Shire of Coolgardie

MEETING PROCEDURES AMENDMENT LOCAL LAW 2020

Under the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1995*, and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Coolgardie resolved on 27 October 2020 to make the following local law—

1. Citation

This local law is cited as the *Shire of Coolgardie Meeting Procedures Amendment Local Law 2020*.

2. Commencement

This local law comes into operation 14 days after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Principal Local Law

This local law amends the *Shire of Coolgardie Meeting Procedures Local Law 2019* published in the *Government Gazette* on 12 March 2020.

4. Clause 5.3(4)(a) amended

In clause 5.3(4)(a), the word ‘may,’ is deleted where it first occurs.

PARKING AMENDMENT LOCAL LAW 2020

Under the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1995*, and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Coolgardie resolved on 27 October 2020 to make the following local law—

1. Citation

This local law is cited as the *Shire of Coolgardie Parking Amendment Local Law 2020*.

2. Commencement

This local law comes into operation 14 days after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Principal Local Law

This local law amends the *Shire of Coolgardie Parking Local Law 2019* published in the *Government Gazette* on 12 March 2020.

4. Clause 1.10 replaced

Clause 1.10 is deleted and replaced with—

1.10 Powers of the local government

The local government may, by resolution, prohibit or regulate by signs or otherwise, the stopping or parking of any vehicle or any class of vehicles in any part of the parking region but must do so consistently with the provisions of this local law.

5. Clause 2.1 replaced

Clause 2.1 is deleted and replaced with—

2.1 Determination of metered zones

(1) The local government may, by resolution, constitute, determine and vary, metered spaces and metered zones.

(2) In respect of metered spaces and metered zones the local government may, by resolution, determine—

- (a) permitted times and conditions of parking depending on and varying with the locality;
- (b) classes of vehicles which are permitted to park;
- (c) the amount payable for parking; and
- (d) the manner of parking.

(3) Where the local government makes a determination under subclauses (1) or (2) it shall erect signs to give effect to the determination.

6. Clause 2.5 replaced

Clause 2.5 is deleted and replaced with—

2.5 Suspension of requirement to pay fee

(1) The local government may, by resolution, declare that the provisions of clauses 2.2 and 2.4 shall not apply during the periods and days specified.

(2) Where the local government makes a determination under subclause (1) it shall erect signs to give effect to the determination.

7. Clause 3.1 replaced

Clause 3.1 is deleted and replaced with—

3.1 Determination of parking stalls and parking stations

(1) The local government may, by resolution, constitute, determine and vary and also indicate by signs—

- (a) parking stalls;
- (b) parking stations;
- (c) permitted time and conditions of parking in parking stalls and parking stations which may vary with the locality;
- (d) permitted classes of vehicles which may park in parking stalls and parking stations;
- (e) permitted classes of persons who may park in specified parking stalls or parking stations; and
- (f) the manner of parking in parking stalls and parking stations.

(2) Where the local government makes a determination under subclause (1) it shall erect signs to give effect to the determination.

8. Clause 3.4 replaced

Clause 3.4 is deleted and replaced with—

3.4 Suspension of parking station restrictions

(1) The local government may, by resolution, declare that the provisions of clause 3.3 do not apply during periods on particular days in relation to particular parking stations as specified.

(2) Where the local government makes a determination under subclause (1) it shall erect signs to give effect to the determination.

RACING AND WAGERING WESTERN AUSTRALIA ACT 2003**RACING AND WAGERING WESTERN AUSTRALIA (FOB RULES)
NOTICE (NO. 3) 2020**

Made by Racing and Wagering Western Australia under section 61 of the Act.

1. Citation

This notice is the *Racing and Wagering Western Australia (FOB Rules) Notice (No. 3) 2020*.

2. Commencement

These rules came into operation on 1 April 2020.

3. Interpretation

In this notice:

“the Act” means the *Racing and Wagering Western Australia Act 2003*;

“the Rules” means the rules described in clause 4, adopted by Racing and Wagering Western Australia.

4. Rules adopted under section 61 of the Act

(1) Following the novation of the FOB MSA to BetEasy effective 1 April 2020 RWWA is now operating under the BetEasy Fixed Odds Rules.

(2) A copy of the rules adopted was published for public information in the *Special Gazette* of 24 January 2020 at pp. 169-215.

(3) Further amendments to the Rules were adopted by resolution of the Board dated 14 April 2020 and 26 October 2020, and published for public information in the *Gazette* of 17 April 2020 at pp. 958-961 and 30 October at pp. 4043-4045.

