Fair Trading Act 2010

Fair Trading (Fitness Industry Code of Practice) Amendment Regulations 2013

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations are the Fair Trading (Fitness Industry Code of Practice) Amendment Regulations 2013.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations on the day after that day.

3. Regulations amended

These regulations amend the Fair Trading (Fitness Industry Code of Practice) Regulations 2010.

4. Regulation 3 amended

In regulation 3(2):

- (a) delete "is";
- (b) delete "2010 Part 4" and insert:

1987 section 43(1), continues in force

The permit boundaries remain static while the permit is in force and subject to change at each renewal or change in title status in line with the most recent Australian Maritime Boundary dataset.

Applicants' attention is drawn to the provisions of Division 3A of the PGERA67 which provides for Petroleum and Geothermal titles to subsist in respect to the same blocks.

Many of the discrete areas are in close proximity to sensitive environments. Applicants are advised to investigate at the earliest opportunity, the extent of any areas which have the potential to restrict or otherwise diminish proposed exploration activities; e.g. Environmentally Sensitive Areas, Red Book Areas, Threatened Ecological Communities, National Parks, Nature Reserves, Marine Parks, World and National Heritage Areas, Conservation Reserves, Defence Areas and Mining Titles. Accordingly, additional environmental assessment is likely to be required for any petroleum exploration activities in or adjacent to these areas and applicants are advised to take this into consideration in developing their application.

Proposals to explore and operate within Class A reserves (e.g. National Parks and Nature Reserves and equivalent Marine Reserves) and other conservation estates will be referred by the Department of Mines and Petroleum to the Department of Environment and Conservation (DEC) (and the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) where appropriate) for advice.

Applicants may also need to consult with the Department of Sustainability, Environment, Water Population and Communities, if proposed activities will have, or are likely to have a significant impact on a matter of national environmental significance. Environmental maps are included in the information package available from the Department of Mines and Petroleum's website.

In respect to State waters, impacts on fishing activities should also be considered. Applicants should note that they will be required to initiate contact with relevant industry bodies concerning their exploration activities at the earliest possible stage when planning operations. Due regard must also be given to recreational fishing vessels at all times and the successful applicants will need to consult with both the Western Australian Fishing Industry Council (WAFIC) and Recfishwest in the course of developing petroleum exploration plans for these areas.

Any applications over onshore areas administered under the PGERA67, including waters containing islands, may be subject to the provisions of the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth) (NTA) and applicants should be prepared to negotiate with native title parties pursuant to the right to negotiate provisions of the NTA. Plans showing these claim boundaries are available as part of the information package.

Onshore areas (including islands) available for application are subject (at least in part) to registered native title claims and/or determined holder interests. Plans showing these boundaries are available as part of the information package.

SPECIAL NOTICES

Many of the Release Areas contain at least one or more Environmentally Sensitive Area (ESA), Red Book Area, Threatened Ecological Communities (TEC), Nature Reserves (NR) or National Parks (NP). Accordingly, additional environmental assessment is likely to be required for petroleum exploration activities in these areas and applicants are advised to take this into consideration in developing their application.

Release Area L12-1 is located in internal waters of the Northern Carnarvon Basin and includes islands, Nature Reserves and Marine Management Areas and habitats known to be of importance to *Environment Protection Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act 1999) listed species.

The reserves affected include the North Sandy Island Nature Reserve (CR 44668), Great Sandy Island Nature Reserve (CR 33831) and the Barrow Island Marine Management Area (M 11). It is not envisaged that access to islands will be permitted for petroleum exploration activities.

The migratory path of the listed 'vulnerable' Humpback Whale runs through Release Area L12-1, and other conservation significant and migratory species including dugongs, whale sharks and marine turtles, are likely to occur within L12-1. Applicants are required to make themselves aware of their obligations under the EPBC Act 1999 and take these into consideration when developing their application.

It should be understood that activities in Release Area L12-1 that cannot completely avoid these sensitivities will require formal referral to the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA), may possibly require consultation with and referral to DEC, and may also potentially require referral to the Commonwealth Department of Sustainability, Environment, Water, Population and Communities (SEWPaC) if proposed activities will have, or are likely to have, a significant impact on a matter of national environmental significance.

