Electricity Act 1945

Electricity Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2006

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Electricity Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2006.*

2. The regulations amended

The amendments in these regulations are to the *Electricity Regulations 1947**.

[* Reprinted as at 3 October 2000. For amendments to 26 July 2006 see Western Australian Legislation Information Tables for 2005, Table 4, p. 99-100 and Gazette 31 March 2006.]

3. Regulations 238, 239, 240 and 241 replaced by regulation 241

Regulations 238, 239, 240 and 241 are repealed and the following regulation is inserted instead —

241. Interpretation

ςς

(1) In this Part —

"network operator" means a supply authority and any person lawfully operating transmission or distribution works, and service apparatus.

(2) To avoid doubt, it is declared that the word "network" does include service apparatus, but does not include a line, pole, switch, transformer, or apparatus on or part of premises to which electricity is supplied by a

".

network operator that is situated beyond the point at which electricity is so supplied to the premises.

(3) To avoid doubt, it is declared that the term "network operator" does not include the owner of premises to which electricity is supplied who distributes the electricity to a person who occupies a part or all of the premises.

4. **Regulation 242 amended**

- (1) Regulation 242(1) is amended as follows:
 - (a) by deleting "supply authority shall" and inserting instead
 - " network operator shall ";
 - (b) by deleting paragraph (a) and "and" after it;

The consumer shall be responsible for any damage caused to meters or other property of the network operator caused through overloading, of which the network operator has not had previous notification, and such consumer shall be liable to disconnection.

Regulation 254 is repealed and the following regulation is inserted instead —

254. Individual inspection and reporting for electric installation

- (1) If a network operator does not have an inspection plan or policy statement that either complies with regulation 253, or is approved by the Director under regulation 253, the network operator must not —
 - (a) supply electricity to a newly installed consumer's electric installation; or

(b) supply electricity to a consumer's electric installation that has been altered or expanded (if the network operator has been notified of that alteration or expansion in a manner, if any, set out in the *Electricity (Licensing) Regulations 1991*),

unless the installation has been inspected by an inspector and complies with the requirements, if any, prescribed in respect of that installation.

- (2) If, on an inspection under subregulation (1), the inspector makes an order under section 18(2)(a) of the *Energy Coordination Act 1994*, the network operator must send a copy of the order to the Director within 28 days of the completion of the inspection.
- (3) If an accident of the type referred to in regulation 63 of the *Electricity (Licensing) Regulations 1991* occurs at an installation referred to in subregulation (1), the network operator who supplies electricity to the installation must give the Director a report, in a form approved by the Director, on the accident —
 - (a) within 3 days of the accident; or
 - (b) within any longer period approved, in writing and on a case-by-case basis, by the Director.
- (4) A network operator that fails to comply with subregulation (1), (2) or (3) commits an offence.
- (5) In proceedings for an offence against subregulation (1) it is a defence for the accused to show that the Director had given prior written approval to a network operator or a class of network operator to supply electricity to certain types of alterations or expansions to consumers' installations without prior inspection.

11. Regulation 255 repealed

12. Regulation 257 amended

Regulation 257 is amended as follows:

Perry Lakes Redevelopment Act 2005

Perry Lakes Redevelopment Regulations 2006

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Perry Lakes Redevelopment Regulations 2006*.

2. Extension of the AK redevelopment area

- (1) The land shaded grey on Deposited Plan 52693 (depicted in Schedule 1) is declared to be part of the AK redevelopment area.
- (2) The Deposited Plan referred to in subregulation (1) is that held by the department of the Public Service that principally assists with the administration of the *Transfer of Land Act 1893*.

3. Form of application (Act s. 32(1))

- Schedule 2 Form 1 is prescribed for the purposes of section 32(1) of the Act.
- (2) An application for a development approval referred to in section 32(1) of the Act must be accompanied by 4 copies of
 - (a) a plan, drawn to a scale not smaller than 1:2000, that identifies the land on which the development described in the application is proposed; and
 - (b) documents that fully and clearly illustrate and detail the proposed development, being
 - (i) a plan or plans, drawn to a scale generally not smaller than 1:500; and
 - (ii) written verbal specifications.

4. Documents with applications, requirements for


- (1) A plan required by regulation 3(2) must be drawn on a white background.
- (2) The documents required by regulation 3(2) must use metric measurements.