5. Changes to Rules published for public information section 61(6)(c) of the Act

(1) Further amendments to the Rules were also adopted by resolution of the Board at the same meeting referred to earlier dated 26 October 2020.

(2) Those further amendments to the Rules are published in the Schedule to this notice for public information, as required by section 61(6)(c) of the Act

Schedule 1—Amendments to Adopted Rules

187.	<p>AMERICAN FOOTBALL Acceptance of Bets and Settlement All bets on NFL/American Football matches will be settled on the Official Result, including overtime, as declared by the National Football League or NCAA or CFL governing body. NFL proposition bets will be settled using the results listed at www.NFL.com or such other site as the NFL should deem to be official. <u>Matches are official after 55 minutes of play.</u></p>
232.	<p>BADMINTON Outright Betting is offered as All In, Quote Others. Refunds shall not apply should competitors withdraw from any event. For betting purposes, markets are settled upon podium presentations; overturned decisions will not be recognized.</p>
233.	<p>Should any match be postponed to another day, all bets are void. <u>If a match is delayed it must be played within 24 hours of the event start time for bets to stand.</u></p>
300.	<p>CRICKET General Rule All cricket tournament and match markets will be settled on the official tournament results/match scorecards as provided by the ICC or other applicable officiating body. If no results are available, then the website http://www.cricinfo.com will be used for settlement purposes. <u>If a match or innings is curtailed through external factors and there is no further play, any bets placed on any in-play market once play has been curtailed will be void [except bets placed on match betting]. Any pre-match bets placed will be settled in accordance with relevant rules for the respective market. If a match venue is changed then bets will stand provided the home team is still designated as such. If the home and away team for a match are reversed then bets placed on the original listing will be void.</u></p>
301.	<p>External factors which result in no further play will be deemed a no result and all wagers voided except those which had been concluded/decided to that point of the match. General Settlement <u>All tournament and match markets will be settled on the official tournament results/match scorecards listed on ICC website. If there is no result available, then the website www.cricinfo.com will be used for settlement purposes.</u> <u>A batsman that retires from an innings will not be considered as a wicket for settlement purposes.</u> <u>If the concussion rule is activated in a Cricket Australia sanctioned match while a player is batting, all markets relating to that player will be settled based on that player being 'retired hurt'. If the concussion rule is activated prior to that player batting or bowling, they will be void from relevant markets.</u> <u>The term "innings reaching it's natural conclusion" refers to an innings which has not been closed by external factors such as rain or bad light. A team being bowled out or declaring is considered to be reaching it's natural conclusion.</u> <u>If a match is cancelled before any play has taken place, then all bets will be void, unless the match is replayed within 48 hours of its advertised start time, in this case the bets will stand.</u></p>
302.	<p>Test/First class Limited Overs Matches If for any reason a match is abandoned (including weather) and before a ball has been bowled, then all bets will be void. If a match ends in a tie, the draw would be deemed a loser and dead heat rules will apply to the other selections for the outright result. If no price is offered for a draw and the match ends in a draw, all wagers will be refunded. <u>Match bets will be settled according to the winner determined by official competition rules (including the case where matches are shortened due to adverse weather conditions or decided a bowl off), unless the winner is determined by the toss of a coin or the drawing of lots, in which case all match bets will be void.</u> <u>If the match is tied and the official competition rules do not determine a winner, dead heat rules will apply to bets on the outright result unless</u></p>

