This declaration is the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management (Prohibited Organisms) Declaration (No. 2) 2019*.

**2. Prohibited Organisms**

- (1) The organism listed below is declared under section 12(1) of the Act to be a prohibited organism for the whole of the State.
- (2) Under section 22(1) of the Act a prohibited organism is a declared pest for the whole of the state.
- (3) The organism listed below is assigned to the control Category 1 (C1)—Exclusion under regulation 8 of the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Regulations 2013*.
- (4) The organism listed below is assigned to a keeping category under regulation 8 of the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Regulations 2013* specified in column 2.
- (5) All previous declarations under the Act relating to the organism specified below are revoked.

I, Rick Fletcher, Executive Director Fisheries and Agriculture Resource Management of the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development, Western Australia, in accordance with clause 12 of the *Abrolhos Islands and Mid West Trawl Managed Fishery Management Plan 1993* (the Plan) consider it in the better interest of the fishery to hereby—

1. Cancel *Notice No. 1 of 2018*, dated 12 February 2018;
2. Permit fishing for scallops in the waters described in Item 2 of Schedule 1 of the Plan during the period commencing at 0800 hours on 1 March 2019 and ending at 0800 hours 31 August 2019;
3. Permit fishing for scallops and prawns in the waters described in Item 3 of Schedule 1 of the Plan during the period commencing at 0800 hours on 1 March 2019 and ending at 0800 hours on 15 November 2019;

4. Prohibit fishing for scallops or prawns at any other time in all waters of the Fishery; and
5. Prohibit fishing for scallops or prawns at all times in the waters described in Schedule 1 of the *Houtman Abrolhos Reef Observation Areas Notice 1994*.
