"Agenda" means in relation to any proposed meeting, a paper listing the terms of business to be transacted at the meeting and the order of that business;

"index" means the sequential arrangement of items in numerical order as they appear in the Agenda;

5. Clause 2.19 amended

In Clause 2.19, delete subclause (7) and (8) and insert the following—

- (7) Any reports or items listed in the Agenda which are the subject of a question or statement from a member of the public—
 - (a) are to be considered in the numerical order as they appear in the Index;
 - (b) are to be considered immediately after all unopposed items have been determined, which will be moved " $En\ Bloc$ ".
- (8) The presiding member or the Council by carrying a motion, without debate, may alter the order in which any item, which is the subject of a question or statement from a member of the public, may be dealt with.
- (9) The presiding member or the majority of members present voting in the affirmative, may determine that the time available for question time is to be limited or extended, as the case may be, however, in any case shall not be less than 15 minutes.

6. Clause 5.4 amended

Delete Clause 5.4 and substitute the following—

5.4 Order of call in debate-

The presiding member shall call speakers to a substantive motion in the following order—

- (i) the mover to state the motion;
- (ii) a seconder to the motion;
- (iii) the mover to speak to the motion;
- (iv) the seconder to speak to the motion;
- (v) speakers for and against the motion until all members wishing to speak have been given the opportunity to speak; and
- (vi) the mover takes the right of reply, which closes the debate.

7. Clause 7.10 amended

Delete Clause 7.10 (3) and substitute the following—

(3) A member moving the suspension of Standing Orders under this clause shall state the purpose of the suspension and/or the specific clause or clauses of the Standing Orders sought to be suspended.
