HEALTH MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS (CITY OF COCKBURN SEWERAGE SCHEME CONSTRUCTION) ORDER 2018

Made under the *Health (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1911* section 60 by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

This order is the *Health Miscellaneous Provisions (City of Cockburn Sewerage Scheme Construction) Order 2018*.

3. City of Cockburn Sewerage Scheme

(2) The Bibra Lake Sewer Stage 1 sewerage works will be constructed in the Bibra Lake southern industrial area from the Newton Street Wastewater Pumping Station, Spearwood to the City of Cockburn Operations Centre, 52-54 Wellard Street, Bibra Lake to service the 29 lots listed in Table 1 in accordance with Plan 1.

- (1) Delete regulation 35(2)(b) and (c) and insert:

- (b) a Schedule 8 poison or a Schedule 9 poison as those terms are defined in the *Medicines and Poisons Act 2014* section 3; or

AGRICULTURE AND RELATED RESOURCES PROTECTION (EUROPEAN HOUSE BORER) REGULATIONS 2006

ASHENDON, BRETON BAY, CENTRAL CHITTERING, DARLING SCARP, FLINT, GNANGARA, GOSNELLS, JARRAHDAL, KARRAGULLEN/LESLEY, LENNARD BROOK, LOCKRIDGE, LOWER CHITTERING, MANDOGALUP, NEERABUP, NEERGABBY, SOUTH BULLSBROOK AND WOODRIDGE RESTRICTED MOVEMENT ZONES

Sites where pinewood is infested with European House Borer (EHB) have been found in the suburbs of Ashendon, Bassendean, Breton Bay, Bullsbrook, Chittering, Eden Hill, Flint, Gosnells, Jarrahdale, Karragullen, Kiara, Lennard Brook, Lesley, Lower Chittering, Mandogalup, Martin, Neerabup, Neergabby, Wandi and Woodridge. As a result, the areas identified below are determined to be the Ashendon, Breton Bay, Central Chittering, Flint, Gosnells, Jarrahdale, Karragullen/Lesley, Lennard Brook, Lockridge, Lower Chittering, Mandogalup, Neerabup, Neergabby, South Bullsbrook and Woodridge Restricted Movement Zones under regulation 18A of the *Agriculture and Related Resources Protection (European House Borer) Regulations 2006*.

A new find of EHB in the suburbs of Yanchep and Malmalling extends the Gngangara and Darling Scarp Restricted Movement Zone (RMZ) previously determined under regulation 18A of the *Agriculture and Related Resources Protection (European House Borer) Regulations 2006*. The Gngangara, and Darling Scarp RMZ identified below replaces the identification of the Gngangara and Darling Scarp RMZ published in the Gazette on 16 May 2017.

Because of proximity to infested pinewood, the movement of pinewood in these areas is restricted.

Details of the restrictions are as follows:

Bringing untreated pinewood into RMZ

Movement is not generally restricted. However, a person may be issued a written notice prohibiting pinewood movement into the RMZ if an authorised person believes that the presence of the pinewood in the RMZ will increase the risk of EHB spread.

Removing pinewood from RMZ

Untreated **seasoned pinewood** that has been in an RMZ for 72 hours or more must not be removed from that RMZ unless—

- The pinewood is pinewood pieces of less than 100 cm³; or
- The pinewood has been stored in a suitable building or enclosure or has been fully enclosed in plastic wrapping or other authorised material to prevent exposure to EHB; or
- The pinewood has been treated with a preservative in accordance with the relevant standards; or
- The pinewood has been chemically fumigated or heat treated in accordance with the regulations; or
- Written authorisation has been given by an authorised person.

Note: “seasoned pinewood” is pinewood that has a moisture content of 20 per cent or less when tested in accordance with the Australian Standard.

Unseasoned pinewood must not be removed from a RMZ during the EHB flight season control period (from 1 September until 30 April) unless the movement is authorised by an authorised person.

CURTIN UNIVERSITY ACT 1966**STATUTE NO. 10—STUDENT DISCIPLINE**

This Statute is made by the Council of the University under the powers conferred on it by section 34 of the *Curtin University Act 1966*.

1. Short title

This Statute is *Statute No. 10—Student Discipline*.

2. Commencement

This Statute takes effect from the date that it is published in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Purpose

The purpose of this Statute is to establish the framework for dealing with Student Misconduct.

4. Interpretation

(1) In this Statute, unless the contrary intention appears—

Academic Misconduct means conduct by a Student, other than conduct constituting Academic Record Fraud or General Misconduct, that is dishonest or unfair in connection with any academic work, such as—

- (a) during any exam, test or other supervised assessment activity;
- (b) in relation to the preparation or presentation of any assessed item of work; or
- (c) in relation to the conduct of research or any other similar academic activity;

Academic Record means any document or other record containing information relating to a person's academic results, awards or achievements.

