The Western Australian Planning Commission ('the WAPC') by resolution made 28 November 2006 and acting pursuant to the provisions of section 16 of the *Planning and Development Act 2005* ('the Act') does hereby—

A. Revoke its delegation of powers and functions to various eligible persons and bodies as detailed in a notice published in the *Government Gazette* of 7April 2006 (pages 1499—1506);

and

- B. DELEGATES ITS FUNCTIONS as set out in-
 - (a) schedule 1, to those eligible persons and bodies set out in schedule 2;
 - (b) schedule 3, to those eligible bodies set out in schedule 4;
 - (c) schedule 5, to those eligible persons set out in schedule 6;
 - (d) schedule 7, to those eligible persons set out in schedule 8;
 - (e) schedule 9, to those eligible persons and bodies set out in schedule 10;
 - (f) schedule 11, to the eligible body set out in schedule 12;
 - (g) schedule 13, to the eligible body set out in schedule 14;
 - (h) schedule 15, to the eligible body set out in schedule 16; and

- 1.4 Power to approve detailed plans requiring the subsequent approval of the WAPC as a condition of development approval pursuant to the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Scheme and power to confirm that conditions imposed by the WAPC on a development approval pursuant to the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Scheme have been complied with.
- 1.5 Power to determine whether or not proposals and the ongoing implementation of the Metropolitan Region Scheme comply with conditions (if any) applied pursuant to sections 48F and 48J of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986*.

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACT 2005

AMENDMENT TO THE DECLARATION OF PLANNING CONTROL AREA 73 Lot 9001 Anketell Road, Oakford $Town\ of\ Kwinana$

General description

The Minister for Planning and Infrastructure has granted approval to amend Planning Control Area 73. The planning control area has previously been declared for Bush Forever site 270, Part Lot 5 Thomas Road, Anketell.

This amendment includes Lot 9001 Anketell Road, Oakford, as shown on Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC) plan number 3.2084.

Purpose of the planning control area

The purpose of this amended planning control area is to protect sensitive vegetation on Lot 107, which is adjacent to the subject site. The WAPC considers that the amended planning control area is required to ensure that no further development occurs on this land which might prejudice this purpose until it may be reserved for the purpose of parks and recreation in the Metropolitan Region Scheme.

Duration and effects

The amended planning control area has effect from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette* to 12 August 2008, or until revoked by the WAPC with the approval of the Minister

A person shall not commence and carry out development in a planning control area without the prior approval of the WAPC. The penalty for failure to comply with this requirement is \$50,000, and in the case of a continuing offence, a further fine of \$5,000 for each day during which the offence continues.

Compensation is payable in respect of land injuriously affected by this declaration, and land so affected may be acquired by the WAPC in the same circumstances and in the same manner as if the land had been reserved in the Metropolitan Region Scheme for a public purpose.
