Application No. 4036.—HENRY UPTON ALCOCK, of 208 to 212 Russell Street, Melbourne, Victoria, Billiard Table Manufacturer, "*Improved convertible settee and billiard table.*"—Dated 9th September, 1902.

Claims :

1. In a convertible settee and billiard table the combination of the radius rods, guides and brackets marked B to B' with the frame of settee and the table A substantially as described and shown.
2. In a convertible settee and billiard table the combination of the table A, the radius rods, guides and brackets marked B to B' and the settee frame the posts C' of which have screwed heads C², substantially as described and shown.
3. In a convertible settee and billiard table the combination of the table A, the radius rods, guides and brackets marked B to B' the settee frame provided with adjustable post heads C² and the movable adjustable posts D to D² substantially as described and shown.

Application No. 4161.—EDWARD HASSELBACH, of Wandsworth Road, Surrey Hills, Victoria, Electrical Engineer, "*An improved game called roulette billiards and appliances for same.*"—Dated 3rd December, 1902.

Claims :—

1. As an appliance for the herein described game a winning turnstile or roulette consisting of a lower circular piece or disc having eight numbered cups in its surface and a vertical pivot pin at its centre, combined with and supporting a loose boss piece carrying eight radial spokes furnished with end rubber buffers and with the surface between the spokes of different colours and numbered to correspond with said cups substantially as described and illustrated.
2. As an appliance for the herein described game a half-way turnstile consisting of a lower circular piece or disc having an annular recess formed in its surface and a vertical pivot pin at its centre combined with and supporting a loose boss piece having eight radial spokes furnished with end rubber buffers and with the surface between the spokes of different colours or similar to that of the roulette substantially as described and illustrated.
3. As an appliance for the herein described game, an arch consisting of two flanged posts connected together loosely by an arched or curved wire substantially as described and illustrated.
4. As an appliance for the herein described game, an arch formed of two posts and an overhead connecting wire combined with a movable post which is arranged to stand at one side of said arch substantially as described and illustrated.

5. As an appliance for the herein described game, a bridge consisting of two side cheeks or plates inclined both ways, connected together by cross bars, substantially as described and illustrated.

6. As an appliance for the herein described game, a bridge piece inclined both ways to form two rails combined with two movable posts which are arranged to lie one at each side of bridge, substantially as described and illustrated.

7. As appliances for the herein described game, the combination of the winning roulette A, half-way turnstile C, arches D, bridges F, pillars E, and with the series of coloured balls and a cue or cues substantially as described and illustrated.

8. The herein described game played on a billiard or other table, having a marginal frame and the lines H, H' and H² thereon and with a winning and a half-way turnstile, eight arches, two bridges, and six pillars assembled on surface of table with the coloured balls and the cues substantially as described and illustrated.
