City of Vincent

PARKING AND PARKING FACILITIES AMENDMENT LOCAL LAW 2011

Under the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1995* and by all other powers enabling it, the Council of the City of Vincent resolved on 5 July 2011 to make the following local law.

1. Citation

This local law may be cited as the City of Vincent Parking and Parking Facilities Amendment Local Law 2011.

2. Commencement

This local law comes into operation 14 days after the date of its publication in the $Government\ Gazette$.

3. Principal local law

In this local law, the *Town of Vincent Parking and Parking Facilities Local Law 2007* published in the *Government Gazette* on 21 November 2007, amended and published in the *Government Gazette* on 5 August 2008 and 27 February 2009, is referred to as the principal local law. The principal local law is amended.

4. Table of Contents amended

- 4.1 Re-designate clause numbers from "6.1" through to "6.5" to "6.2" through to "6.6" respectively.
- 4.2 Before clause 6.2, insert new clause heading—
 - 6.1 Establishment of metered zones, metered stalls and ticket zones
- 4.3 Delete the Part 7 heading and insert—

PART 7—PARKING PERMITS

Delete clause 7.9 and insert—

7.9 Display of parking permit

Delete Schedules 6 to 9 headings and insert—

Schedule 6—Parking Permits

5. Clause 1.5 amended

In clause 1.5, delete subclause (4) and insert—

(4) Where a parking facility or a parking station is determined to be under the care, control and management of the City, then the facility or station shall be deemed to be a facility or station to which this local law applies and it shall not be necessary to prove that it is the subject of an agreement referred to in subclause (2).

6. Clause 4.9 amended

In clause 4.9(1), delete paragraph (e) and insert—

(e) which is determined by a local government resolution to be a parking station under the care, control and management of the City.

7. Clause 6 amended

7.1 Re-designate clause numbers from "6.1" through to "6.5" to "6.2" through to "6.6" respectively.

7.2 Before clause 6.2, insert new clause—

6.1 Establishment of metered zones, metered stalls and ticket zones

- (1) The local government may, by resolution—
 - (a) establish;
 - (b) indicate by signs; and
 - (c) vary from time to time;

metered zones, metered spaces and ticket zones.

- (2) In relation to metered zones, metered spaces and ticket zones, the local government may prescribe—
 - (a) conditions and permitted times of parking;
 - (b) the manner of parking; and
 - (c) the classes of vehicles permitted to park;

but this authority shall not be exercised in a manner which is inconsistent with the provisions of this local law or any other written law.

8. Part 7 amended

Delete the Part 7 heading and insert—

PART 7—PARKING PERMITS

9. Clause 7.1 amended

9.1 In clause 7.1, delete the "eligible person" definition and insert—

"eligible person" where used in relation to an application for a-

- (a) "residential parking permit" means an owner or occupier of a single house, grouped dwelling or multiple dwelling;
- (b) "visitor's parking permit" means—
 - (i) a single house owner or occupier;
 - (ii) a strata company;
 - (iii) a unit owner or occupier of a residential unit which is not a strata lot;
 - (iv) a grouped dwelling owner or occupier; or
 - (v) a multiple dwelling owner or occupier;
- (c) "commercial parking permit" means the proprietor of a commercial business;
- 9.2 Insert the following definitions in alphabetical order—
 - "commercial parking permit" means a permit issued to a business by the local government pursuant to clause 7.3(3);
 - "grouped dwelling" means a dwelling that is one of a group of two or more dwellings on the same lot such that no dwelling is placed wholly or partially vertically above another, except where special conditions of landscape or topography dictate otherwise, and includes a dwelling on a survey strata with common property;
 - "multiple dwelling" means a dwelling in a group of more than one dwelling on a lot where 50 percent or greater of floor area of a dwelling is vertically above part of any other but—
 - (a) does not include a grouped dwelling; and
 - (b) includes any dwellings above the ground floor in a mixed use development;

10. Clause 7.3 amended

In clause 7.3, delete subclauses (1) to (4) and insert—

- (1) The local government may upon a written application of an eligible person issue a residential parking permit in the form of Item 1 of Schedule 6.
- (2) The local government may upon a written application of an eligible person issue for the occasional use of visitors, a visitor's parking permit in the form of Item 2 of Schedule 6.
- (3) The local government may upon a written application of an eligible person issue a commercial parking permit in the form of Item 3 of Schedule 6.
- (4) The local government's power to issue, replace and revoke permits under this Part may be exercised by an authorised officer.
- (5) Notwithstanding any other provision in this local law, the local government may approve the issue of a number of residential, visitor's or commercial parking permits (as applicable) to any eligible person on such terms and conditions as the local government sees fit.

