City of Swan

CONSOLIDATED AMENDMENT LOCAL LAW 2009

Under the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1995*, and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the City of Swan resolved on 13 January 2010 to make the following local law.

1. Citation

This local law may be referred to as the City of Swan Consolidated Amendment Local Law 2009.

2. Commencement

This local law comes into operation 14 days after the day of publication in the $Government\ Gazette$.

3. Principal local laws amended

In this local law, the *City of Swan Consolidated Local Laws 2005* published in the *Government Gazette* on 16 February 2005 and as amended and published in the *Government Gazette* on 19 September 2008 is referred to as the principal local laws. The principal local laws are amended.

- (3) Subclause (1)(b) does not apply to a commercial vehicle when it is being loaded or unloaded with reasonable expedition with goods, merchandise or materials collected from or delivered to the premises adjacent to the portion of the verge on which on which the commercial vehicle is parked, provided no obstruction is caused to the passage of any vehicle or person using a carriageway or a path.
- (4) Nothing in this section shall authorise any person to stop or park any portion of a vehicle on or over a footpath."