	<p><u>the outcome is settled by a bowl off or super over, in which case the result of the bowl off or super over will stand for match betting. If the competition rules determine the winner by a toss of a coin or drawing of lots or higher seeding resulting from a previous round then bets will be void.</u></p>
303.	<p>If a team forfeits in its first innings then all wagers on that match are voided.</p> <p><u>Test Matches and County Championship Matches</u></p> <p><u>If a match is abandoned due to weather before a ball has been bowled then all bets will be void.</u></p> <p><u>If a match is abandoned for any reason other than weather then bets on the outright result will be void.</u></p> <p><u>If a match where RWWA didn't offer a price for the draw ends in a draw then bets on the match result will be void.</u></p> <p><u>If a match ends in a tie, the draw would be deemed a loser and dead heat rules will apply to bets on the other selections for the outright result.</u></p> <p><u>If either side forfeits their first innings then all bets specifically relating to the first innings will be void.</u></p>
304.	<p><u>Sheffield Shield Matches</u></p> <p>In Shield matches where no draw price is offered, wagers will be settled on the team that earns the most points. If teams are equal on points the Dead Heat Rules applies.</p> <p><u>If a match where RWWA did not offer a price for the draw ends in a draw then bets will be settled on the team that has the most points awarded to them in the match. Should the number of points awarded to each team be equal, bets will be void.</u></p>
305.	<p><u>Series Betting</u></p> <p>Match bets will be settled according to the winner determined by official competition rules, including cases where matches are shortened due to adverse weather conditions or decided by a bowl off. Any match determined by the toss of a coin will be ignored and wagers will be voided.</p> <p><u>When the full number of scheduled matches is not played then RWWA reserve the right to void any speciality markets relating to the series as a whole.</u></p> <p><u>If a series where RWWA didn't offer a price for the draw ends in a draw then bets on the series result will be void.</u></p>
306.	<p>If the match is tied and the official competition rules do not determine a winner, the Dead Heat Rules will apply to match bets unless the winner is determined by a bowl off or super over.</p> <p><u>Team Total Runs</u></p> <p><u>In matches where RWWA offer betting on the Team Total Runs for both teams then all bets placed on the second innings runs will stand regardless of the score achieved by the side batting first, provided neither teams innings is reduced by more than 20% of the entire innings allocation, including any overs already bowled, when the bet was struck.</u></p> <p><u>If a team's innings in a test match or county championship match lasts less than sixty overs due to external factors then bets on this market will be void. This does not apply if the innings has reached its natural conclusion (e.g. due to a bowl out or declaration.)</u></p> <p><u>For limited overs matches, this market will be settled on the final score achieved by the batting side including any extras or penalty runs awarded during the innings. Should there be a reduction in the scheduled overs then settlement will still apply provided the reduction is no more than 20% of the entire innings allocation at the time the bet was struck, including any overs the team has already faced. Should the reduction be greater than 20% then all bets shall be void regardless of the final total made by the team. If a team is due to face less than 10 overs, then all bets will be void should there be any reduction in overs whatsoever.</u></p>
307.	<p>If a match is cancelled before play commences and not re-scheduled within 24 hours, all bets are voided.</p> <p><u>Top Team Batsman / Runscorer (Series)</u></p> <p><u>All in play or not. (i.e. if a player does not take part in the series, bets placed on that player will stand). If players score the same number of runs then dead heat rules will apply.</u></p>
308.	<p><u>Series Betting</u></p> <p>In series betting all scheduled matches must be official games regardless of a ball being bowled. If a series ends in a draw and no price was offered for a draw option or if the scheduled number of matches is changed all series betting is voided.</p>

	<p><u>Top Team batsman / Runscorer (Match)</u> <u>In a 2-innings match (test match or county championship), this market applies to the first innings only, unless otherwise stated.</u> <u>Depending on the type of match the following minimum overs must be bowled in that teams innings for bets to stand:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. <u>Test Matches - 50 overs</u> 2. <u>County Championship - 50 overs</u> 3. <u>50 over match - 25 overs</u> 4. <u>40 over match - 20 overs</u> 5. <u>20 over match - 10 overs</u> <p><u>In all cases bets will stand if the innings reaches its natural conclusion in less than the above requirement. Bets placed on any player not named in the starting eleven are void.</u> <u>Players named in the starting eleven that do not bat are deemed to have taken part and bets on any such players are losers.</u> <u>If players score the same number of runs then dead heat rules will apply.</u> <u>For Limited overs matches – Should the winner already be unequivocally decided even if the innings were to be played out to its natural conclusion, the market will be settled as normal despite any reduction.</u></p>
309.	<p><u>Batsman Match Bets / Trios / Threesomes</u> <u>In matches where we offer Team Total Runs for both teams, all bets placed on Second Innings runs will stand regardless of the score made by the team batting first. In second innings totals if the team batting second does not face a ball all wagers on their second innings total will be voided.</u> <u>If any of the players named in the market are not named in the starting XI then the market will be void. Bets stand even if a batsman does not reach the crease but is named in the starting XI. Dead heat rules will apply if two or more of the named batsmen score the same number of runs (such number of runs being higher than the number of runs scored by each other batsman named in the market).</u></p>
310.	<p><u>Top Team Bowler / Wicket Taker (Series)</u> <u>In the event of a reduction in overs, a new set of totals will be offered. If there is a further loss in overs these totals will be void.</u> <u>All in play or not (i.e. if a player does not take part in the series, bets placed on that player will stand). In the event of players taking the same number of wickets, dead heat rules will apply.</u></p>
311.	<p><u>Top Team Bowler / Wicket Taker (Match)</u> <u>In limited overs matches, wagers placed on team total runs stand once the match is official and no more than 10% of the scheduled number of overs is lost. Super Overs do not count for team run totals.</u> <u>In a 2-innings match (test match or county championship), this market applies to the first innings only, unless otherwise stated.</u> <u>Depending on the type of match the following minimum overs must be bowled in that teams innings for bets to stand:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. <u>Test Matches – 50 overs</u> 2. <u>County Championship – 50 overs</u> 3. <u>50 over match – 25 overs</u> 4. <u>40 over match – 20 overs</u> 5. <u>20 over match – 15 overs</u> <p><u>In all cases bets will stand if the innings reaches its natural conclusion in less than the above requirement. Bets placed on any player not named in the starting eleven are void.</u> <u>Players named in the starting eleven that do not bowl are deemed to have taken part and bets on any such players are losers.</u> <u>In the event of players taking the same number of wickets, Dead Heat rules will apply. In the case no wickets are taken the market will be voided.</u></p>
312.	<p><u>Bowler Match Bets / Trios / Threesomes</u> <u>All Top Run Scorer bets will be for the 1st Innings (being the 1st innings of each team, regardless of which team bats first), unless otherwise stated.</u> <u>Unless otherwise stated these markets will be settled on the number of wickets taken in the first innings of a match only. All participants in the match bet must bowl at least one ball for bets to stand. In the event of players taking the same number of wickets where there was no draw price offered, dead heat rules will apply (such number of wickets being higher than the number of wickets taken by each other bowler named in the market).</u></p>