It should also be noted that numerous key fisheries operate, or have jurisdiction to operate, in the area. The successful applicant will be required to consult with both the Western Australian Fishing Industry Council (WAFIC) and Recfishwest in the course of developing exploration plans and this should be taken into consideration when developing an application.

Combined Discrete Release Areas L13-1 and T13-1 are located in internal waters of the Northern Carnarvon Basin and encroach on the Barrow Island Marine Management Area (M 11). This marine reserve permits petroleum exploration subject to *Environmental Protection Act 1986* (WA) assessment.

The migratory path of the listed vulnerable Humpback whale runs through the Release Areas, and several other threatened and migratory species, including dugongs, whale sharks and turtles, including the endangered Loggerhead turtle, are likely to occur within the area. The Release Areas are also an important foraging area for the Green, Hawksbill and Flatback turtles, with the adjacent Barrow Island and surrounding waters being critical nesting and internesting habitat for these turtles. The endangered Loggerhead turtle is also known to occur in the area.

Successful applicants are therefore required to make themselves aware of their obligations under the EPBC Act 1999, and DMP recommends identifying limiting factors such as seasonal migration and breeding events, and peak activity, as early in the proposal development stage as possible.

It should also be noted that key fisheries operate, or have jurisdiction to operate, in the Release Areas and as such the successful applicant will be required to consult with both WAFIC and Recfishwest in the course of developing exploration plans and this should be taken into consideration when developing their application.

Release Area L13-2 is located near the internal waters of the Northern Carnarvon Basin and encroaches into the (proposed) Girilia Conservation Area (National Park), a significant environmental feature in this area. The internal waters of L13-2 contain part of the Ningaloo coastline, a National Heritage Place (NHL0105881) of importance to EPBC Act 1999 listed species. There are also watercourses in the south of this release area, which support significant biodiversity.

It should be understood that proposed activities in this release area, where the above sensitivities cannot be avoided, may require formal referral to DEC and SEWPaC.

Release Area L13-3 is located in the Perth Basin and overlays six Strict Nature Reserves (IUCN Protected Area 1a). These reserves represent significant biological assemblages. It should be understood that any activities wholly or partly within 500m of the reserves will require referral to the EPA.

The reserves referred to include Eradu Nature Reserve (A2070), Beetalyinna Nature Reserve (A2069), Burma Road Nature Reserve (A26663), Erangy Spring Nature Reserve (A37316), Indarra Spring Nature Reserve (A41885) and the Forty Four Mile Nature Reserve (A1017).

Declared Rare Flora populations are known to be scattered throughout release area L13-3. Successful applicants should be aware that any activities which may impact Declared Rare Flora will require consultation with and/or referral to DEC. Successful applicants should also investigate as early as possible, the potential for proposed activities to have, or be likely to have, a significant impact on a matter of national environmental significance.

Applicants should also note the Wicherina Catchment Area, a public drinking water source area, in Release Area L13-3. Any activities within 1km of the Wicherina Catchment Area may be referred to the Department of Water. The Dampier to Bunbury Natural Gas Pipeline also runs through the Release Area.

Breeding habitat of the Carnaby's Black Cockatoo is widespread throughout Release Area L13-3 and other EPBC Act 1999 listed species are likely to inhabit the Release Area. Successful applicants are required to make themselves aware of their obligations under the EPBC Act 1999 and take these into consideration when developing an application.

Release Area L13-4 is located in the Officer Basin and key environmental features include major watercourses and water bodies such as Lake Gillen, Boyd Lagoon and Lake Breaden. EPBC listed species such as the 'vulnerable' Slender-billed Thornbill and the Great Desert Skink are likely to occupy this area. Proponents should be aware that formal referral to SEWPaC is required if proposed activities will have, or are likely to have, a significant impact on a matter of national environmental significance.

Release Area L13-5 is situated in the Officer Basin and includes Baker Lake, an EPA Red Book Area, as well as major watercourses and water bodies including Lake Breaden.

Several EPBC listed species are likely to inhabit the Release Area including, the Northern Marsupial Mole and the Black-footed Rock-wallaby. Applicants are required to make themselves aware of their obligations under the EPBC Act 1999 and take these into consideration when developing an application. It should be understood that formal referral to SEWPaC is required if proposed activities will have, or are likely to have, a significant impact on a matter of national environmental significance.
