Part 1 — Preliminary

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Commerce Regulations Amendment* (*Infringement Notices*) *Regulations 2019*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations on the day after that day.

- (2) The Building Commissioner must issue to each authorised officer a certificate, badge or identity card identifying the officer as a person authorised to issue infringement notices.
