Settlement Agents Act 1981

Settlement Agents Amendment Regulations 2016

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations are the Settlement Agents Amendment Regulations 2016.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations when the *Settlement Agents Code of Conduct 2016* rule 34 comes into operation.

3. Regulations amended

These regulations amend the Settlement Agents Regulations 1982.

4. Regulation 6AA replaced

Delete regulation 6AA and insert:

6AA. Information to be included in appointment to act as settlement agent (Act s. 43(2)(a))

For the purposes of section 43(2)(a) of the Act the information contained in the *Settlement Agents Code of Conduct 2016* Schedule 1 Form 1 is prescribed.

Fish Resources Management Act 1994

Fish Resources Management Amendment Regulations (No. 4) 2016

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations are the Fish Resources Management Amendment Regulations (No. 4) 2016.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations on the day after that day.

3. Regulations amended

These regulations amend the Fish Resources Management Regulations 1995.

4. Regulation 38 amended

- (1) Delete regulation 38(2) and insert:
 - (2) A person must not use a rock lobster pot to fish for rock lobster unless the pot conforms to the specifications set out in Schedule 13.

Penalty for this subregulation: a fine of \$5 000.

Penalty for this subregulation: a fine of \$5 000.

Schedule 13 — Specifications for rock lobster pots

[r. 38(2)]

1. Construction and dimensions of pot

(1) A rock lobster pot must not have any form of chamber or partition in the pot which is capable of containing rock

lobster other than that formed by the external frame of the pot.

- (2) A rock lobster pot must be constructed of a rigid material that is not capable of snaring or entangling a rock lobster.
- (3) A rock lobster pot must not exceed
 - (a) 1 000 mm in diameter or width at its widest point;
 - (b) 500 mm in height.

2. Entrance or neck of pot

- (1) A rock lobster pot must have only one entrance or neck which
 - (a) must be positioned on the upper surface of the pot with the entrance or neck parallel to the base of the pot; and
 - (b) must be constructed wholly of a rigid material; and
 - (c) must be either
 - (i) circular with an opening throughout of not less than 160 mm in diameter; or
 - (ii) rectangular with an opening throughout of not less than 160 mm by 160 mm;

and

- (d) must not contain any device capable of restricting the egress of fish.
- (2) A rock lobster pot does not fail to conform to the specification set out in subclause (1) by reason only that it is constructed with, or has fitted to it, a sea lion exclusion device (as defined in regulation 38(3)).

3. Escape gaps

- (1) A rock lobster pot used in waters east of 115° 08.091′ east longitude must have inserted in it a device or devices to create at least one escape gap.
- (2) A rock lobster pot used in waters south of 21° 47.12′ south latitude and west of 115° 08.091′ east longitude must have inserted in it a device or devices to create at least 3 escape gaps.
- (3) A rock lobster pot referred to in subclause (1) or (2) must not have any obstruction positioned so as to restrict the movement of rock lobsters through an escape gap or to reduce the internal measurements of an escape gap.
- (4) Each escape gap required under this clause must be constructed of a rigid material that when affixed to the pot is not vertically flexible or capable of reducing the internal measurements of the escape gap.
- (5) Each escape gap required under this clause must
 - (a) be as nearly as practicable rectangular in shape; and

- (b) when measured internally, measure not less than 305 mm in length and not less than 54 mm in height.
- (6) Each escape gap required under this clause must be positioned
 - (a) on a side of the pot, other than the upper surface or base of the pot; and
 - (b) so that the longer sides of the escape gap are generally parallel to the base of the pot and the lower internal edge of the escape gap is no more than 110 mm from the base of the pot; and
 - (c) if the pot has less than 4 escape gaps, in accordance with subclause (7).
- (7) For subclause (6)(c)
 - (a) one escape gap must be positioned opposite the hauling rope attachment point or points; and
 - (b) any other escape gap must be positioned as far away as is practicable from the hauling rope attachment point or points.

Fishing Industry Promotion Training and Management Levy Regulations 2016

Workers' Compensation and Injury Management Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2016

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Workers' Compensation and Injury Management Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2016.*

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations on 17 October 2016.

3. Regulations amended

These regulations amend the Workers' Compensation and Injury Management Regulations 1982.

4. Regulation 10 replaced

Delete regulation 10 and insert:

10. Worker not residing in State

- (1) For the purposes of section 69, a worker must send to the employer or the employer's insurer a declaration by the worker and a medical practitioner in the form of Appendix I Form 6
 - (a) within 3 months after the date on which the worker is no longer residing in the State; and
 - (b) for each subsequent period during which the worker continues to receive weekly payments while not residing in the State, within 3 months after the date of the previous declaration by the worker and a medical practitioner.