11. Clause 7.5 amended

Delete clause 7.5 and its heading and insert—

7.5 Validity of permit

Every residential, visitor's or commercial parking permit as the case may be, shall cease to be valid upon—

- (a) the expiry of a period of either 1 or 3 years (depending upon the permit issued) from and including the date on which it is issued;
- (b) the holder of the permit ceasing to be an eligible person;
- (c) the revocation of the permit by the local government pursuant to clause 7.6°
- (d) the replacement of any permit by a new permit issued by the local government pursuant to clause 7.3.

12. Clause 7.7 amended

Delete clause 7.7 and its heading and insert—

7.7 Removal of permit from vehicle

The holder of a residential, visitor's or commercial parking permit shall, upon that permit being revoked or ceasing to be valid, remove the permit from the vehicle in which it is displayed or to which it is affixed.

13. Clause 7.8 amended

In clause 7.8, delete subclause (1) and insert—

(1) The local government may upon a written application of an eligible person and upon payment of the fee referred to in subclause (2), if any, issue a permit to replace a residential, visitor's or commercial parking permit which is lost, misplaced, destroyed or stolen.

14. Clause 7.9 amended

Delete clause 7.9 heading and insert—

7.9 Display of parking permit

15. Schedule 2 amended

Delete Schedule 2 and insert—

SWIMMING PROHIBITED AREA

Princess Royal Harbour Albany Waterfront Marina

> Department of Transport, Fremantle WA, 12 July 2011.

Acting pursuant to the powers conferred by Regulation 10A of the Navigable Waters Regulations 1958, I hereby prohibit swimming from the following areas of navigable waters—

All the waters of the Albany Waterfront Marina and the Albany Port Authority's Tug Boat Harbour contained within a line between point A near the tip of the Marina's Southern Breakwater at position 35°01.995'S, 117°53.299'E and point B near the tip of the Tug Boat Harbour's Southern Breakwater at position 35°01.983'S, 117°53.362'E;

Excluding a small area of water bounded by the shore and lines commencing at point C, at position 35°01.866'S, 117°53.368'E (on the marina's sandy beach, approximately 10 metres in from its eastern edge); thence to point D at position 35°01.878'S, 117°53.359'E (approximately 10 metres out from the high water mark); thence from that position to the tip of the beach groyne (at approximately 35°01.868'S, 117°53.342'E).

WORKERS' COMPENSATION AND INJURY MANAGEMENT ACT 1981

CRITERIA FOR DESIGNATION AS AN APPROVED MEDICAL SPECIALIST

The following criteria are applied by WorkCover WA when deciding whether a medical practitioner is suitable for designation as an approved medical specialist—

To be designated as an approved medical specialist, under section 146F91) of the Workers' Compensation and Injury Management Act 1981, a person must—

- 1. Be registered as a medical practitioner; and
- 2. Provide evidence of current clinical practice and/or expertise in assessment; and
- 3. Have undertaken training in the WorkCover WA Education Module, which includes training in the WorkCover WA Guides; and
- 4. (i) Undertaken training in the use of the edition of the American Medical Association Guides to the Evaluation of Permanent Impairment upon which the current edition of the WorkCover WA Guides are based; or
 - (ii) Have current accreditation as a "Certified Independent Medical Examiner" with the American Board of Independent Medical Examiners (ABIME); or
 - (iii) Undertaken other training in impairment assessment approved by WorkCover WA; and
- (i) Have qualifications as a specialist; or
 - (ii) Be able to demonstrate competency levels acceptable to WorkCover WA.

Other (non-specialist) medical practitioners should note that in order to demonstrate the competency required, WorkCover WA will take into consideration the applicant's relevant skills, experience and qualifications. As a guide, WorkCover WA will review the extent to which a medical practitioner has—

- Significant work in a medical practice with consistent management and assessment of injured workers;
- Experience in undertaking medical assessments of injured workers;
- Relevant qualifications, for example ABIME exam certification or other similar qualifications related to medico-legal assessments or disability assessments.
