BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

Shire of Cranbrook

ANNUAL FIREBREAK NOTICE 2008/2009

Action is required by owners and/or occupiers of all land in the Shire of Cranbrook. Please read it completely and carefully. If in doubt, contact the Shire of Cranbrook or your local brigade. In case of fire refer to brigade contact details. For all other emergencies call 000. First and final notice penalties may apply.

Important Dates To Remember

OCTOBER 1, 2008: Commencement of Restricted Burning Period.

NOVEMBER, 1, 2008: Commencement of Prohibited Burning Period.

FEBRUARY 28, 2009: Close of Prohibited Burning Period.

APRIL 12, 2009: Close of Restricted Burning Period.

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD 1/10/08 TO 31/10/08 AND 1/3/09 TO 12/4/09 (all dates inclusive)

The law requires that a person shall not set fire to the bush during the Restricted Burning times unless he has—

- 1. Obtained a permit in writing from a Bush Fire Control Officer.
- 2. Notified all neighbours and a Bush Fire Control Officer.
- 3. Notified a CALM officer if the fire will be within 3km of a CALM Reserve.

The following conditions must be complied with when burning is carried out—

- 1. At least three able bodied persons must be in attendance.
- 2. The fire may not be lit on a day which an "extreme" or "very high" danger forecast has been issued for the district.
- 3. The fire may not be lit on a Sunday or a Public Holiday.
- 4. At least one fire unit must be in attendance.
- 5. Any other conditions that are prescribed by the Fire Control Officer.

PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD 1/11/08 to 28/2/09 (dates inclusive)

Only protective burning can be carried out during the Prohibited Burning time and under the following conditions—

- 1. No burning permitted on Christmas Day.
- 2. All burning must be carried out between the hours of 6.00pm and midnight of the same day.
- 3. All conditions of Restricted Burning Period must be complied with.
- 4. A permit to burn must be obtained.

PLANTATIONS

The Shire of Cranbrook has adopted the Guidelines for Plantation Fire Protection developed by the Bush Fire Service which establish the minimum fire break and fire equipment standards, subject to the following provisions:—

- (i) Plantation—any area of planted trees for commercial purposes exceeding 3ha within townsites or exceeding 10ha in rural areas.
- (ii) Boundary Fire Breaks (15 metres)—a 15 metre firebreak is required on all boundaries of plantations. 8 metres must be clear of all inflammable material on the ground and will have an 8 metre vertical clearance. The remaining 7 metres must be maintained in a low fuel condition (i.e. closely mown, grazed or sprayed).
- (iii) Compartment Fire Breaks—in accordance with Guideline standards subject to fire break being clear of all inflammable material.
- (iv) Vehicle Access—all fire breaks to be maintained in a trafficable condition strictly in accordance with the Guidelines.
- (v) Fire Equipment Standards—where no brigade fire fighting equipment or community based plantation fire equipment is located in a brigade area, plantation growers are required to provide the minimum equipment levels in accordance with the Plantation Fire Protection Guidelines. A copy of the Guidelines for Plantation Fire Protection can be obtained by contacting the Bush Fire Service—Albany Office or the Shire Office during normal office hours.

TOWNSITES

(All land within the Shire of Cranbrook which is within a townsite and land adjacent to any townsite zoned Rural Residential or Rural Small Holding)

(i) Where the area of land is 3 hectares or less with buildings on, all inflammable material shall be removed from the whole of the property.

For the purpose of this notice inflammable material does not include live standing trees, cultivated plants, shrubs or gardens. Land of the above dimension with no buildings must be mowed, burnt or closely grazed:- where not possible to comply with these conditions a 2.5 metre firebreak clear of all inflammable material is required immediately inside the boundary as practicable.

(ii) Where the area of land exceeds 3 hectares with buildings on, the firebreak order pertaining to rural land must be complied with. Where no buildings exist a 2.5 metre firebreak clear of all inflammable material immediately inside the property boundary as practicable must be maintained.

Burning of Garden Refuse

The burning of garden refuse within the Shire of Cranbrook is not permitted during the Prohibited Burning Season. The burning of garden refuse during the Restricted Burning Period requires a permit in writing from a Bush Fire Control Officer. All conditions of the permit must be complied with and burning is not permitted on days which an "extreme" or "very high" danger forecast has been issued for the district.

Oxyacetylene, Arc Welders, Angle Grinders and other Power Equipment

Operation of oxyacetylene, arc welders, angle grinders and other power equipment during Restricted Burning Period requires the worksite to be adequately cleared of inflammable material prior to the use of the above mentioned equipment and an appropriate fire extinguisher in attendance.

