It is hereby notified for public information, in accordance with section 87 of the *Planning and Development Act 2005* that the Minister for Planning and Infrastructure approved the Shire of Northampton local planning scheme amendment on 17 July 2008 for the purpose of—

1. Rezoning Lot 74 (No. 69) Seventh Avenue, Northampton from “Special Rural” to “Industrial—Restricted Uses”.
2. Inserting new clause in scheme text as follows—
 - 5.17 Restricted Uses

Despite anything contained in the Zoning Table, the land specified in Appendix 8 may only be used for the specific use or uses that are listed and subject to the conditions set out in Appendix 8 with respect to that land.”

3. Inserting the following table into Appendix 8—

Council may make this a condition of development for a proposal not directly abutting Lot 72, if it considers such a condition is required to protect the visual area.</p> <p>– As a condition of subdivision or development on the site (whichever occurs first), the intersection of Seventh Avenue and the North West Coastal Highway is to be upgraded to Main Roads specifications. This will include as a minimum, widening of NWCH for a left and right turn movement into Seventh Avenue and sealing Seventh Avenue for a minimum length to ensure material from the unsealed road will not encroach onto NWCH.</p> <p>– Lot 74 is located within the Northampton Water Reserve. The Water Reserve is a Public Drinking Water Supply Area proclaimed under the Country Areas Water Supply Act 1947. This Water Reserve is classified as Priority 3. Activities that occur within this area are to be managed so as to provide maximum protection of the drinking water bore against contamination.</p> <p>– Future land use development proposals within the area will be assessed by Council to determine their compatibility with the Department of Water's Land Use Compatibility in Public Drinking Water Source Areas document to ensure the potential risk of contamination of the water resource is minimised. Proposals considered inconsistent with Department of Water Policies, Guidelines and Water Quality Protections notes will be referred to the Department of Water for assessment. Proposals that cannot demonstrate that the drinking water resource will not be detrimentally affected in terms of quality will be refused.</p> <p>– Land uses carried out within the industrial area should incorporate best management practices outlined in the Department of Water's Quality Protection Notes. Specifically, the following notes should be considered: Contaminant Spills—Emergency Response, Stormwater Management at Industrial Sites; and Light Industry near Sensitive Waters.</p>

5. Amending the Scheme Maps accordingly.
