#### Claims:—

1. A punkah hinged and swinging in a frame which may be fixed to a chair or to the floor by means of screw-bolts or may be weighted with a heavy base so as to stand without such fastenings and automatically operated by rocking the chair in the manner hereinbefore described.
2. A punkah operated as before described by means of a pulley affixed to a rocking or other chair or cot by means of eye-screws the pulley cord being furnished with a long spiral spring as a counter resistant to the pulley cord substantially as and for the purpose described.
3. The combination arrangement of the punkah working in a movable

frame by means of automatic or hand pulley with counter resistant spiral spring fixed to the chair or cot by eye-screws or any simple means substantially as and for the purpose hereinbefore described.