(ie: All land within the Shire of Cranbrook other than within a townsite or land zoned special rural adjacent to a townsite).

(i) Homesteads, Buildings, Bulk Fuel, Fuel Drums

Firebreaks at least 20 metres wide, if provided by burning, cultivating or spraying or 60 metres wide, if provided by being closely grazed or mowed to the satisfaction of a Bush Fire Control Officer in such

positions as are necessary to completely surround the perimeter of any homestead building (excluding isolated non inflammable structures), fuel installation (including drums), or group of such structures or installations. The outer 2.5 metres of the area must be totally free of any inflammable material and when mowing is the method used all residue of the mowing process must be removed from the area. All buildings, unless unroofed, must have firebreaks that comply with this order.

(ii) Haystacks and Hay Rolls situated next to buildings

Hay stacks and hay rolls within 50 metres of any building must have a firebreak at least 2.5 metres wide clear of all inflammable material on all sides.

(iii) Crops

Firebreaks around crops are not compulsory however landowners are strongly encouraged to maintain voluntary firebreaks. All owners or occupiers of land being used for pasture or crops which exceeds 20 hectares(50 acres) in area shall maintain a mobile fire fighting unit in working order with a capacity of not less than 400 litres of water.

(iv) Derelict and/or abandoned buildings

In the event of a derelict and/or abandoned building being situated on and within the Shire of Cranbrook other than within a townsite, or land zoned rural residential or rural small holding adjacent to a townsite, an application by the owner for exemption to provide firebreaks as per clause 1(i) of this notice must be made to the Shire of Cranbrook in writing. All applications will be subject to an onsite inspection to be carried out by the Chief Fire

Control Officer and a duly appointed Council representative.

RURAL LAND

Specified Condition—Harvesting

No person shall operate a harvesting machine on any land unless he has provided a mobile and operational fire fighting unit, having a water capacity of at least 400 litres, situated in or adjacent to the paddock where harvesting operations are being conducted.

NOTE: Boundary firebreaks are not compulsory within the Shire of Cranbrook Rural Area. Landholders can provide boundary firebreaks if they wish.

Burning of Garden Refuse

The burning of garden refuse within the Shire of Cranbrook is not permitted during the Prohibited Burning Season. The burning of garden refuse during the Restricted Burning Period requires a permit in writing from a Bush Fire Control Officer. All conditions of the permit must be complied with and burning is not permitted on days which an "extreme" or "very high" danger forecast has been issued for the district.

Operation of Tractors and Self Propelled Headers

During the Restricted and Prohibited Burning Times, all Tractors and Self Propelled Headers must be equipped with an exhaust system with an efficient spark arrester in a sound condition and a fire extinguisher.

Operation of Chaff Cutting Plants (Regulation 39)

A Fire Extinguisher together with a container holding not less than 150 litres of water must be provided at the site where any chaff cutting plant is operating. A Bush Fire Control Officer may make any other conditions which must be carried out by the operator.

Swathers, Balers and Tree Harvesters

Swathers, Balers and Tree Harvesters are subject to the same conditions as harvesting ie: a mobile and operational fire fighting unit having a capacity of at least 400 litres of water in attendance during operations from 1st December until the end of the Restricted Burning Period.

Oxyacetylene, Arc Welders, Angle Grinders and other Power Equipment

Operation of oxyacetylene, arc welders, angle grinders and other power equipment during Restricted Burning Period requires the worksite to be adequately cleared of inflammable material prior to the use of the above mentioned equipment and an appropriate fire extinguisher in attendance.

Important Information to Owners and / or Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Cranbrook

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 15th day of November, 2007, to plough, burn, scarify, cultivate, chemically spray or otherwise clear and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable materials until the 15th day of April, 2009 in the following positions and of the following dimensions on the land owned or occupied by you.

GENERAL INFORMATION

FIRE CONTROL OFFICERS AND CAPTAINS ARE THE ONLY PERSONS PERMITTED TO ISSUE PERMITS.

ALL PROTECTIVE BURNING SHALL BE COMPLETED BY THE 20TH DECEMBER,2008.

HARVESTING ON CHRISTMAS DAY IS NOT PERMITTED WITHIN THE SHIRE.

UHF RADIO—BUSHFIRE EMERGENCY CHANNEL IN THE EVENT OF BUSHFIRE EMERGENCY OPERATIONS WITHIN THE SHIRE OF CRANBROOK, CHANNEL 9 HAS BEEN ADOPTED AS THE NOMINATED CHANNEL WHEN USING UHF RADIOS FOR ALL COMMUNICATION.

