fewer, the licensee having declared in the application for the permit —

- (a) that the maximum number of persons who may be on the licensed premises when the application is made is 120 or fewer; or
- (b) if paragraph (a) does not apply that the licensee consents to the imposition on the licence of a condition limiting the maximum number of persons who may be on the licensed premises to 120.
