Made by the Governor in Executive Council on the recommendation of the Minister for Local Government.

### 1. Citation

This order is the *Local Government (Exmouth - Councillor Numbers) Order 2010*.

### 2. Commencement

This order comes into operation as follows —

- (a) clauses 1 and 2 — on the day on which this order is published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the order — on the day after that day.

### 3. Terms used

In this order —

**commencement day** means the day on which the rest of the order comes into operation under clause 2(b);

**next election** means the first ordinary election for the Shire of Exmouth held after commencement day;

**next election day** means the day fixed for the holding of the poll for the next election.

### 4. Change in number of councillors (s. 2.18(3)(a) of the Act)

On and from the next election day, the number of offices of councillor on the council of the Shire of Exmouth is 6.

### 5. Consequential directions (s. 9.62 of the Act)

In order to give effect to clause 4 —

- (a) Part 4 of the Act applies to preparing for and conducting the next election as if the changes effected by clause 4 take effect on commencement day; and

### 1. Citation

This order is the *Local Government (Northampton - Councillor Numbers) Order 2010*.

### 2. Commencement

This order comes into operation as follows —

- (a) clauses 1 and 2 — on the day on which this order is published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the order — on the day after that day.

### 3. Terms used

In this order —

*commencement day* means the day on which the rest of the order comes into operation under clause 2(b);

*next election* means the first ordinary election held after commencement day by the local government of the Shire of Northampton;

*next election day* means the day fixed for the holding of the poll for the next election.

### 4. Change in number of councillors (s. 2.18(3)(a) of the Act)

On and from next election day, the number of offices of councillor on the council of the Shire of Northampton is 9.

### 5. Change in number of councillors for Northampton Ward and Kalbarri Ward (s. 2.18(3)(b) of the Act)

On and from next election day, the number of offices of councillor for Northampton Ward is 5 and for Kalbarri Ward is 4.

### 6. Consequential directions

In order to give effect to clauses 4 and 5 —

- (a) Part 4 of the Act applies to preparing for and conducting the next election as if the changes effected by clauses 4 and 5 take effect on commencement day; and

- (b) the operation of Part 4 of the Act is modified to the extent necessary for the purposes of paragraph (a).

## Local Government (Victoria Park - Ward Names and Boundaries) Order 2010

Made by the Governor in Executive Council on the recommendation of the Minister for Local Government.

### 1. Citation

This order is the *Local Government (Victoria Park - Ward Names and Boundaries) Order 2010*.

### 2. Commencement

This order comes into operation as follows —

- (a) clauses 1 and 2 — on the day on which the order is published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the order — on the day after that day.

### 3. Terms used

In this order —

***commencement day*** means the day on which the rest of the order comes into operation under clause 2(b);

***continuing councillor*** means a councillor on the council of the Town of Victoria Park whose term of office as councillor continues beyond next election day;

***next election*** means the first ordinary election for the Town of Victoria Park held after commencement day;

***next election day*** means the day fixed for the holding of the poll for the next election;

***Ward*** means a ward of the district of Victoria Park.

- 4. Change of ward name and boundaries: Carlisle Ward**
- (1) On and from next election day, the name of the Carlisle Ward is changed to Banksia Ward.
  - (2) On and from next election day, the boundaries of the Banksia Ward are changed so that the ward consists of the land described in Schedule 1.
- 5. Change of ward name and boundaries: Victoria Park Ward**
- (1) On and from next election day, the name of the Victoria Park Ward is changed to Jarrah Ward.
  - (2) On and from next election day, the boundaries of the Jarrah Ward are changed so that the ward consists of the land described in Schedule 2.
- 6. Continuing councillors allocated to Banksia Ward and Jarrah Ward (s. 9.62 of the Act)**
- (1) A continuing councillor who was a councillor for the Carlisle Ward immediately before the changes under clause 4 is, on and from next election day, to be taken to have been elected as a councillor for the Banksia Ward.
  - (2) A continuing councillor who was a councillor for the Victoria Park Ward immediately before the changes under clause 5 is, on and from next election day, to be taken to have been elected as a councillor for the Jarrah Ward.
  - (3) For the avoidance of doubt, it is declared that this clause does not affect the term of office of any continuing councillor.
- 7. Consequential directions (s. 9.62 of the Act)**
- In order to give effect to clauses 4, 5 and 6 —
- (a) Part 4 of the Act applies to preparing for and conducting the next election as if the changes effected by those clauses take effect on commencement day; and
  - (b) the operation of Part 4 of the Act is modified to the extent necessary for the purposes of paragraph (a).

