Liquor Control Act 1988

Liquor Control Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2007

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Liquor Control Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2007*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows:

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations on the day after that day.

3. The regulations amended

The amendments in these regulations are to the *Liquor Control Regulations 1989*.

4. Regulation 9 amended

or reproduction of it, has not been used on a proof of age card issued within the period of 5 years after the photograph or signature was provided.

- (3c) If a photograph of an applicant provided under subregulation (3) is required to be destroyed under subregulation (3b), any photograph of the applicant provided under subregulation (2) is also required to be destroyed.
- (4) Regulation 18B(4) is amended by deleting "subregulation (2)(b)" and inserting instead —

" subregulation (2a) ".

CONSERVATION AND LAND MANAGEMENT ACT 1984

Conservation and Land Management (Revocation of State Forest) Order (No. 2) 2007

Made by the Governor in Executive Council under section 9(2) of the Conservation and Land Management Act 1984.

1. Citation

This order may be cited as the Conservation and Land Management (Revocation of State Forest) Order (No. 2) 2007.

2. Background to this order

- (1) Under section 9(2) of the Act, a proposal dated 22 September 1998 that, among other things, an area of about 26.7 hectares be revoked from State Forest No. 65 was laid before both Houses of Parliament.
- (2) Resolutions that the proposal referred to in subclause (1) be carried out were passed by the Legislative Assembly on 11 November 1998 and by the Legislative Council on 24 March 1999.
- (3) The land referred to in subclause (1) has been surveyed and is now described in Schedule 1.

3. Portion of State Forest No. 65 revoked

The land described in Schedule 1 is declared to be no longer State forest.

All that portion of land situated about 12 kilometres east of Wanneroo being the whole of Swan Location 12777 (excluding Lot 15277—Reserve No. 11937) as surveyed and shown on Deposited Plan 219669.

WASTE MANAGEMENT AND RECYCLING ACCOUNT

Ministerial Conditions for Phase 2 of the Zero Waste Plan Development Scheme

Pursuant to section 110H(5) (when read with s110H(6)) of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986*, I, David Templeman, being the Minister for the Environment; Climate Change; Peel, in making a payment from the Waste Management and Recycling Account (Account) to a local government or a constituted regional local government for the purposes of conducting Phase 2 of the Zero Waste Plan Development Scheme, being the preparation and completion of a strategic waste management plan (Plan), impose the following terms and conditions on each and every local government or constituted regional local government in receipt of such payment—

- 1. The Plan must be prepared and completed in accordance with the "Guidelines for the Preparation of a Strategic Waste Management Plan for Phase 2 of the Zero Waste Plan Development Scheme" as found at www.zerowastewa.com.au/zerowasteplans.
- 2. Each Plan must relate to the relevant district of the local government; or the region of the constituted regional local government or, in the case of local governments working collaboratively, the combined districts of the local governments working collaboratively.
- 3. The Plan is to be completed and submitted to the Manager of the Waste Management Branch at the Department of Environment and Conservation (DEC) by no later than 4:00pm on 14 March 2008. Completed Plans will be assessed for approval by the DEC in consultation with the "Zero Waste Plan Working Group" comprising representatives from local government, the Municipal Waste Advisory Council and DEC.
- 4. Payments from the Account for the purposes of Phase 2 of the Scheme will be made by way of the following instalments
 - i. 60 per cent upon DEC's receipt of the first Application for Phase 2 Zero Waste Plan Development Scheme, at the commencement of the preparation of the Plan .
 - ii. 20 per cent upon DEC's receipt of the second Application for Phase 2 Zero Waste Plan Development Scheme, which is due at the time of the Plan submission date (see paragraph "3").
 - iii. 20 per cent upon DEC receipt of the third Application for Phase 2 Zero Waste Plan Development Scheme, following formal approval of the Plan.
- 5. The local government or regional local government in receipt of moneys paid out of the Account for the purposes of Phase 2 Zero Waste Plan Development Scheme must ensure that—
 - 5.1 the moneys paid from the Account are initially expended for the purposes of the preparation and completion of the Plan;
 - 5.2 any paid moneys remaining after the Plan is completed are applied to the implementation of the completed Plan or returned to the DEC;
 - 5.3 financial records are kept and maintained which demonstrate how the moneys paid from the Account are expended;
 - 5.4 the financial records are made available to the DEC upon request.
- 6. The record/s (including any "document" as defined in section 5 of the *Interpretation Act 1984*) from which information is used for the completed Plan are to be securely stored and properly maintained for a period of not less than five years from the date that the completed Plan is submitted as described in paragraph "3" of these conditions.
- 7. All reporting, publications, articles, newsletters, brochures, information in respect of the Zero Waste Plan Development Scheme and/or the Plan provides for written acknowledgments of the following—

 - 7.3 Guidance for the preparation and approval of the Plan has been provided by the DEC and the Waste Management Board.

