I, Ken Baston MLC, Minister for Fisheries, hereby declare in accordance with Section 101A (2A) of the *Fish Resources Management Act 1994*, an area of WA waters described in Schedule 1 to be the Kimberley Aquaculture Development Zone.

INSTRUMENT OF REVOCATION OF DELEGATIONS AND INSTRUMENT OF DELEGATION

- I, Donald Terrence Redman MLA, acting in my capacity as the body corporate Minister for Lands continued by section 7(1) of the Land Administration Act 1997 (Act)
 - a. Under section 59 of the *Interpretation Act 1984* and under section 9 of the Act, revoke all delegations made under the Act and the *Land Administration Regulations 1998* (Regulations) in favour of officers within the Department of Regional Development and Lands, as published in the Gazette of 1 November 2013; and
 - b. Under section 9 of the Act, delegate to the persons for the time being holding or acting in the positions in the Department of Lands (Department) specified in Column 1 of the Schedule the powers conferred and duties imposed on me by the provisions of the Act and the Regulations specified in Column 2 of the Schedule opposite the positions, to the extent specified (if at all) in Column 3 of the Schedule opposite the powers and duties, except that no powers are delegated in respect of the execution of any LAA Instrument* that is to, or for the benefit of, the Native Title Party* under a Native Title Agreement*.
- * For the purposes of this Instrument of Delegation—
 - "LAA Instrument" has the same meaning as the term "instrument" is defined in the Act.

"Native Title Agreement" means any agreement that is-

- (i) an indigenous land use agreement under the Native Title Act 1993 (Cth) (NTA);
- (ii) a deed under section 31 of the NTA;
- (iii) an agreement for the withdrawal or 'lifting' of objections made under s24MD(6B) of the NTA and/or the Act; or
- (iv) a letter of intent, a "letter agreement" or any similar type of arrangement,

under which Crown land is being agreed to be the subject of a LAA Instrument or any other type of benefit is being agreed to be conferred in exchange for an outcome being achieved or intended to be achieved under the NTA and/or the Act in respect of native title rights and interests claimed or held in the relevant Crown land.

"Native Title Party" means any person or persons on whom a benefit is being conferred pursuant to a Native Title Agreement (including under a LAA Instrument) as consideration for the outcome under the NTA and/or the Act in respect of native title rights and interests claimed or held in the relevant Crown land.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

Shire of Chittering FIREBREAK NOTICE

All owners and/or occupiers of land situated in the Shire of Chittering

As a measure to assist in the control of bush fires, or prevent the spread or extension of a bush fire which may occur, all owners and occupiers of land within the shire's district are required before the 16th day of October in each year, or within 14 days of becoming the owner or occupier of land if after that date, to clear firebreaks or take measures in accordance with this notice and maintain those firebreaks and measures in accordance with this notice up to and including the 31st day of May in the following year.

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the *Bush Fires Act 1954*, you are hereby required to clear all flammable material from fire breaks, not less than 3 metres in width and 4 metres in height, immediately inside all external boundaries of any lot owned or occupied by you and situated within the Shire of Chittering. Such firebreaks may be constructed by one or more of the following methods—

 Ploughing, Cultivating, Scarifying, Raking, Burning, Chemical Spraying Or Other Approved Method. The following land categories are to be cleared and maintained to the satisfaction of an Authorised Officer of the Shire.

Rural Residential and Shire Town sites with land with less than 2 hectares

Do not require firebreaks but are required to follow General Fire Hazard Reduction.

All properties, including Rural Residential and Shire Town sites with land equal to or greater than $2\ \mathrm{hectares}$

Must clear a firebreak of all flammable materials three (3) metres wide, with a four (4) metre vertical clearance along the inside of the boundary to the property.

Land greater than 120 hectares

Land with an area of 120 hectares or more must have a firebreak in such a position which divides the land into areas not exceeding 120 hectares.

Fire Management Plans

Where Fire Management Plans have been implemented as part of a subdivision, property owners must ensure their property meets the requirements as outlined in the Fire Management Plan. Property owners should seek clarification from the Shire of Chittering if they are unsure in regards to their responsibilities and the requirements contained within their Fire Management Plan and this Firebreak Notice.

