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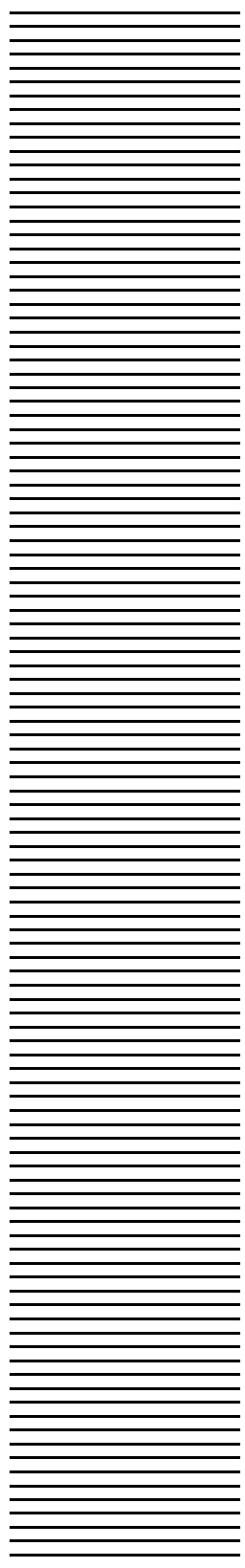

And further, if and so long as there is a vacancy in the office of Governor of the State of Western Australia or the Governor is administering the government of the Commonwealth of Australia or, not having appointed a deputy, is unable to act as Governor or is on leave or is absent from the State, We do by this commission appoint, authorise and require you to administer the government of the State.
3. And further, We do by this commission appoint, authorise and require you, when administering the government of the State, to exercise and perform all or any of the powers, functions and directions contained in Our *Letters Patent relating to the office of Governor of the State of Western Australia* dated 14 February 1986 or in future Letters Patent relating to that office according to any instructions issued by Us in relation to the exercise and performance of those powers, functions and directions that are in force from time to time and according to the laws from time to time in force in the State.
4. And further, We declare that, so soon as you have taken the usual oath or affirmation of allegiance and the usual oath or affirmation of office and have assumed the office of Lieutenant-Governor, this commission shall supersede Our commission dated 19 March 1990 appointing the Honourable David Kingsley Malcolm to be the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia.
5. And We command all Our officers, Ministers, and loving subjects in the State and all others whom it may concern to take due notice of this commission and to give their ready obedience accordingly.