Note: Any person or body who fails to ensure that moneys are expended for the purposes of the Scheme and in accordance with any terms and conditions imposed by the Minister commits an offence. The maximum penalty for which is \$5000.00—section 110H(6).

1. Citation

This order is the Prohibition on Fishing (Coral, 'Live Rock' and Algae) Order 2007.

2. Interpretation

In this order-

- "algae" means all fish of that common name described by the scientific classifications Phylum Rhodophyta, Phylum Chlorophyta and Phylum Phaeophyta but excluding Family Corallinaceae:
- "coral" means all live fish of that common name described by the scientific classifications Class Anthozoa and Class Hydrozoa and including any rock, substrate or other substance on or in which the fish are attached or inhabit;

"'live rock'" means-

- (a) all fish of that common name described by the scientific classifications Family Corallinaceae, Class Polychaeta, Class Crinoidea, Class Ascidiacea, Class Ophiuroidea, Phylum Bryozoa and Phylum Porifera; and
- (b) all dead fish of the scientific classifications Class Anthozoa and Class Hydrozoa, and including any rock, substrate or other substance on or in which the fish are attached or inhabit.

3. Prohibition on fishing for coral, 'live rock' and algae

A person must not fish for any coral, 'live rock' or algae.

4. Exceptions to clause 3

- (1) Clause 3 does not apply in respect of the natural persons specified in column 1 of Schedule 1 taking, together and in total in any one calendar year, not more than the quantity of coral or 'live rock' specified directly opposite those persons in column 2 of that Schedule subject to—
 - (a) the specified quantity of coral or 'live rock' being the weight of those things before they are dried in any way (including by being left out of water);
 - (b) not more than 50 kg of coral being taken in any one day;
 - (c) no coral of the species provided for in column 1 of Schedule 2 being taken from the waters specified directly opposite those species in column 2 of that Schedule;
 - (d) not more than 100 kg of 'live rock' being taken in any one day;
 - (e) no 'live rock' being taken unless the whole of any rock, substrate or other substance on or in which the 'live rock' is attached or inhabits is taken with the 'live rock';
 - (f) coral being taken only by hand or with the use of manually operated and powered fishing gear or tools:
 - (g) any nominated diver of a relevant Marine Aquarium Fishery Managed Fishery Licence acting only in the presence of and in accordance with the directions of the nominated operator of the licence; and
 - (h) the persons fishing only during a voyage that commences from the shore of the mainland or an island and at the times and places in respect of which the persons have given not less than 24 hours prior written notice, during Departmental business hours at the office of the Department of Fisheries nearest to the place where the fish will be landed, of the precise details of—
 - (i) the times and places of departure, fishing and landing;
 - (ii) any vessel intended to be used in connection with the fishing; and
 - (iii) the Marine Aquarium Managed Fishery Licence under which they are a nominated operator or diver.
- (2) Clause 3 does not apply to the taking of algae by a person for a recreational purpose.

5. Orders revoked

- (1) The Prohibition on Taking Fish (Coral and Related Fish) Order 2001 is revoked.
- (2) The Prohibition on Commercial Fishing for Coral and Related Fish (Cleaverville Beach) Order 2003 is revoked.

If the Council or its duly authorised officer does not grant permission, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

FIREBREAK NOTICE

Notice To All Owners and Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Kalamunda

As a measure for preventing the outbreak of a bush fire, or for preventing the spread or extension of a bush fire which may occur, all owners and occupiers of land within the Shire's district are required before the 1st day of December in each year, or within 14 days of becoming the owner or occupier of land if after that date, to clear firebreaks or to take measures in accordance with this Notice and maintain those firebreaks and measures in accordance with this Notice up to and including the 31st day of March in the following year.

1. Land with a building on it with an area of 4,000 square metres or less.

Slash all grass and clear all inflammable matter to a height no greater than 5cm.

Prune all trees and shrubs around all buildings to provide a safety zone.

Ensure the roofs, gutters and walls of all buildings on the land are free of inflammable matter.

