#### FENCING AMENDMENT LOCAL LAW 2010

#### 3. Clause 2(1) amended

In the “**retaining wall**” definition, delete the word “prevent” and replace it with the word “prevents”.

#### 4. Clause 12(2)(c) amended

Delete the word “house” and replace it with the word “hours”.

#### 5. Clause 15(1) amended

Delete the word ‘occupier’.

#### 6. Clause 15(3) amended

Delete this paragraph and substituted with the following—

‘Should the owner fail to comply with a notice of breach, the Shire of Dowerin may by its employees, agents or contractors enter upon the lot to which the notice relates and remedy the breach, only if the fence abuts a public thoroughfare, public place or property of the Council, and may recover the shared expenses of so doing from the owner of the lot, in a court of competent jurisdiction.’

The purpose of this Statute is to establish the Edith Cowan University Foundation.

### 1. Definitions

In this Statute unless the contrary intention appears—

“**Act**” means the *Edith Cowan University Act 1984*.

“**Council**” means the Council of the University and “**Council Member**” means a member of the Council.

“**Donor**” means any person or organisation who has donated or otherwise contributed moneys, property or assets to the University for the objectives of the Foundation, and for the purposes of this definition the term “person” includes a partnership, association, foundation, trust, corporation or company whether incorporated or unincorporated.

“**Foundation**” means the Edith Cowan University Foundation established by Section 2 of this Statute.

“**Foundation Board**” means the Board of the Foundation established by Section 3 of this Statute.

“**Fund**” or “**Funds**” means all property, both real and personal, from time to time held by the University for the objectives of the Foundation pursuant to this Statute and all investments representing such property or any part thereof and any consequential investment income.

“**Fundraising Plan**” means the Fundraising Plan described in Section 4 of this Statute.

“**Rules**” means the Edith Cowan University Foundation Rules made under Section 7 of this Statute.

“**Vice-Chancellor**” means the person for the time being appointed as the chief executive officer of the University under section 30 of the Act, or a person acting in that position.

### 2. Establishment and Objectives

The Edith Cowan University Foundation is established to promote and encourage philanthropic giving to the University, as well as other contributions towards the agreed Fundraising Plan, for the University’s advancement and development, to benefit its students and the wider community.

### 3. The Foundation Board

The affairs of the Foundation shall be overseen by the Foundation Board, constituted under the Rules.

### 4. The Fundraising Plan

As and when required, Council shall approve a Fundraising Plan which outlines the fundraising priorities of the University.

### 5. The Funds

(1) The Funds shall be managed and audited separately from the University’s other funds and property and accounted for separately in the accounts and records of the University.

(2) Subject to sub-section 5(1) and pending any disposition, application or dealing with the Funds in accordance with sub-section 5(3), the Funds shall be invested by the University in accordance with the Act.

(3) Council may, subject to the Act, this Statute and the Rules, dispose of, apply or otherwise deal with any or all of the Funds as seen fit and having regard to any expressed intention(s) of the relevant Donor(s). Any disposal of, or dealing with, the Funds is subject, under section 5(2)(e) of the Act, to the express trusts of any deed, will, or instrument under which the property was acquired.

### 6. Donations or Contributions

(1) Subject to the Rules, donations or other contributions to the University for the objectives of the Foundation may be accepted from and for any compatible source and purpose, including (without limitation) from the University.

(2) Donations or contributions may be made in the form of—

- (a) monies;
- (b) personal property; or
- (c) any other class of assets.

- (3) Donations or contributions may be made by way of—
- (a) lump sum;
  - (b) instalments;
  - (c) interest from amounts deposited with the University or otherwise; or
  - (d) bequests or by any other means.

### 7. Rules

Council may make Rules to give effect to this Statute, including Rules relating to—

- (1) the functions, membership and appointment of members of the Foundation Board;
- (2) meetings of the Foundation Board;
- (3) the functions of the Foundation Board and the Vice-Chancellor in the conduct of the affairs of the Foundation;
- (4) the management and disbursement of the Funds;
- (5) the method of reporting to be used in relation to the Funds;
- (6) the appointment of patrons for specific activities of the Foundation;
- (7) the recognition of Donors; and
- (8) any other matters Council considers necessary for the Foundation to achieve its objectives.