### **Schedule 1 — Banksia Ward**

[cl. 4]

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the prolongation westerly of a northern side of Welshpool Road with the prolongation southerly of the centreline of Shepperton Road, a point on a present southern boundary of the Town of Victoria Park and extending northerly to and northerly and generally northwesterly along that centreline and onward to the High Water Mark of the left bank of the Swan River, a point on a present northwestern boundary of the Town of Victoria Park and thence generally northerly, generally southeasterly, southwesterly, northwesterly, generally southwesterly, again generally southeasterly, again southwesterly and westerly along boundaries of that town to the starting point.

## Schedule 2 — Jarrah Ward

[cl. 5]

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the prolongation westerly of a northern side of Welshpool Road with the prolongation southerly of the centreline of Shepperton Road, a point on a present southern boundary of the Town of Victoria Park and extending northerly to and northerly and generally northwesterly along that centreline and onward to the High Water Mark of the left bank of the Swan River, a point on a present northwestern boundary of the Town of Victoria Park and thence generally southwesterly, southeasterly, southwesterly, northwesterly, again southwesterly, again southeasterly, generally southerly, easterly, generally northeasterly, generally northwesterly and again easterly along boundaries of that town to the starting point.

*Town of Kwinana*

#### PARKING AND PARKING FACILITIES LOCAL LAW 2010

Under the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1995*, and under all other powers enabling it, the Town of Kwinana resolved on 15 December 2010 to adopt the following local law.

#### Preamble

The principal local law *Town of Vincent Parking and Parking Facilities Local Law 2007* as published in the *Government Gazette* on 21 November 2007, including the amendments as published in the *Government Gazette* on 5 August 2008 and on 27 February 2009, is adopted as the local law of the Town of Kwinana with the modifications as set out below.

#### 1. Preliminary

Delete the words “Town of Vincent” wherever they appear in this local law and insert “Town of Kwinana” instead.

#### 2. Part 1 amended

2.1 Delete clause 1.1 and insert—

##### 1.1 Citation

This local law is the *Town of Kwinana Parking and Parking Facilities Local Law 2010*.

2.2 In clause 1.2(1) delete “objective” and insert “purpose”, and delete clause 1.2 heading and insert—

##### 1.2 Purpose and effect

2.3 Delete clause 1.4 and insert—

The Town of Kwinana Parking Local Law 2000 published in the *Government Gazette* on 29 November 2000 is repealed.

2.4 In clause 1.5 delete subclauses (1) and (4) and insert respectively—

(1) Subject to subclause (2), this local law applies to the parking region as described in Schedule 1.



- (4) Where a parking facility or a parking station is identified in Schedule 6, the facility or station shall be deemed to be a facility or station to which this local law applies.

2.5 In clause 1.6 delete the definitions “authorised person” and “parking region”, and insert the following definitions in alphabetical order—

“**authorised person**” means a person appointed by the local government under section 9.10 or the Act, to perform any of the functions of an authorised person under this local law;

“**parking region**” means the whole of the district except for those areas, roads, bridges and subways under the control and direction of the Commissioner of Main Roads;

“**costs**” of the local government include its administrative costs;

“**residential zone**” means land within the residential zone specified within the Town of Kwinana’s local planning scheme dealing with zoning;

“**special residential zone**” means land within the special residential zone specified within the Town of Kwinana’s local planning scheme dealing with zoning;

### 3. Part 3 amended

3.1 In clause 3.1 designate the first subclause“(1)” and insert new subclause (2)—

- (2) Where the local government makes a determination under subclause (1) it shall erect signs to give effect to the determination.