2. Vacant land with an area of 4,000 square metres or less.

Slash all grass and clear all inflammable matter to a height no greater than 5cm.

Install a 3 metre wide firebreak immediately inside all external boundaries of the land by removing all inflammable matter within that 3 metre wide firebreak to a height of 4 metres.

3. Land with a building on it with an area greater than 4,000 square metres.

Slash all grass and clear all inflammable matter to a height no greater than 5cm.

Install a 3 metre wide firebreak around all buildings and immediately inside all external boundaries of each lot on the land by removing all inflammable matter within that 3 metre wide firebreak to a height of 4 metres.

Prune all trees and shrubs around all buildings to provide a safety zone.

Ensure the roofs, gutters and walls of all buildings on the land are free of inflammable matter.

4. Vacant land with an area greater than 4,000 square metres.

Slash all grass to a height no greater than 5cm. If the land is stocked, the livestock must graze the grass down so that the grass is no greater than 5cm high by the end of December.

Install a 3 metre wide firebreak immediately inside all external boundaries of each lot and around all structures on the land by removing all inflammable matter within that 3 metre firebreak to a height of 4 metres.

Remove all inflammable matter within 20 metres of any haystacks or stockpiled inflammable matter. Maintain fuel loadings of inflammable matter at less than 8 tonnes per hectare across the land.

5. Fuel Dumps and Depots.

Remove all inflammable matter within 10 metres of where fuel drums, fuel ramps or fuel dumps are located, and where fuel drums, whether containing fuel or not, are stored.

6. Garden Refuse

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 24G(2) of the Bush Fires Act 1954, the Shire of Kalamunda prohibits the burning of all garden refuse within its district during the Prohibited Burning Times set out below unless that garden refuse is burned in an incinerator in accordance with the requirements of 24F(2) of the Act. This prohibition applies to all persons within the Shire's district. Failure to comply with this prohibition is an offence with a maximum penalty of \$3,000.

7. Welding and cutting apparatus

Pursuant to Regulation 39C(1) of the Bush Fire Regulations 1954, a person shall not operate—

- (a) welding apparatus of any kind; or
- (b) power operated abrasive discs of any kind,

in the open air, unless-

- (c) at least one fire extinguisher is provided at the place where the welding or cutting is carried out and
- (d) the place referred to in paragraph (c) is surrounded by a firebreak which is at least 5 metres wide.

Failure to comply with Regulation 39C(1) is an offence with a maximum penalty of \$1,000.

8 General

Firebreak Inspection Officers will commence inspection of firebreaks and fire hazards early in the bush fire season and will provide advice on potential fire hazards and suggested remedial measures. In some circumstances, an owner or occupier of land may be required to undertake fire prevention measures in addition to the measures specified in this Notice.

Where the owner or occupier of the land fails or neglects to comply with the requisitions of a notice given pursuant to section 33(1) of the Bush Fires Act 1954 within the time specified in the notice, the

Shire of Kalamunda may direct its officers together with such servants, workmen or contractors, and with such vehicles, machinery and appliances as the officers deem fit, to enter upon the land and carry out the requisitions of the notice which have not been complied with and the Shire of Kalamunda may recover the amount of any costs and expenses incurred in carrying out those requisitions in any court of competent jurisdiction as a debt due from the owner or occupier of the land

If fire prevention measures are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act which includes the necessity for permits to burn during the restricted burning times.

9. Restricted and Prohibited Burning Times

Restricted Burning Times (PERMITS REQUIRED) Between th

Between the 2nd day of November and the 30th day of November in each year, both dates inclusive, and between the 1st day of April and the 30th day of April in each year, both dates inclusive.

Prohibited Burning Times (TOTAL FIRE BAN)

Between the 1st day of December in each year and the 31st day of March in the following year, both dates inclusive.

Note—Restricted and Prohibited Burning Times may be varied due to seasonal changes. Any changes will be advertised in a local newspaper circulated within the Shire's district.

10. Application to vary the above requirements.

If it is impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to take measures in accordance with this Notice, you may apply to the Shire in writing before November 15 of each year for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative locations or take alternative measures to prevent the outbreak or spread of a bush fire. If permission is not granted in writing by the Shire, you shall comply with the requirements of this Notice.

11. Alternative methods of fuel reduction

Slashing, mowing, chemical spraying, raking and removal may be considered as alternative methods.

Shire staff is available to provide advice and further information on requirements, and the various passive and active measures that may be taken to minimise the fire risk of living in the Hills environment.