### 8. Repeal

(1) Council may, after seeking such advice as it considers necessary and appropriate, resolve that the Foundation be disestablished by the repealing of this Statute.

(2) In the event that the Foundation is disestablished, the Funds shall continue to be held by the University and be disbursed by Council in such manner, consistent with the Act, as it considers appropriate and having regard to any expressed intention(s) of the relevant Donor(s). Any disbursement of the Funds is subject, under section 5(2)(e) of the Act, to the express trusts of any deed, will, or instrument under which the property was acquired.

The applicant's technical assessment of the petroleum potential of the area, including the concepts underlying its proposed exploration work program, with sufficient detail to support that program. A sound technical assessment would include an assessment of relevant data and support the amount of seismic surveying and the number and conceptual targets of wells to be drilled.

## 1.1.2 Minimum Guaranteed Work Program

The applicant's minimum guaranteed proposal (including indicative minimum expenditure in Australian Dollars) should include exploration wells to be drilled, seismic and other surveying activities (specifying the survey technique), data evaluation and other work within the permit area, for each year of the first three years of the permit term.

Pre-purchase of existing non-exclusive data cannot form part of the work program (but any interpretation of that data included in the technical assessment will be taken into account in assessing the relative merits of the work program proposed). Such data proposed to be purchased after the award of a permit may form part of the work program provided that it does not disadvantage a competitor who purchased the data prior to bidding.

The minimum guaranteed work program should only comprise exploration work—appraisal work should not normally be included. Guidance on whether a well would be accepted as an exploration well is provided in the *Permit Conditions and Administration Guidelines* available at [www.petroleum-acreage.gov.au](http://www.petroleum-acreage.gov.au).

Applicants should note it is mandatory that the minimum work program proposed in each year of the term of the exploration permit is stated precisely to avoid any ambiguity. Proposals for work programs that cannot be guaranteed to be undertaken within the first three years of the permit term must not be included.

## 1.1.3 Secondary Work program

A secondary work program must be specified. The secondary work program should include substantial operational activities that will significantly advance exploration of the area—appraisal work should not normally be included.

The applicant's proposal (including indicative minimum expenditure) should include exploration wells to be drilled, seismic and other surveying activities (specifying the surveying technique), data evaluation and other work within the permit area, for each of the three remaining years of the permit term (the secondary work program).

**APPLICATION DETAILS**

Central to any application made is the program of work proposed for each year of the six year term. Applications are to be made in accordance with Section 31 of the *Petroleum and Geothermal Energy Resources Act 1967* and Section 21 of the *Petroleum (Submerged Lands) Act 1982* as appropriate. Consideration of an application for the grant of a petroleum Exploration Permit shall take into account work programs relative to the whole of the area applied for, the adequacy of the work program, and the applicant's technical and financial ability to undertake the work. Permits are awarded on the understanding that the first two years work commitment will be fulfilled without variation.

Where there is more than one applicant to the application, the percentage participating interests of each party to the application is to be supplied including evidence that a satisfactory settlement has been, or can be, reached on a Joint Operating Agreement (a copy of a Heads of Agreement dealing will generally suffice). All applicant parties must provide supportable evidence of adequate financial capabilities to undertake the work bid and/or proven ability to raise funds for exploration purposes.

Applicants' attention is drawn to the provisions of Division 3A of the *Petroleum and Geothermal Energy Resources Act 1967* which provides for Petroleum and Geothermal titles to subsist in respect to the same blocks.

Applicants should also make themselves aware of the existence of any areas of which have the potential to restrict exploration activities, e.g., National Parks, Nature Reserves, Marine Parks, World Heritage Areas, Conservation Reserves, Defence Areas and Mining Titles.

Insofar as Reserved Land is concerned, entry for exploration purposes is subject to approval by the Minister. In this regard, it should be noted that Government policy, at least, is such that petroleum extraction from within National Parks, Nature Reserves and access to Conservation Estates should not be presumed.

Any applications over the above onshore areas may be subject to the provisions of the Commonwealth *Native Title Act 1993* and applicants should be prepared to negotiate with Native Title parties pursuant to the right to negotiate provisions of the NTA.