Buildings, haystacks and fuel storage

Clear a firebreak, not less than three (3) metres wide with a four (4) metre vertical clearance completely surrounding and not more than twenty (20) metres from the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas within the property.

General Fire Hazard Reduction

All property owners are required to reduce fire hazards on their property prior to the summer season by maintaining grassed areas as far as reasonably practicable, to 50mm in height over the entire area, by slashing or the application of stock. It is recommended that property owners program their hazard reduction in conjunction with the clearing and maintenance of firebreaks. Hazard Reduction Orders will be issued where landowners have failed to reduce fire hazards.

Installation of a Building Protection Zone

A Building Protection Zone of 20 metres is to be constructed within the Lot around all buildings as follows—

- The first 5m around all buildings is to be cleared of all flammable material. Reticulated gardens may be located in this zone;
- The spacing of trees should be 15-20 metres apart to provide for a separation of 10 metres between crowns;
- Trees are to be under/low pruned at least to a height of 2 metres;
- No tall shrub or tree is to be planted within 2 metres of a building including windows

Alternative Firebreaks

If it is impractical for you to clear a firebreak along your boundary you can request permission from the Shire to install a firebreak in an alternative location or of a different nature. All requests must be in writing to the Shire and received by **1 October**.

Harvesting operations (including stubble processing)

The Shire will permit harvesting operations, including stubble processing, during the Restricted and Prohibited period on the following conditions—

- That a fully operational firefighting unit (inclusive of associated pump, hose system and a minimum of 600 litres of water is present) at all times.
- Harvesting operations, and stubble processing, are not permitted when the Shire has declared a Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban, including Hot Works Activities.

Harvesting operations (including stubble processing) on Sunday and Public Holidays, excepting Christmas, Boxing Day and New Year's Day, will be permitted on the following conditions, in addition to the conditions above—

- The Local Fire Control Officer is notified.
- Two (2) able-bodied adult persons are present during the harvesting operations, only one (1) of whom may be harvesting.

Restricted and Prohibited Burning Periods

Burning is prohibited from 1 December to 31 March. Permits are required from 19 October to 30 November and 1 April to 31 May.

Control of operations likely to cause a fire

Property owners should take care to prevent bush fires. The operation of welding equipment and angle grinders are activities likely to create a fire danger when used in the open air. A person shall provide at least one fire extinguisher at the place where welding or cutting operations are carried out and surround this place with a firebreak which is at least five (5) metres wide.

HOT WORKS, HARVEST AND MOVEMENT OF MACHINERY BAN WILL BE IN PLACE ON CHRISTMAS, BOXING DAY AND NEWS YEARS DAY

The following restrictions apply throughout restricted and prohibited periods

- No burning on Sundays and Public Holidays
- No burning of garden refuse
- · No lighting of camp fires or solid fuel BBQs in the open air in the Shire of Chittering
- Burning of road side verges is prohibited without written approval from the Shire of Chittering or other authorities.

Firebreaks must be cleared by—16 October and remain cleared until 31 May

Burning is prohibited between—1 December to 31 March

Burning permits are required between—19 October to 30 November and 1 April to 31 May

Penalties

Failure to comply with this Firebreak Notice can result in fines ranging from \$250 to \$250,000 or imprisonment.

Acting pursuant to the power in section 66 of the Western Australian Marine Act 1982, I, Christopher Mather, Director Waterways Safety Management and delegate of the chief executive officer, hereby cancel the water closure order published in the Government Gazette on 27 December 2013 and hereby close all navigable waters to the operation of personal watercraft (PWC) fitted with an aerial freestyle device, with the exception of all waters within 300 metres of an approved Aerial Freestyle Area as described in Schedule A of this notice, provided they are operated in accordance with the conditions set out in Schedule B of this notice.

NAVIGABLE WATERS includes—

- (a) The territorial sea adjacent to the State;
- (b) The sea on the landward side of the territorial sea adjacent to the State that is not within the limits of the State; and
- (c) Waters within the limits of the State.