313.	<p><u>Player Runs / Player Alternate Runs / Player Fours (Over/Under) / Player Sixes (Over/Under)</u></p> <p><u>Individual match wagers on players not in the starting 11 will be refunded, however series betting is 'all in' regardless of the number of matches played by a competitor. If equal on runs the Dead Heat Rules apply.</u></p> <p><u>Market to be settled on the players final score, regardless of any reduction in overs.</u></p> <p><u>At least one ball must be bowled while a batsman is at the crease (facing or not) for bets to stand.</u></p> <p><u>If the batsman finishes the innings not out as a result of a declaration, the team reaching the end of its allotted overs or the team reaching its target, the player's "not out" score will count for settlement purposes.</u></p> <p><u>If a batsman does not bat, bets on that batsman will be void.</u></p> <p><u>If a batsman is not in the starting 11, bets on that batsman will be void.</u></p> <p><u>If a batsman retires hurt but returns later, the total runs scored by that batsman in the innings will count for settlement purposes. If the batsman does not return later, the final result, for settlement purposes, will be as it stood when the batsman retired.</u></p>
314.	<p><u>Player To Hit A Six</u></p> <p><u>All bets refunded if player not in starting 11 however all bets shall stand provided the amount of overs needed has been reached regardless whether your player bats or not.</u></p> <p><u>Bets on this market will stand if the player is included in the starting eleven, regardless if the player reaches the crease.</u></p> <p><u>Bets placed on any player not named in the starting eleven are void.</u></p> <p><u>For the avoidance of doubt players running six do not count for this market.</u></p> <p><u>Please note this is separate to player Over/Under Sixes markets.</u></p>
315.	<p><u>To Score A Fifty</u></p> <p><u>The following minimum number of overs must be bowled in the relevant innings or the innings completed (concluded) for bets to stand:</u></p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><u>Test Matches/Sheffield Shield/County — 50 overs</u></p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><u>50 over match — 25 overs</u></p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><u>40 over match — 20 overs</u></p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><u>20 over match — 12 overs</u></p> <p><u>This refers to individual players to score a Fifty.</u></p> <p><u>Bets on this market will stand if the player is in the starting eleven, regardless if the player reaches the crease.</u></p> <p><u>Any players not listed in the starting eleven will have all bets on them void.</u></p>
316.	<p><u>Number Of Runs Per Session</u></p> <p><u>H2H or group betting markets will be settled on the number of runs scored in the first innings of a match only unless otherwise stated. All Players run Head to Heads / Trios in Test Cricket / First Class Cricket will stand providing all players are in the final 11 regardless of if they bat or not. 50 Over Cricket and 20/20 Cricket, all player run Head to Heads / Trios need all listed players to reach the crease for bets to stand.</u></p> <p><u>The result of this market is determined by the total number of runs scored in the course of the session regardless of which team(s) has scored the runs.</u></p> <p><u>For example if there is a change of innings during the session then it is the combined number of runs scored during the session that is the result.</u></p> <p><u>There are three sessions per day in Test Cricket. The first session is from the start of play in the morning until lunch is called. The second session is from lunch until tea is called. The third session is from tea until the close of play. If less than 20 overs are bowled in any particular session then bets on number of runs scored in that session will be void.</u></p> <p><u>Extras (wides, no-balls, byes and leg byes) do count towards the number of runs scored.</u></p> <p><u>In Day Test matches, the first session is from the start of play in the morning until lunch is called. If less than 20 overs are bowled in any particular session then bets on number of runs scored in that session will be void.</u></p> <p><u>In Day/Night Test matches, the first session is from the start of play until tea is called. The second session is from tea until dinner is called. The third session is from dinner until the close of play. If less than 20 overs</u></p>