- (3) The documents required by regulation 3(2)(b) must include the following
 - (a) the location and proposed use of any existing buildings and outbuildings to be retained and the location and use of buildings proposed to be erected or demolished on the land;
 - (b) the existing and proposed means of access for pedestrians and vehicles to and from the land;
 - (c) the location, number, dimension and layout of all car parking spaces intended to be provided;
 - (d) the location and dimensions of any area proposed to be provided for the loading and unloading of vehicles carrying goods or commodities to and from the land and the means of access to and from those areas;
 - (e) the location, dimensions, design and particulars of the manner in which it is proposed to develop any landscaped area, including the retention of existing trees, vegetation, fences and walls;
 - (f) plans, elevations and sections of any building proposed to be erected or altered and of any building it is intended to retain, including details of materials of construction, finishes and external colour;
 - (g) details of any impact of the proposed development on
 - (i) the appearance of streets and of vegetation and buildings in streets; and
 - (ii) the views, privacy and overshadowing of neighbours' land;
 - (h) details of the proposed use and operation of the proposed development;
 - (i) details of any signs or advertising structures that are proposed to be included in the proposed development.



Water Services Licensing Act 1995

Licence Exemption (LionOre) Order 2006

Made by the Governor in Executive Council under section 19.

1. Citation

This order is the Licence Exemption (LionOre) Order 2006.

2. Commencement

This order comes into operation on the day after the day on which it is published in the *Gazette*.

3. Terms used in this order

In this order —

"Goldfields/South West Region Controlled Area" means the Goldfields/South West Region Controlled Area (Water Supply and Sewerage Services) constituted by the Goldfields/South West Region Controlled Area (Water Supply and Sewerage Services) Order 1999;

"LionOre" means LionOre Australia (Avalon) Pty Ltd (ACN 086 252 477).

4. Exemption

LionOre is exempted from the requirement in the Act section 18(1) for an operating licence (water supply services) in respect of the supply of wastewater by LionOre in Kalgoorlie, which is in the Goldfields/South West Region Controlled Area.

5. Expiry

This order continues in force until revoked.

AGRICULTURE AND RELATED RESOURCES PROTECTION ACT 1976 DECLARED PLANTS

Agriculture Protection Board, South Perth, 24th May 2006.

Pursuant to Section 37 of the Agriculture and Related Resources Protection Act, 1976, the Agriculture Protection Board hereby lists the classes of plants that are for the time being the subject of a declaration made under Section 35 of that Act, together with the matters specified pursuant to Subsection (2) of that Section in relation to each class—

P1 Prohibits movement of plants or their seeds within the State. This prohibits the movement of contaminated machinery and produce including livestock and fodder:

P2 Eradicate infestation to destroy and prevent propagation each year until no plants remain. The infested area must be managed in such a way that prevents the spread of seed or plant parts on or in livestock, fodder, grain, vehicles and/or machinery:

P3 Control infestation in such a way that prevents the spread of seed or plant parts within and from the property on or in livestock, fodder, grain, vehicles and/or machinery. Treat to destroy and prevent seed set all plants:

AGRICULTURE AND RELATED RESOURCES PROTECTION ACT 1976 LIST OF DECLARED ANIMALS

Agriculture Protection Board, South Perth, 6 October 2006.

Pursuant to Section 37 of the Agriculture and Related Resources Protection Act 1976, the Agriculture Protection Board hereby lists the classes of animals that are for the time being the subject of a declaration made under Section 35 of that Act, together with the matters specified pursuant to subsection (2) of that Section in relation to each class.

The following applies to the list below-

- If a species does not appear in this list and is not an indigenous animal or a fish (Class Pisces), it and hybrids thereof are prohibited as declared animals in categories A1, A2, A3. The meanings of those categories are summarised below. Of these species some (marked *) have been assessed for entry into the state and have been rejected, so they remain prohibited. Prohibited species should be immediately reported.
- Unless otherwise specified, declarations cover the entire State of Western Australia.
- Bird species declared in categories A1, A2, A3 are not to be held in private, public or research facilities outside the statutory zoo except by government departments permitted for that purpose by the Board.
- If a species does not appear in this list and is an indigenous species, it is not regulated under the *Agriculture and Related Resources Protection Act 1976*, but may be regulated under other legislation.
- It is an offence to liberate or attempt to liberate declared animals or to fail to prevent them being at large.
- Conditions for introduction and keeping of declared animals are specified in the Declared Animals regulations or by Board decision and documentation is available showing requirements for each species.
- Of the species not subject to declaration that are exempt, some (marked #) occur in a commensal or feral state and advice may be obtained from the Agriculture Protection Board on control or management of problems which they may occasionally cause.

Declaration categories under the Agriculture and Related Resources Protection Act 1976

A1 Entry prohibited.

- A2 Subject to eradication in the wild.
- A3 Keeping prohibited.
- A4 Entry subject to Department of Agriculture permits and/or conditions.
- A5 Numbers will be reduced/controlled.
- A6 Keeping subject to Department of Agriculture permits and/or conditions.

A7 A management programme for each species outlines the area and conditions under which controls may be applied. Programmes are for the whole of the State or as indicated for each species.
