Occupational Safety and Health Act 1984

Occupational Safety and Health Amendment Regulations 2008

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

Part 1 — Preliminary

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Occupational Safety and Health Amendment Regulations 2008*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows:

- (a) Part 1 on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette* ("Gazettal day");
- (b) Part 2 on the day after Gazettal day;
- (c) Part 3 on 1 January 2009.

3. The regulations amended

The amendments in these regulations are to the *Occupational Safety and Health Regulations 1996*.

Part 2 — Amendments to commence on the day after Gazettal day

4. Regulation 3.61 amended

3.62. Tester to record information on tag

A competent person who conducts under clause 3.5, 3.6 or 3.7 of AS/NZS 3012 a test on an item of portable electrical equipment or a portable residual current device that is intended for use at a workplace must ensure that, in addition to the information referred to in clause 3.8.3 of that Standard, the tag bears —

- (a) the person's name; and
- (b) if the person holds an electrical worker's licence issued under the *Electricity (Licensing)*Regulations 1991, the person's licence number.

Penalty:

- (a) for a first offence, \$2 000; and
- (b) for a subsequent offence, \$2 500.

GENETICALLY MODIFIED CROPS FREE AREAS ACT 2003

GENETICALLY MODIFIED CROPS FREE AREAS EXEMPTION ORDER (No. 3) 2008

Made by the Minister under section 6.

1. Citation

This order may be cited as the Genetically Modified Crops Free Areas Exemption Order (No.3) 2008.

2. Revocation

The Genetically Modified Crops Free Areas Exemption Order published in the Gazette on 4 May 2007 is revoked.

3. Exemption

A person cultivating cotton in the Ord River Irrigation Area of Western Australia is exempt from the application of section 5 of the *Genetically Modified Crops Free Areas Act 2003* in relation to the cultivation of the genetically modified cotton varieties Liberty Link®, Bollgard II®, Roundup Ready® and Roundup Ready Flex® or combinations of varieties that have been licensed for commercial release under the *Gene Technology Act 2000* (Commonwealth).

- g. does not involve the use of an essential service of greater capacity than normally required in the zone.
- 19. In Schedule 1, inserting a definition for Home Business as follows—

Home Business: means a business, service or profession carried out in a dwelling or on land around a dwelling by an occupier of the dwelling which—

- a. does not employ more than 2 people not members of the occupier's household;
- b. will not cause injury to or adversely affect the amenity of the neighbourhood;
- c. does not occupy an area greater than 50m²;
- d. does not involve the retail sale, display or hire of goods of any nature;
- e. in relation to vehicles and parking-
 - does not result in traffic difficulties as a result of the inadequacy of parking or an increase in traffic volumes in the neighbourhood; and

- does not involve the presence, use or calling of a vehicle more than 3.5 tonnes tare weight.
- f. does not involve the use of an essential service of greater capacity than normally required in the zone.
- 20. In Schedule 1, inserting a definition for Home Office as follows—

Home Office: means a home occupation limited to a business carried out solely within a dwelling by a resident of the dwelling but which does not—

- a. entail clients or customers travelling to and from the dwelling;
- b. involve any advertising signs on the premises; or
- c. require any external change to the appearance of the dwelling.

"3.13 DEVELOPMENT ZONE

3.13.1 Objectives

- (a) For land in this Zone to be progressively developed for purposes, including, residential development and for other uses normally associated with residential development.
- (b) Prior to any subdivision or development occurring in the zone, ensure that an Outline Development Plan has been adopted.
- (c) Establish zoning and density coding for land in the zone through the adoption of an Outline Development Plan.

3.13.2 Development Requirements

- (a) Prior to granting approval for any development or recommending approval for subdivision of land in this zone, an Outline Development Plan shall be required to be adopted in accordance with the Outline Development Plan provisions stipulated in Part IV of the Scheme.
- (b) Notwithstanding the requirements of this Scheme, the Council may permit the land to be used for various purposes shown in the approved Outline Development Plan

3.13.3 Outline Development Plan

- (a) Further to the Outline Development Plan provisions in Part IV of the Scheme, an Outline Development Plan in the Development zone shall show:—
 - (i) The topography of the area.

