The Electoral Distribution Commissioners have proposed significant changes to Western Australia's State electoral boundaries.

Although no change is proposed to the current balance between metropolitan and country districts, 49 of the State's 59 districts will have their boundaries altered to some degree under the proposed changes, largely as the flow on effect of significant population growth in particular areas.

The Commissioners also propose name changes for some districts, mainly in instances where localities that previously lent their name to a particular district no longer belong to that district.

Maps and descriptions of the proposed changes and an explanation of the Commissioners' reasoning can be found on the Electoral Boundaries WA website www.boundaries.wa.gov.au and are also available for inspection at the Western Australian Electoral Commission, Level 2, 111 St George's Terrace, Perth.

The website also contains advice on how to lodge written objections to the proposals (including comments or suggestions for the names of districts), which must be lodged no later than 5.00pm Monday 26 August.