In this notice, the following definitions apply—

- 1. The aerial freestyle device means any device, Flyboard® or alike, which can be connected to a PWC so as to provide pressured water from the PWC to the device to aid propulsion at the surface of the water, into the air and/or underwater;
- 2. The aerial freestyle device user means the person attached to the aerial freestyle device PWC means as per definition at regulation 46 (2) of the *Navigable Waters Regulations 1958*;
- 3. The PWC operator means the person who is the rider and master of the PWC;
- 4. Aerial Freestyle means the practice of manoeuvring the aerial freestyle device above the surface of the water or deliberately fully submerging the aerial freestyle device user below the surface of the water.

SCHEDULE A:

Rockingham: All those waters of Mangles Bay bounded by lines commencing at position 32°16.271′S, 115°43.884′E (approximately 230 metres north-west of the Bell Park foreshore at Rockingham Beach); thence to 32°16.201′S, 115°43.981′E (200 metres north-easterly); thence to 32°16.234′S, 115°44.014′E (80 metres south-easterly); thence to 32°16.308′S, 115°43.911′E (approximately 211 metres south-westerly); thence to the point of commencement (approximately 81 metres north-westerly). All coordinates based on GDA 94.

Mandurah (COMMERCIAL OPERATIONS ONLY): All those waters of the Mandurah Estuary bounded by lines commencing at 32°31.8897′S, 115°43.0663′E (approximately 400 metres north of the centre of the old Mandurah Traffic Bridge); thence to 32°31.8917′S, 115°43.0811′E (approximately 23 metres easterly); thence to 32°31.9288′S, 115°43.0877′E (approximately 70 metres southerly); thence to 32°31.9345′S, 115°43.0728′E (approximately 25 metres westerly); thence to the point of commencement (approximately 83 metres northerly). All coordinates based on GDA94.

Broome: All those waters of the Indian Ocean bounded by the shoreline and line commencing on the foreshore at Cable Beach and extending through 17°55.305′S, 122°12.675′E to 17°55.285′S, 122°12.043′E (approximately 1100 metres westerly); thence to 17°55.046′S, 122°12.043′E (approximately 440 metres northerly); thence through 17°55.114′S, 122°12.662′E (approximately 1100 metres easterly) to the shore. All coordinates based on GDA94.

SCHEDULE B: Operating Conditions

- 1. Only one person is to use the Aerial Freestyle device at any one time;
- 2. The Aerial Freestyle device user must be at least 14 years of age;
- 3. Propulsion thrust to the Aerial Freestyle device must be controlled by the PWC operator at all times:
- 4. When the Aerial Freestyle device is being operated connected to a PWC, the PWC operator and the Aerial Freestyle device user must wear an approved personal flotation device as described in regulation 50B of the *Navigable Waters Regulations 1958*;
- 5. The PWC operator must hold a Recreational Skippers Ticket as per regulation 47 of the Navigable Waters Regulations 1958;
- 6. Whilst in operation, the PWC operator must have a PWC kill switch safety lanyard attached to them at all times;
- 7. Whilst in operation, the Aerial Freestyle device user must wear a helmet suitable for water sports at all times
- 8. The PWC must be appropriately registered for operation in Western Australia as per regulation 45B of the Navigable Waters Regulations 1958 or as a Domestic Commercial Vessel in accordance with the Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessels) National Law Act 2012;
- 9. The Aerial Freestyle device user must not engage in aerial freestyle outside of a designated aerial freestyle area;
- 10. The Aerial Freestyle device user must not engage in aerial freestyle within 15 metres of any other person or any other vessel;
- 11. The Aerial Freestyle device user must not engage in aerial freestyle in water depth less than 2.5 metres;
- 12. The Aerial Freestyle device user must not engage in deliberate porpoising in water depths less than 4 metres;
- 13. The Aerial Freestyle device can only be operated during sunrise to sunset;
- 14. General safety obligations, collision regulations and any other legislative requirements that apply to either a recreational or commercial personal water craft under the *Navigable Waters Regulations 1958* and *Western Australian Marine Act 1982* must be complied with at all times;
- 15. In addition to above, Commercial Aerial Freestyle operations must operate in accordance with any Certificate of Survey and Certificate of Operation issued for the vessel under the Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessels) National Law Act 2012;
- 16. Areas used for Commercial Operations must be clearly marked by buoys indicating the limits of the area by the commercial operator, during hours of operation.