	<p><u>are bowled in any particular session then bets on number of runs scored in that session will be void.</u></p>
317.	<p><u>Number Of Wickets Per Session</u> Individual match wagers on players not in the starting 11 will be refunded, however series betting is 'all in' regardless of the number of matches played by a competitor. If equal on wickets, the Dead Heat Rules apply. <u>Settled on the total number of wickets lost in the session regardless of which team loses them. If less than 20 overs are bowled in the session then all bets on the market shall be void. Players retiring out/hurt do not count as wickets.</u></p>

You must prepare your property for the fire season by installing and maintaining firebreaks and reducing fuel loads on your property to the standards specified in this Notice (issued under section 33 of the *Bush Fires Act 1954* (the Act)).

The fire mitigation measures listed in the Notice must be in place by 1 November 2020 and be maintained up to 30 April 2021 (inclusive).

Pursuant to s.33 of the Act, you are hereby required to take the following fire mitigation measures on your land, which are to be in place by 1 November 2020 and be maintained until 30 April 2021 (inclusive).

1. RURAL LAND

- (a) Create a firebreak 3m wide with 4m vertical clearance situated immediately (or as close as practicable) inside all external boundaries of the property;
- (b) Where buildings, haystacks, fuel ramps, fuel tanks and stored fuel drums are situated on land, firebreaks at least 3m wide, completely encircling these items, and situated within 30m of the items must be installed;

- (g) An operational mobile firefighting unit, containing a minimum of 600 litres of water, is to be on standby and available for inspection.

2. WITHIN A TOWN SITE

- (a) Land up to and including 2,000m²—maintain the whole of the property in a low fuel state. Clear and maintain the land free of all inflammable matter including piles of branches, cuttings and other dried vegetation.
- (b) Land over 2000m²—a fire break at least 2 metres wide is to be constructed inside all external boundaries (and located as close as practicable to the boundaries).

3. ASSET PROTECTION ZONE FOR BUILDINGS

An Asset Protection Zone (APZ) is an area directly surrounding a building that is managed to reduce the bushfire hazard to an acceptable level.

- (a) APZs consist of managed vegetation, reticulated lawns and gardens and other non-flammable features.
- (b) APZs are required for all habitable buildings, whether located on rural properties or within a town site.
- (c) Habitable buildings should be surrounded by an APZ of 20m measured from the outside of the building (or to the boundary of the property where 20 metres can not be achieved).

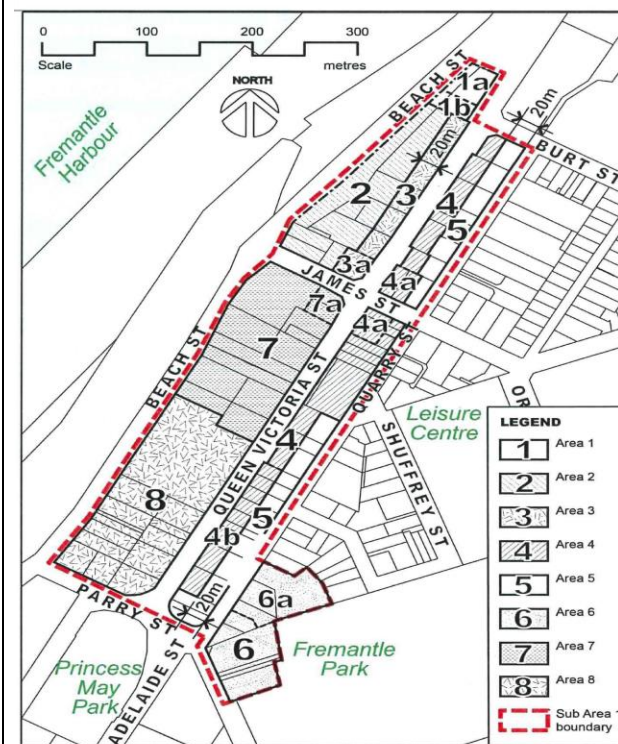