### 4. Part 4 amended

4.1 In clause 4.1 delete subclause (4).

4.2 In clause 4.1 re-designate subclause “(5)” to “(4)”.

4.3 In clause 4.9(1)(e) delete “Schedule 7” and insert “Schedule 6”.

4.4 Delete clause 4.14 and its heading and insert—

4.14 Vehicles prohibited in the residential and special residential zones

- (1) No person shall park for more than 4 hours consecutively within the residential and special residential zones—

- (a) more than one commercial vehicle;
- (b) any vehicle which, due to its size or load, is not capable of being completely housed within a garage or building approved by council; or
- (c) a vehicle which, together with its load, exceeds 3 metres in height.

- (2) No person shall, within the residential and special residential zones—

- (a) repair, service or clean a commercial vehicle unless such work is carried out whilst the vehicle is completely housed within a garage or building approved by council; or
- (b) park or allow to remain stationary a commercial vehicle of a load capacity exceeding 2 tonnes or allow the vehicle to remain stationary.

- (3) Subclauses (1) and (2) do not apply to—

- (a) a commercial vehicle when it is being loaded or unloaded with reasonable expedition with goods, merchandise or materials collected from or delivered to the premises; or
- (b) a commercial vehicle associated with building works being carried out on the premises.

### 5. Part 5 amended

5.1 Delete clause 5.17 and its heading and insert—

5.17 Stopping on a carriageway—heavy and long vehicles

Subject to any clause to the contrary or sign referable to the carriageway, a person shall not park a vehicle or any combination of vehicles, that, together with any projection on, or load carried by, the vehicle or combination of vehicles, is eight metres or more in length or exceeds a GVM of 4.5 tonnes—

- (a) on a carriageway in a built-up area, for any period exceeding 2 hours, unless engaged in the picking up or setting down of goods; or
- (b) on a carriageway outside a built-up area, except on the shoulder of the carriageway, or in a truck bay or other area set aside for the parking of such vehicles.

### 6. Part 7 amended

6.1 In clauses 7.3(1) and 7.3(2) delete “Schedule 8” and insert “Schedule 7”.

6.2 In clause 7.6 delete subclauses (2) and (5) and insert respectively—

- (2) The local government shall give notice referred to in subclause (1) in the form of Item 3(a) of Schedule 8 by serving the notice on the eligible person to whom the permit was issued.
- (5) The local government shall give notice of the revocation in the form of Item 3(b) of Schedule 8 by serving the notice on the eligible person to whom the permit was issued.

#### 7. Part 9 amended

7.1 In clause 9.2 delete paragraphs (a) and (c) and insert respectively—

- (a) notice to the owner of a vehicle involved in an offence referred to in section 9.13 of the Act is that of the form in Schedule 3;
- (c) withdrawal of infringement notice referred to in section 9.20 of the Act is that of the form in Schedule 5.

#### 8. Schedules amended

8.1 Delete Schedules 1 to 9 and insert—

#### *Schedule 1—Parking region*

#### PARKING REGION

The parking region is the whole of the district, but excludes the following portions of the district—

1. the approach and departure prohibition areas of all existing and future traffic control signal installations as determined by the Commissioner of Main Roads;
2. prohibition areas applicable to all existing and future bridges and subways as determined by the Commissioner of Main Roads;
3. any road which comes under the control of the Commissioner of Main Roads unless the control of parking and parking facilities on that road is carried out subject to the control and direction of the Commissioner of Main Roads or has been delegated by the Commissioner to the local government.