VEHICLES TO BE TAKEN OVER OR ONTO ROADS IN ANY SITUATION IT IS THE INTENTION OF THE SHIRE TO ENFORCE THE FIRE BREAK ORDER ON ALL LOTS WITHIN THE TOWNSITE AND RURAL LAND.

SUMMER VACATIONS

PLEASE NOTIFY THE SHIRE OFFICE OR FIRE CAPTAINS IF YOU WILL BE OUT OF THE DISTRICT AND IF ANY OF YOUR PLANT WOULD BE AVAILABLE INCASE OF FIRE.

Broadcast of Fire Bans

6WB—Will broadcast fire bans on the hour following their hourly news relay.

ABC—will broadcast fire bans on Monday to Friday inclusive at 9.05 am, 9.35am, 10.05am, 10.35am, 12.36am, 5.05pm, 5.35pm and 6.00pm.

Saturday—7.45am, 9.00am, 10.00am and 5.20pm.

Sunday—7.45am, 9.00am, 10.00am, 10.35am, 11.00am, 12 noon, 3.05pm, 4.05pm and 5.05pm.

Protective Burning

The following Protective Burning is permitted during the Prohibited Burning Period—

1. Burning to protect a Dwelling House, other building or a stake of produce (Section 23).

Section 18 of the Act must be complied with and two plough breaks, 2.5 metres wide and not more than 100 metres from the property to be protected.

Burning to collect Clover Burr (Section 24 and Reg. 18 to 22b)

Burning to collect clover burn must be done with a special permit from the Chief Fire Control Officer, Deputy Chief Fire Control Officer or the Chief Executive Officer of the Council. A Bush Fire Control Officer does not have the power to issue this type of permit.

When a Fire Escapes

In the event of a fire escaping beyond the boundaries of the land in respect of which a permit to burn has been granted, the holder of such permit shall, if possible, immediately notify the nearest authorised officer, and within 24 hours of the suppression of such fire, shall report in writing the full circumstances causing such escape to the authorised officer by whom the permit was granted.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any person to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council, or its duly authorised officer (Mr Ron Denney, Chief Bushfire Control Officer, 98343049). If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not more than \$1000 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the required date.

City of Mandurah FIRE NOTICE 2008/2009

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land

IMPORTANT INFORMATION RELATING TO YOUR RESPONSIBILITY AS A LAND OWNER IN THE CITY OF MANDURAH.

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954 you are required to carry out fire prevention work on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the provisions of this Notice to the satisfaction of Council or it's duly authorised officers.

This work must be carried out by 17 November 2008, OR WITHIN 14 DAYS OF BECOMING THE OWNER OR OCCUPIER, SHOULD THIS BE AFTER THAT DATE and kept maintained throughout the summer months until 31 May 2009.

PERSONS WHO FAIL TO COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS NOTICE MAY BE ISSUED WITH AN INFRINGEMENT NOTICE OR PROSECUTED. WHERE THE OWNER FAILS TO COMPLY WITH THE REQUISITIONS OF THE NOTICE, COUNCIL OR IT'S DULY AUTHORISED OFFICERS WILL CARRY OUT THE REQUIRED WORK AT THE COST OF THE OWNER OR OCCUPIER.

In addition, you may be required to carry out further works which may be deemed necessary and specified by way of a separate written notice forwarded to the address shown on the City of Mandurah rate records for that land.

If it is considered for any reason impractical to clear firebreaks as required by this Notice, or if natural features render firebreaks unnecessary, you may apply in writing to the City of Mandurah or its duly authorised officers, not later than 1 November 2008 for alternative positions, or other methods of fire prevention on your land. If permission is not granted, you must comply with the requirements of the Notice

WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

OCCUPIED OR UNOCCUPIED LAND LESS THAN 2023m²

Where the area of the land is less than 2023m² (approximately 1/2 acre) REMOVE all flammable material on the land except living standing trees, from the whole of the land by either ploughing, cultivating, scarifying, chemical spraying (followed by slashing down to ground level) or other approved method by an authorised officer of Council. A 4-Metre Fire Break is not acceptable.

OCCUPIED OR UNOCCUPIED LAND $2023m^2$ AND OVER

When the area of land is 2023m² (approximately 1/2 acre) and over, provide a mineral earth firebreak at least 4 metres wide, with a vertical height clearance of 4.2 metres—

- 1. Immediately inside all external boundaries of the said land.
- 2. Immediately surrounding all outbuildings erected on the said land.