- (ii) The existing major road systems.
- (iii) The location and width of proposed roads.
- (iv) The location and quantity of shopping, civic, and public facilities proposed, including the nomination of the appropriate zone or reserve to be applied, together with an analysis of the factors used in the determination of the need for such facilities.
- (v) The approximate location of the recreation and open space areas proposed and the nomination of the appropriate reserve to be applied, with the location of open space to be related to creeklines, native vegetation, and other natural features.
- (vi) The population and residential densities proposed.
- (vii) Landholdings adjacent to or near the area the subject of the Outline Development Plan, including any buffers required from adjoining development.
- (viii) Mapping of flood plain and flood fringe of the Moore River.
- (ix) The staging of the development proposed, the method of carrying out the development and the projected times of completion of each stage of development.
- (x) Such other information as shall be required by the Council."
- 5. including the following new clause in numeric order in the Scheme Text—

"4.12 Outline Development Plan

- 4.12.1 The local government or the Western Australian Planning Commission may require the preparation of an Outline Development Plan prior to considering any subdivision or development proposal in any zone.
- 4.12.2 Notwithstanding the requirements of this Scheme, all development is to comply with the requirements of any endorsed Outline Development Plan.
- 4.12.3 Any departure or alterations to an Outline Development Plan may, subject to the approval of the Western Australian Planning Commission, be permitted if the local government considers that the proposed departure or alteration will not prejudice the progressive subdivision and development of the area.
- 4.12.4 A proposed Outline Development Plan may, to the extent that it does not conflict with the Scheme, impose a classification on the land included in it by reference to reserves, zones or the Residential Design Codes, and where the proposed Outline Development Plan becomes an Outline Development Plan, the local government is to have due regard to such reserves, zones or the Residential Design Codes when recommending subdivision or approving development of land within. In the absence of an endorsed Outline Development Plan the symbols in the Zoning Table will apply.
- 4.12.5 Advertising of Outline Development Plan—

If the Council resolves to approve the Outline Development Plan it shall give notice that the Outline Development Plan has been prepared and will be available for public inspection at the offices of the Council. The notice shall be for a period of not less than 30 days from the date the notice is first published and shall state that submission on the Outline Development Plan may be made to the Council within this period.

Notice shall be in the form of the following-

- (a) a notice published in a newspaper circulating in the district;
- (b) a notice sent to the owner and/or occupiers of land within an area determined by the Council to be affected by the Outline Development Plan; and
- (c) if determined by Council as being required, a sign on site displaying the notice.
- 4.12.6 Adoption of Outline Development Plan—

Following the adoption of the Outline Development Plan, with or without modifications, the local government shall request the Western Australian Planning Commission to endorse the Outline Development Plan as the basis for approval of subdivision applications within areas covered by the plan.

4.12.7 Right of Review-

The proponent of an Outline Development Plan required by this Scheme may make application for review under Part 14 of the Planning and Development Act 2005—

- (a) The failure of the local government to make a determination on the content and requirement of an Outline Development Plan (or an amendment to an Outline Development Plan) within 120 days of receiving a request for direction;
- (b) A decision by the local government not to endorse an Outline Development Plan (or an amendment to an Outline Development Plan);
- (c) Conditions of approval of the Outline Development Plan (or alterations to an Outline Development Plan).

4.12.8 Modifications to Outline Development Plan—

If the Council considers that a proposed departure from or alteration to an approved Outline Development Plan will not prejudice the progressive development of an area and is in the interest of orderly and proper planning, the Council may resolve either—

- (a) not to advertise the departure or alteration due to its anticipated minimal impact on the development of the area and forward the departure or alteration to the Western Australian Planning Commission for adoption; or
- (b) advertise the departure or alteration in accordance with the Outline Development Plan advertising provision.
- 6. in the Legend on the Scheme Map including "Development" in the list of Zones designated by a brown border as depicted on the Scheme Amendment Map.
