Road Traffic (Blood Sampling and Analysis) Amendment Regulations 2019

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Road Traffic (Blood Sampling and Analysis) Amendment Regulations 2019.*

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations on the day after that day.

3. Regulations amended

These regulations amend the *Road Traffic (Blood Sampling and Analysis) Regulations 1975*.

4. Regulation 4 amended

5. Sampling equipment

The sampling equipment must comprise all of the following —

(a) 2 screw top plastic storage containers;

- (b) 2 evacuated blood collection tubes with approximately 170 mg of sodium fluoride and 42.5 mg of potassium oxalate;
- (c) 1 or 2 disposable needles with needle holders;
- (d) 2 tamper proof outer plastic bags;
- (e) sterile disposable gloves;
- (f) a sterile dry swab;
- (g) a sterile, non-alcoholic antiseptic cleansing skin prep wipe;
- (h) a sticking plaster.

An applicant whose proposal is subject to this delegation may upon written request to the Strategic Planning Manager have the proposal referred to the Heritage Council.

As provided by s. 59(1)(a) of the *Interpretation Act 1984*, the Heritage Council may call in any proposal that is subject to this delegation and exercise any of the delegated powers, functions or duties in respect of that proposal.

When carrying out any power, function or duty under this delegation, the Strategic Planning Manager is to comply with the 'Delegation Framework' published on the State Heritage website, stateheritage.wa.gov.au.

The Strategic Planning Manager is to maintain records of proposals handled under this delegation and make those records available for inspection by the Heritage Council or its nominee.