Academic Record Fraud means conduct by a Student, other than conduct constituting Academic Misconduct or General Misconduct, that is dishonest in connection with an Academic Record, such as—

- (a) falsifying, or arranging the falsification of, an Academic Record;
- (b) giving false or misleading information in relation to an Academic Record; or
- (c) allowing a false or misleading Academic Record to be presented on behalf of the Student or another person;

Act means the *Curtin University Act 1966*;

General Misconduct means conduct by a Student, other than conduct constituting Academic Record Fraud or Academic Misconduct—

- (a) which contravenes any written law of the Commonwealth of Australia, a State or Territory of Australia or any other country, and where the written law relates to an activity associated with the Student being a Student of the University;
- (b) which contravenes the provisions of the Act or any Statute, rule or by-law, or a University, code of conduct, policy or procedure;
- (c) which contravenes any lawful direction by a member of the staff of the University;
- (d) which infringes the reasonable freedom of other persons to—
 - (i) pursue their study, research, duties or other lawful activities on premises owned or controlled by the University, or elsewhere while engaged in an activity under the auspices of the University; or
 - (ii) participate in the life of the University; or
- (e) which is otherwise detrimental to the proper conduct of the University or the University's reputation;

Previous Statute No. 10 means *Statute No. 10—Student Discipline*, published in the *Government Gazette* on 9 April 2010;

Student means a person who is or was—

- (a) an enrolled student as defined in section 4(1) of the Act;
- (b) admitted, or applying to be admitted, to a course or unit conducted by the University; or
- (c) engaged, or applying to be engaged, in a structured program of learning provided by or for the University; and

Student Misconduct means conduct by a Student that is—

- (a) Academic Record Fraud;
- (b) Academic Misconduct; or
- (c) General Misconduct.

(2) An instance of Student Misconduct is a **disciplinary offence** within the meaning of that term in section 34(1c) of the Act.

5. General principles

- (1) A Student must be given the opportunity to respond to any allegation of Student Misconduct before a decision is made whether Student Misconduct has occurred.
- (2) A Student must have a right of appeal against any finding that Student Misconduct has occurred and any penalty that is imposed.
- (3) An appeal must be determined by a person or persons not involved in the original decision.

6. Penalties for Student Misconduct

- (1) Penalties for Student Misconduct are to be as prescribed in rules made under this Statute.
- (2) In addition to any penalties imposed, a Student found guilty of Student Misconduct may be required to make restitution for any loss, damage or additional expenditure incurred by the University through his or her actions.

7. Application

This Statute applies—

- (a) to any instance of Student Misconduct which occurs on or after the commencement date of this Statute; or
- (b) to any instance of Student Misconduct under Previous Statute No. 10 which occurred prior to the commencement date of this Statute and in respect of which disciplinary action has not commenced under Previous Statute No. 10.

8. Rules

The Council may make rules, not inconsistent with the Act or any Statute—

- (a) to regulate, or provide for the regulation of, Student Misconduct; or
- (b) to carry out or give effect to this Statute.

9. Revocation

Previous Statute No. 10 is revoked.

1. Cancel *Notice No. 1 of 2017*, dated 23 February 2017;

2. Permit fishing for prawns or scallops in the waters described in Items 2 and 3 of Schedule 1 of the Plan during the period commencing at 0800 hours on 1 March 2018 and ending at 0800 hours 1 September 2018;
3. Prohibit fishing for prawns or scallops at any other time in all waters of the Fishery; and
4. Prohibit fishing for prawns or scallops at all times in the waters described in Schedule 1 of the *Houtman Abrolhos Reef Observation Areas Notice 1994*.

PROHIBITION ON FISHING (EIGHTY MILE BEACH MARINE PARK) ORDER 2018

Order No. 3 of 2018

FD 4180/17 [1275]

Made by the Minister under section 43.

1. Citation

This instrument is the *Prohibition on Fishing (Eighty Mile Beach Marine Park) Order 2018*.

2. Interpretation

In this order—

land hermit crab means fish of the species *Coenobita variabilis*;

marine aquarium fish has the same meaning as in the relevant management plan in force with respect to the Marine Aquarium Fish Managed Fishery;

Recreation Area means all the areas specified in Schedule 2;

Sanctuary Area means all the areas specified in Schedule 1;

Special Purpose Area means the areas specified in Schedule 3;

specimen shell has the same meaning as in the relevant management plan in force with respect to the Specimen Shell Managed Fishery.