- (2) A declaration under subregulation (1) is taken to have been sent to an employer or an employer's insurer at the time it was
 - (a) delivered personally to the last known business address of the employer or the employer's insurer; or
 - (b) posted to the last known business address of the employer or the employer's insurer; or
 - (c) sent by electronic means to the last known email address or fax number of the employer or the employer's insurer.
- (3) An employer or an employer's insurer who disputes the identity or entitlement, or both, of a worker may apply
 - (a) under section 182E of the Act for resolution of the dispute by conciliation; and
 - (b) under section 182ZT of the Act for determination of the dispute by arbitration, if the dispute is not resolved by conciliation.


1. Citation

POISONS (AUTHORISED POSSESSION OF SUBSTANCES) ORDER (No. 6) 2016

Made by the Governor in Executive Council under section 41 of the Poisons Act 1964.

1. Citation

This order may be cited as the Poisons (Authorised Possession of Substances) Order (No. 6) 2016.

2. Commencement

This order comes into operation on the day on which it is published in the *Gazette*.

3. Interpretation

In this order—

CEO means the Chief Executive Officer of the Department of Health;

specified place means the University of Western Australia Biomedical Research Facility, Shenton Park Campus, Underwood Avenue, Shenton Park.

4. Possession of substances authorised

(1) The persons listed in the Schedule are authorised to access, possess and use at the specified place for research purposes the following substances included in Schedule 9 to the *Poisons Act 1964*—

 - (b) the substances specified in clause 4(1), when not required for the purpose referred to in clause 4(1), are stored at the specified place in a secure manner as directed by the CEO;
 - (c) written records relating to the substances specified in clause 4(1) are maintained by Professor Mathew Martin-Iverson as directed by the CEO; and
 - (d) if requested by the CEO, any oral information or written report relating to the substances specified in clause 4(1) is given to the CEO by Professor Mathew Martin-Iverson.

5. Revocation

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

ANNUAL FIRE HAZARD REDUCTION NOTICE

As a measure for preventing the outbreak of a bush fire, or for preventing the spread or extension of a bush fire which may occur, all owners and occupiers of land within the City's district are required to comply with the requirements of this notice.

LAND ZONED 'RURAL' OR 'SPECIAL RURAL'

On or before the 1st day in November in each year, all owners or occupiers of land zoned 'Rural' or 'Special Rural' under the City of Canning Town Planning Scheme No.40 (Scheme) are required to—

- (a) Clear the land free of all flammable matter, except for living trees, shrubs, plants and lawns under cultivation, to a height no greater than 10cm; or
- (b) Clear a bare earth three (3) metre wide firebreak around all buildings, immediately inside all external boundaries of each lot on the land and within 20 metres of all stockpiled flammable matter by removing all flammable matter and all vegetation within the three (3) metre wide firebreak between the ground and four (4) metres above the ground so that the firebreak provides unrestricted vehicular access. The firebreaks must be continuous with no dead ends.

The firebreaks and measures set out above must be maintained up to and including the 30th day of April in the following year.

ALL OTHER LAND, THAT IS LAND WHICH IS NOT ZONED 'RURAL' OR 'SPECIAL RURAL'

At all times throughout the year, all owners or occupiers of land zoned other than 'Rural' or 'Special Rural' under the Scheme are required to clear and maintain the land free of all flammable matter, except for living trees, shrubs, plants and lawns under cultivation, to a height no greater than 10cm.

FLAMMABLE MATTER

Flammable matter includes, but is not limited to, vegetation (except for living trees, shrubs, plants and lawns under cultivation), prunings, cardboard, wood, paper, general rubbish and any other combustible material.

PERMISSION NEEDED TO VARY REQUIREMENTS

If it is impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to take measures in accordance with this notice, you may apply in writing to the City for permission to provide firebreaks on the land in alternative locations or take alternative measures.

Unless and until permission in writing is granted by the City, you must comply with the requirements of this notice.

PENALTY FOR NON-COMPLIANCE

A person who fails to comply with the requisitions in this notice is guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty of \$5,000. In addition, where the owner or occupier of the land fails to comply with a notice given pursuant to section 33(1) of the *Bush Fires Act 1954*, the City may enter upon the land and carry out the requisitions of the notice which have not been complied with and the City may recover the amount of any costs and expenses incurred in carrying out those requisitions as a debt due to the City from the owner or occupier of the land.
