Fish Resources Management Act 1994

Fish Resources Management Amendment Regulations (No. 8) 2013

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations are the Fish Resources Management Amendment Regulations (No. 8) 2013.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations on the day after that day.

3. Regulations amended

These regulations amend the Fish Resources Management Regulations 1995.

4. Schedule 1 amended

In Schedule 1 Part 3 delete item 2(b) and insert:

- (b) a licence that authorises the aquaculture of marron only and is subject to the condition that the sale of the marron is prohibited unless
 - (i) the marron are of a length not less than 76 mm; and
 - (ii) the majority of the marron are sold to persons who hold an aquaculture licence or a fish processor's licence; and
 - (iii) no more than 100 kg of marron in total is sold to persons who do not hold an aquaculture licence or a fish processor's licence during the period for which the licence remains in force

This declaration is the Biosecurity and Agriculture Management (Prohibited Organisms) Declaration (No. 2) 2013.

2. Prohibited organisms

- (1) An organism listed in the Table is declared under section 12(1) of the Act to be a prohibited organism.
- (2) Under section 22(1) of the Act a prohibited organism is a declared pest for the whole of the State.
- (3) An organism listed in the Table is assigned under the Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Regulations 2013 regulation 8 for the area specified opposite it in the Table—
 - (a) to the control category specified opposite it in the Table; and

Conservation and Land Management (Excision from timber Reserve) Order (No. 1) 2013

This order may be cited as the Conservation and Land Management (Excision from Timber Reserve) Order (No. 1) 2013.

2. Background to this order

- (1) The Shire of Manjimup has requested the excision of a portion of Timber Reserve No. 159/25 situated approximately six kilometres west of Manjimup.
- (2) The proposed excision is required to rationalise management of Appadene Road so that the road as constructed is wholly within a road reserve.
- (3) In accordance with section 17(6a) of the Act, the Minister for the Environment, with the concurrence of the Minister for Forestry, recommends that the proposed excision be put into effect.
- (4) The land referred to in subclause (1) has been surveyed and is now described in Schedule 1.

TOTAL FIRE BAN REVOCATION

Pursuant to powers delegated under the *Bush Fires Act 1954*, the Assistant Commissioner of the Department of Fire and Emergency Services, revoke the total fire ban issued for 13th November 2013 from 0510, for the local government districts of—

All waters of Waroona Dam south of a line through 32°50.454′S, 115°59.254′E and 32°50.498′S, 115°59.342′E (across its northern branch approximately 840 metres north-east of the dam wall); and west of a line through 32°50.914′S, 115°59.975′E and 32°50.827′S, 116°00.138′E (across its eastern branch in the order of 1.6 kilometres metres east of the dam wall); and north of a line through 32°51.128′S, 115°59.400′E and 32°51.126′S, 115°59.472′E (across a small branch in the order of 800 metres south-east of the dam wall); and north of a line approximately 200 metres from the dam wall through 32°50.728′S, 115°59.036′E and 32°50.906′S, 115°59.218′E.

Whilst the official Waroona Dam water level is equal to or higher that 196 metres but less than 200 metres above the Australian Height Datum as published by the Water Corporation of Western Australia—

All those waters of Waroona Dam south of a line through $32^{\circ}50.658'S$, $115^{\circ}59.081'E$ and $32^{\circ}50.733'S$, $115^{\circ}59.273'E$ (across its northern branch approximately 420 metres north-east of the dam wall) and west of a line through $32^{\circ}51.045'S$, $115^{\circ}59.373'E$ and $32^{\circ}50.931'S$, $115^{\circ}59.529'E$ (across its eastern branch in the order of 700 metres east of the dam wall), and north of a line approximately 200 metres from the dam wall through $32^{\circ}50.728'S$, $115^{\circ}59.036'E$ and $32^{\circ}50.906'S$, $115^{\circ}59.218'E$. All coordinates based on GDA 94.

Providing however that water skiing is not permitted within 45 metres of the foreshore. The direction of all water skiing in Waroona Dam shall be in an anti-clockwise direction. Skiing is only permitted within the hours of sunrise and sunset only.

This dam is 'Closed to Water Skiing' when the official water level is below 196 metres above Australian Height Datum, as published by the Water Corporation of Western Australia.
