) when so ordered by the Principal Environmental Health Officer, wash, clean and sanitise the stable; and
  - (d) when so ordered by the Principal Environmental Health Officer, spray the stable or such parts as may be directed, with a residual insecticide."

### 1. Citation

This notice is the *Economic Regulation Authority (Harvey Water Bulk Water Pricing Reference) Notice 2006.* 

### 2. Reference on Harvey Water bulk water pricing

- (1) Under the *Economic Regulation Authority Act 2003* section 32(1) the Treasurer has referred to the Economic Regulation Authority for inquiry the matter of Harvey Water bulk water pricing.
- (2) The terms of reference for the inquiry are set out in Schedule 1.

### 3. **Period of inquiry**

The period of the inquiry is 16 October 2006 to 1 March 2007.

### 4. Public submissions

- (1) Members of the public and other interested parties may make written submissions to the Economic Regulation Authority on any matter that —
  - (a) is dealt with in the issues paper or draft report referred to in the terms of reference; or
  - (b) is otherwise relevant to the terms of reference.
- (2) Submissions in response to the issues paper or draft report may be made within 4 weeks after the release of the relevant document or any longer period allowed by the Economic Regulation Authority.
- (3) Submissions may be sent

### Schedule 1 — Terms of reference

[cl. 2(2)]

I, ERIC RIPPER, Treasurer, pursuant to section 32(1) of the *Economic Regulation Authority Act 2003* (the ERA Act), request that the Economic Regulation Authority (the Authority) undertake an inquiry and make recommendations on the most appropriate level and structure of water storage charges to the South West Irrigation Cooperative (Harvey Water). In doing so the Authority is expected to consider and make findings on:

- 1. The cost of operating and maintaining the irrigation dams, based on:
  - a. a "renewal costing" methodology which carries forward the model used for the 1996 Bulk Water Agreement;
  - b. a "full costing" methodology, consistent with national Water Initiative pricing principles, including efficient operating costs and capital expenditure requirements and a suitable rate of return on past and future investment in storage and distribution assets owned by the Water Corporation.
- 2. The additional costs associated with maintaining and improving dam safety for the Water Corporation's South West irrigation dams. This should include consideration of:
  - a. the requirements of the current Australian National Committee on Large Dams (ANCOLD) dam safety guidelines and the requirement for the Water Corporation to manage its dams to these guidelines; and
  - b. the overall merits, for all parties, of alternatives to the ANCOLD dam safety guidelines.

These considerations should utilise existing studies, including:

- a. Marsden Jacob Associates August 2003 "Review of Dam Safety Program Relating to South West Irrigation Dams"; and
- b. Snowy Mountains Engineering Corporation July 2006 "Evaluation of Alternative Risk Management Strategies".
- 3. The cost sharing arrangements between beneficiaries of the South West irrigation dams, including:
  - a. customers that benefit from the water stored in the dams and how this may change over time with water trading;
  - b. the recreational and other social benefits to the community of the dams; and
  - c. the beneficiaries of dam safety expenditure, including an assessment of those who benefit from the use of the dams and those that benefit from a reduced risk of flooding.
- 4. The ability of South West irrigation farmers and Harvey Water to meet their share of the costs determined from 1 and 2 above, and the impact on customers of the rate of change of an increase in prices (if any).
- 5. The impact on the State Government's net financial position associated with the recommended price level and structure.

The Authority is to have regard to the Government's social, economic and environmental policy objectives.

The Authority will release an issues paper as soon as possible after receiving the reference. The paper is to facilitate public consultation on the basis of invitations for written submissions from industry, government and all other stakeholder groups, including the general community.

A draft report is to be made available by 30 November 2006, for further public consultation on the basis of invitations for written submissions.

A final report is to be completed by no later than 1 March 2007.

#### **BUSH FIRES ACT 1954**

Town of East Fremantle/City of Fremantle METROPOLITAN FIRE DISTRICT

Notice to All Owners and/or Occupiers of Land in East Fremantle and Fremantle Pursuant to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before 30th day of November, 2006 or within fourteen days of the date of you becoming owner or occupier should this be after the 30th day of November 2006, to clear flammable matter from the land in accordance with the following requirements.

#### (a) Land having an area of fifteen hundred (1,500) square metres or less-

Clear all inflammable matter from the whole of the land. When mowing or slashing is carried out, the height of vegetation thereafter must not exceed, one hundred (100) millimetres over the entire area of the land, as far as reasonably practicable as determined by the authorised officer.

#### (b) Land having an area of fifteen hundred (1,500) square metres or more-

- (i) Clear firebreaks of a minimum width of three (3) metres inside all external boundaries of the land and all buildings situated on the land, by ploughing, cultivating or scarifying; or
- (ii) Mow/slash the whole of the land. The height of vegetation thereafter must not exceed, one hundred (100) millimetres over the entire area of the land, as far as reasonably practicable as determined by the authorised officer.

Once installed the firebreak must be maintained up to and including the 31st day of March 2007.

If it is considered to be impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 15th day of November 2006 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. If the Council or its duly authorised officer does not grant permission, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not more than \$5000 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

NOTE: Burning is prohibited. No permits will be issued.

#### **BUSH FIRES ACT 1954**

Town of Victoria Park and Town of Vincent 2006/2007 FIREBREAK NOTICE

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land within the Town of Victoria Park and Town of Vincent

Pursuant to the powers conferred in Section 33 of the *Bush Fires Act 1954*, you are required on or before the 30th November 2006, or within fourteen days of the date you become the owner or occupier should this be after the 30th day of November 2006 and thereafter up to and including the 30th day of April 2007, to clear inflammable matter, on land owned and/or occupied by you in accordance with the following requirements—

1. All land which is 2000 m<sup>2</sup> or less in area;

Remove inflammable matter from the whole of the land, except living trees and shrubs; plants under cultivation and lawn, by means of ploughing, cultivating or slashing to a height of no more than 50mm.

- 2. All other land within the Town of Victoria Park and Town of Vincent-
  - (i) Firebreaks of a minimum width and height of 3 metres are to be cleared immediately inside all external boundaries of the land;
  - (ii) Firebreaks to a minimum width of 3 metres and height of 3 metres are to be cleared immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land; and any place where inflammable liquids and gas products are kept;
  - (iii) In addition to the requirements in this clause Council may, by notice in writing require an owner and/or occupier to act as and when specified in the notice with respect to anything which is upon land and which in the opinion of Council is or is likely to be conducive to the outbreak of a bush fire or the spread or extension of a bush fire.

The term "Inflammable Matter" for the purpose of this notice includes bush (as defined in the *Bush Fires Act 1954*), timber, boxes, cartons, paper, rubbish and any other combustible or inflammable matter, but does not include buildings, green standing trees and bushes or growing bushes or plants in gardens or lawns.

All firebreaks must be cleared on or before 30 November in any year and thereafter maintained clear of inflammable matter up to and including 30 April in the following year.

If for any reason an owner and/or occupier considers it impractical to clear firebreaks or comply with other fire protection measures in accordance with the Notice, the owner and/or occupier may apply in writing to Council no later than 31 October in any year for a variation. If permission is not granted in writing by Council or its authorised officer, the owner and/or occupier must comply with the requirements of this Notice. Any variation granted by Council will apply only for a single Firebreak Period. A variation granted by Council shall only remain in force until 30 April in the following year. The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 and a person in default is also liable whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

Pursuant to Sections 24G(2) and 25(1a) of the Bush Fires Act 1954, the burning of garden refuse and lighting of fires in the open air is prohibited within the districts of the Town of Victoria Park and Town of Vincent between 30 November 2006 and 30 April 2007.