3. Prohibition on fishing

(1) A person must not fish by any means in—

- (a) a Sanctuary Area; or
- (b) a Recreation Area.

(2) Subclause (1)(b) does not apply with respect to a person fishing for a recreational purpose in accordance with the Act.

(3) A person must not, in a Special Purpose Zone (mangrove protection)—

- (a) fish for a commercial purpose; or
- (b) fish from the shore; or
- (c) fish for specimen shell.

(4) A person must not, in a Special Purpose Zone (shore-based activities)—

- (a) fish for a commercial purpose, other than fishing from the shore for—
 - (i) land hermit crab;
 - (ii) marine aquarium fish; or
 - (iii) specimen shell; or
- (b) fish from a boat.

Schedule 2—Declaration specifications

1. A Schedule 1 vessel is only operating as an emergency vessel when it is being used in relation to sea search and rescue or other situations where serious injury and/or loss of life can either be reasonably expected or has been reported to the vessel master or crew ('identified emergency').
2. Before a Schedule 1 vessel is so used, or as soon as practicable if extraordinary circumstances inhibit compliance with paragraphs (a) to (c) below, the master of a Schedule 1 vessel, must—
 - (a) notify a Police officer, or a police marine communications officer, of the particulars of the identified emergency;
 - (b) notify that person which vessel it is they are master of; and
 - (c) have received police authorisation that is required in the circumstances.
3. Regulation 19A (speed limit in Swan and Canning Rivers) and regulation 48 (limitation of speed) of the Regulations do not apply to a Schedule 1 vessel when it is being used as an emergency vessel.
4. A lamp displaying intermittent blue flashes—
 - (a) may be used on a Schedule 1 vessel at any time it is—
 - i. operating as an emergency vessel; or
 - ii. supporting an aquatic event approved under regulation 51C of the Regulations, under the direction of a DoT Marine Inspector appointed pursuant to section 117 of the Act;
 - (b) must be used on a Schedule 1 vessel when it is operating as an emergency vessel and exceeding the speed limit, operating in closed waters, or both of those.
5. The operator of a Schedule 1 vessel when it is operating as an emergency vessel must hold, as a minimum, a Recreational Skippers Ticket.
6. The master of a Schedule 1 vessel when it is operating as an emergency vessel must—
 - (a) assess if it is appropriate to exceed the speed limit; and

(b) comply with the *Prevention of Collisions at Sea Regulations 1983* including—

- i. Rule 5 (Look-out);
- ii. Rule 6 (Safe Speed); and
- iii. Rule 7 (Risk of Collision).

7. The master and crew of a Schedule 1 vessel must comply with a direction issued by a Police officer or a DoT Marine Inspector (designated under section 117 of the Act), including a direction to provide a situation report in relation to the identified emergency.

Schedule 3—Exemption Conditions

1. The Schedule 1 vessel is being used in relation to an identified emergency.
2. A lamp displaying intermittent blue flashes is used on the Schedule 1 vessel when it is exceeding the speed limit, operating in closed waters, or both of those.
3. The operator of the Schedule 1 vessel holds, as a minimum, a Recreational Skippers Ticket.
4. Before the Schedule 1 vessel is used as an emergency vessel, or as soon as practicable if extraordinary circumstances inhibit compliance with paragraphs (a) to (c) below, the master—
 - (a) notifies a Police officer, or a police marine communications officer, of the particulars of the identified emergency;
 - (b) notifies that person which vessel it is they are master of; and
 - (c) receives from that person any authorisation that is required in the circumstances.
5. The master of a Schedule 1 vessel complies with the *Prevention of Collisions at Sea Regulations 1983* including—
 - (a) rule 5 (Look-out);
 - (b) rule 6 (Safe Speed);
 - (c) rule 7 (Risk of Collision).

6. At all times that the Schedule 1 vessel is exceeding any speed limit, the master is assessing the extent to which, if any, it is appropriate to do so.

7. At all times that the Schedule 1 vessel is operating in closed waters, the master is assessing whether it is appropriate to do so.

8. The master and crew of a Schedule 1 vessel complies with directions issued by Police officers and DoT Marine Inspectors (designated under section 117 of the Act), including directions to provide information and situation reports in relation to the identified emergency.

Note: A master of a Schedule 1 vessel when it is operating as an emergency vessel, is not required to hold a commercial Certificate of Competency under regulation 28 of the *W.A. Marine (Certificates of Competency and Safety Manning) Regulations 1983*. However the Department of Fire and Emergency Services may require the master to hold a minimum qualification higher than the Recreational Skippers Ticket required by this instrument.
